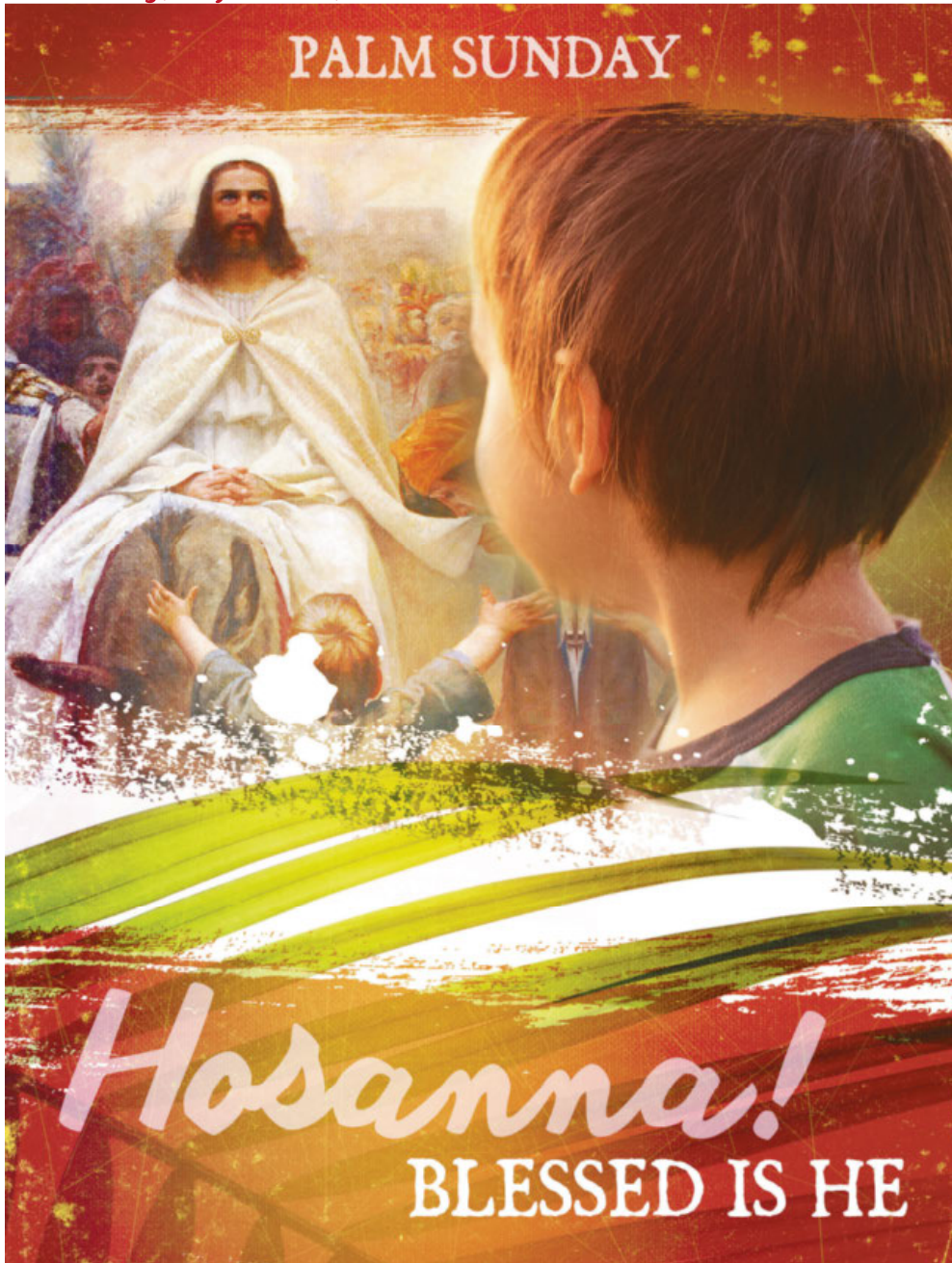

From Fr. Frank

“Why did Jesus have to die on the cross

We might say that Jesus died to open the gates of heaven that had been closed since the sin of Adam.

However, that response does not paint a very merciful picture of God.

It also seems to contradict the parables of Jesus.

For example, in the parable of the Forgiving Father, also known as the parable of the Prodigal Son, the father keeps the door wide open even after the younger son spurns his father and leaves home.

We might answer that Jesus died to save us from our sins. But what exactly does that mean? We still sin, and sin continues to hold sway in our world.

We are not saved from the effects and power of sin. As St. Paul wrote in his Letter to the Romans, “For I do not do the good I want, but I do the evil I do not want. Now if I do what I do not want, it is no longer I who do it, but sin that dwells in me.” (Romans 7:19-20)

We might say that Jesus died to show us that suffering is part of life, **even good people suffer.**

We might reply that Jesus died to teach us that if we want the glory of Easter we have to pay the price of Good Friday.

However, such an explanation seems to imply that salvation is something we buy with our suffering. Salvation is a grace, not something earned by the sufferings we endure or the good works we do.

We might say that Jesus died to demonstrate that life is not fair.

We did not need Jesus to suffer and die to teach us something we learned on the school playground.

While all those explanations are incomplete, they do contain elements of truth that help us to understand the mystery of the Lord’s suffering and death.

This Sunday we are challenged to consider our answer to the question, “Why did Jesus have to die on the cross?” We are challenged to consider the mystery and meaning of the Lord’s Passion and Death.

Think about it.

Sacrament of Matrimony

Arrangements must be made a minimum of 6 months in advance with the Pastor. Couples are required to attend a Pre-Cana session and a Natural Family Planning (NFP) class. FOCCUS is required and will be done with Fr. Frank for those doing marriage preparation with him.

Sacrament of Baptism

Baptisms are held during Mass and are not scheduled during Advent and Lent. Call the parish office to schedule a baptism.

Parents seeking Baptism for their child must be a registered parishioner for at least six months prior to the Baptism. Non-parishioners would need a letter from their pastor giving permission to have the Baptism at St. Isidore Parish.

A one time attendance to a Baptism Prep. Class is required before baptism. Godparents (not members of St. Isidore Parish) are required to have a letter from their pastor stating they are a *Catholic in Good Standing*. A copy of the child’s birth certificate, sponsor names and sponsor forms are to be submitted to the office before a baptism. This is so all records can be kept as accurate as possible.

Sponsors

Please contact the parish office if you have been asked to be a sponsor and are needing a letter stating that you are an active Catholic. You will need to have been a member of St. Isidore Parish for 6 months to receive this letter.
