Parish News & Notes

From Fr. Frank

As Americans we believe that we should get what we deserve – what we have worked for and earned. We believe in fair play.

We believe that we should get what we deserve. If that does not happen we get angry, upset, and complain that life is not fair.

In this Sunday's Gospel (Luke 15:1-3, 11-32), we hear about a person getting something absolutely undeserved.

Jesus tells a parable about a man with two sons. The younger son, tired of work and anxious for the good life, demands his share of the inheritance that would come to him when his father died. The father strangely agrees and that son goes off and wastes his inheritance on a reckless "life of dissipation."

When he ends up broke, friendless, and living on a pig farm (which, as Jews, they were forbidden to do), he decides to return home and see if his father might consider taking him back as a hired hand. For as he says to himself, and later to his father, "I have sinned against heaven and against you. I no longer deserve to be called your son."

And he was right. He certainly no longer deserved to be treated as a loving son. He had wished his father dead, he had publicly insulted his father by his outrageous behavior, he had placed little value on what his father had given him, and he had turned his back on his family responsibilities.

The older son definitely agreed that his younger brother had forfeited the title of "son." In fact, he was so angry with his younger brother that he refused to even be in the same room with him upon his return.

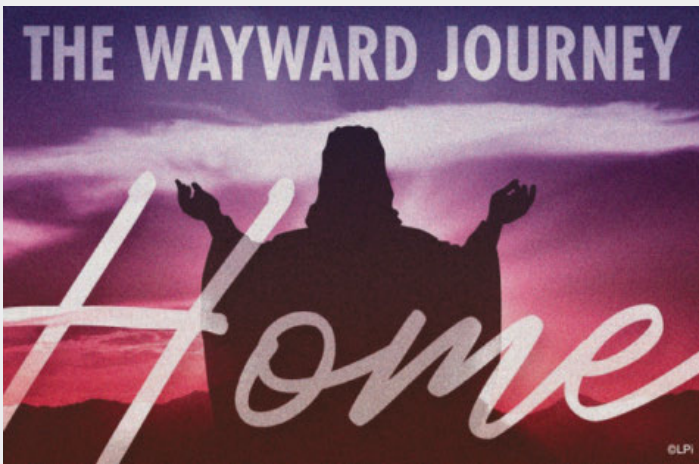
But the father did not treat that younger son as he deserved. Instead he ordered a celebration to mark his return and he announced, "This son of mine was dead, and has come to life gain, he was lost, and has been found."

The father showed his younger son undeserved mercy and forgiveness. After all, what could that son do to erase the heartbreak, hurt, worry, humiliation, and financial loss he had caused his father?

What the father did for that younger son is what God our Father does for us. God does not treat us as we deserve, instead God treats us with mercy.

If God treated us as we deserve, we would end up in a far worse situation than that of the younger son in this parable. We sin, we turn our backs on God, we break our baptismal promises, and we often squander the time, talents, and blessings God gives us. In short, we do not always live as faithful sons and daughters of our heavenly Father.

Yet God does not treat us as we deserve, God shows us undeserved mercy.

Sacrament of Matrimony

Arrangements must be made a minimum of 6 months in advance with the Pastor. Couples are required to attend a Pre-Cana session and a Natural Family Planning (NFP) class. FOCCUS is required and will be done with Fr. Frank for those doing marriage preparation with him.

Sacrament of Baptism

Baptisms are held during Mass and are not scheduled during Advent and Lent. Call the parish office to schedule a baptism.

Parents seeking Baptism for their child must be a registered parishioner for at least six months prior to the Baptism. Non-parishioners would need a letter from their pastor giving permission to have the Baptism at St. Isidore Parish.

A one time attendance to a Baptism Prep. Class is required before baptism. Godparents (not members of St. Isidore Parish) are required to have a letter from their pastor stating they are a *Catholic in Good Standing*. A copy of the child's birth certificate, sponsor names and sponsor forms are to be submitted to the office before a baptism. This is so all records can be kept as accurate as possible.

Sponsors

Please contact the parish office if you have been asked to be a sponsor and are needing a letter stating that you are an active Catholic. You will need to have been a member of St. Isidore Parish for 6 months to receive this letter.

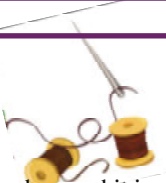


Get out your needle and thimble!

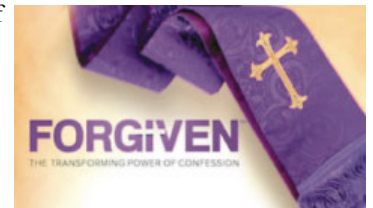
