

#### **Parish News & Notes**

#### From Fr. Frank

Our first reading of this liturgy recalls the "First Exodus" of the people of Israel now in captivity in Babylon. The Word of the Lord speaks of the events of the past in the present tense. They are in exile from their homeland and the "Second Exodus" will be even greater and will confirm their claim that the nation is God's chosen.

In the rest of the prophesy from Isaiah, God is saying, in a sense, "That first display of My power was nothing. You ain't seen nothing yet!" In the First Exodus the waters were split so that a safe passage would be allowed. Now the opposite will take place. Where there is no water in the desert, there will be rivers and a way back

The Gospel story is a "something-new" event. John presents Jesus as being in the temple area and the crowds come to hear His teachings. John's whole Gospel is a presenting of Jesus as a replacement of the temple which the Romans destroyed long after the death and resurrection of Jesus. So the setting of this story is significant and so is Jesus' teaching through this saving event.

The "old", that is, the Pharisees and scribes, are attracted to Jesus, but in a negative way. When they bring to Jesus a woman caught in adultery, the real issue here is whether Jesus is of the "old" or of something "new". If Jesus condemns her then he is of the "old" and they win and remain the religious center for the people. If Jesus violates the Law and does something new and different, then Jesus is not only opposed to the Law, but to their being at the center.

Now, the verses which follow this story begin with Jesus declaring that He is the "Light of the world." This whole chapter is a discussion with the Jewish leaders about just who Jesus is. As "Light" Jesus desires to illumine their minds and hearts. This discussion continues into the next Chapter where the "Man Born Blind" is healed (he sees the "light") and they, the Jewish leaders, are pictured as being blinded by what they fail to see.

The woman of today's Gospel is a set-up person. The Pharisees use her for their purposes as did the man who used her sexually. Jesus uses her as well as a revelation of His "new" revelational way. He frees her from the captivity of the crowd, the Pharisees, and the Law. Jesus sends her out to live as *loved*, not *used* any more. She must become a member of the community once again.

Lent is never meant to be a self-purifying season so that I remain self-purified and self-satisfied at my penances, mortifications, religious strictness. Lent ends with community. Lent ends with Jesus rising and gathering together those who have been untombed. Lent ends with our renewing our baptismal entrances into community. Lent ends, as with the Jews of the "Second Exodus," back in our native soil together, where we belong.

#### Sacrament of Matrimony

Arrangements must be made a minimum of 6 months in advance with the Pastor. Couples are required to attend a Pre-Cana session and a Natural Family Planning (NFP) class. FOCCUS is required and will be done with Fr. Frank for those doing marriage preparation with him.

#### Sacrament of Baptism

Baptisms are held during Mass and are not scheduled during Advent and Lent. Call the parish office to schedule a baptism.

Parents seeking Baptism for their child must be a registered parishioner for at least six months prior to the Baptism. Non-parishioners would need a letter from their pastor giving permission to have the Baptism at St. Isidore Parish.

A one time attendance to a Baptism Prep. Class is required before baptism. Godparents (not members of St. Isidore Parish) are required to have a letter from their pastor stating they are a Catholic in Good Standing. A copy of the child's birth certificate, sponsor names and sponsor forms are to be submitted to the office before a baptism. This is so all records can be kept as accurate as possible.

#### Sponsors

Please contact the parish office if you have been asked to be a sponsor and are needing a letter stating that you are an active Catholic. You will need to have been a member of St. Isidore Parish for 6 months to receive this letter.






