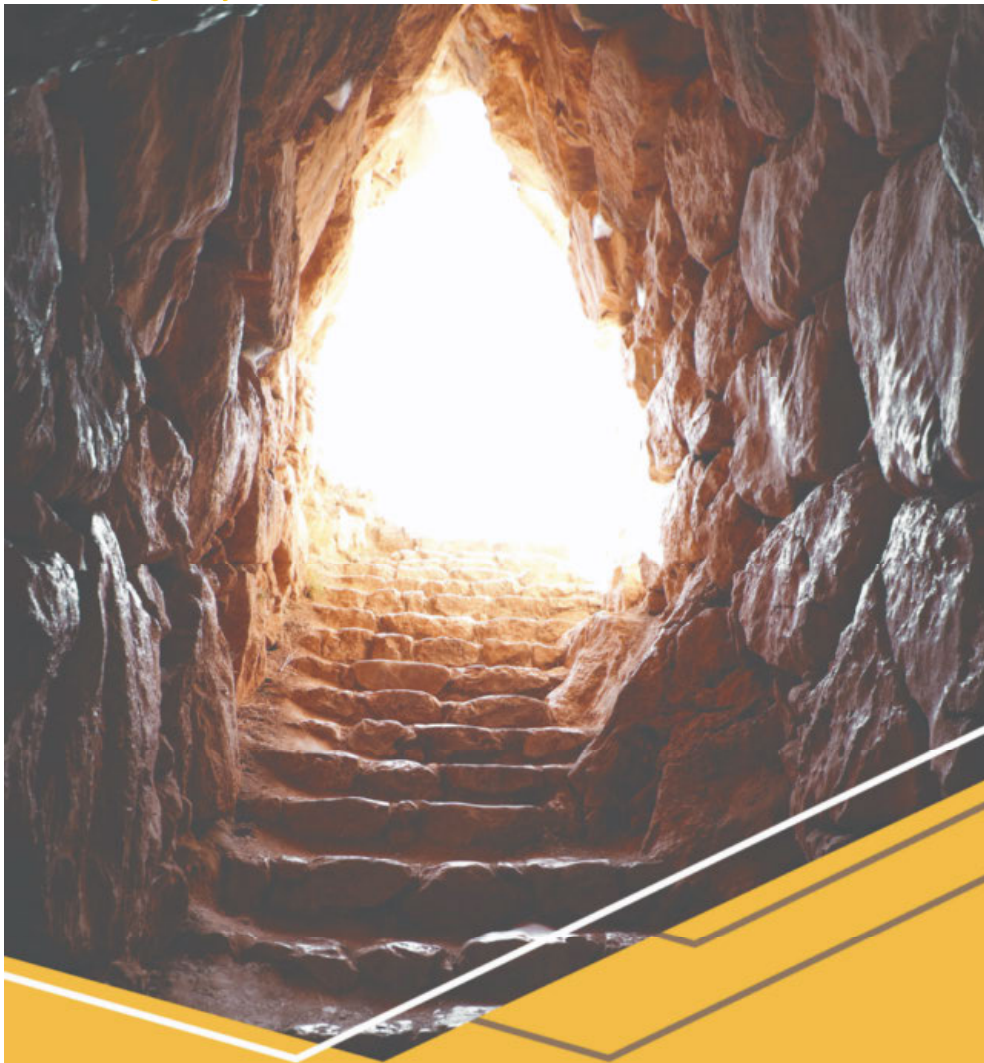

If we want to meet the risen Christ, full of life and creative energy, we need to seek him, to look for him. Not in a dead religion, not a cynical one that is reduced to fulfilling and observing a myriad of external laws and norms, but there where people live according to Jesus' Spirit, where people are welcomed with faith, love, and responsibility for Jesus' followers.

We need to seek him, not among people who are divided and engaged in sterile battles, empty of Jesus's love and of Gospel passion, but there where we go about building communities that put Christ in their center because they know that "where two or three gather in his name, there he will be also."

We won't meet Jesus, who lives, in a faith that is stuck in routine. We won't find him in every kind of topic and formula separate from experience, but in a faith that seeks a new quality in our relationship with him and in our identification with his will. Jesus is not obscure and inert, who doesn't fall in love with each one of us. He touches our hearts and spreads freedom, is literally, the "living Jesus." He is the one who lives and who gives life. To you. To me. To all.

Sacrament of Matrimony

Arrangements must be made a minimum of 6 months in advance with the Pastor. Couples are required to attend a Pre-Cana session and a Natural Family Planning (NFP) class. FOCCUS is required and will be done with Fr. Frank for those doing marriage preparation with him.

Sacrament of Baptism

Baptisms are held during Mass and are not scheduled during Advent and Lent. Call the parish office to schedule a baptism.

Parents seeking Baptism for their child must be a registered parishioner for at least six months prior to the Baptism. Non-parishioners would need a letter from their pastor giving permission to have the Baptism at St. Isidore Parish.

A one time attendance to a Baptism Prep. Class is required before baptism. Godparents (not members of St. Isidore Parish) are required to have a letter from their pastor stating they are a *Catholic in Good Standing*. A copy of the child's birth certificate, sponsor names and sponsor forms are to be submitted to the office before a baptism. This is so all records can be kept as accurate as possible.

Sponsors

Please contact the parish office if you have been asked to be a sponsor and are needing a letter stating that you are an active Catholic. You will need to have been a member of St. Isidore Parish for 6 months to receive this letter.

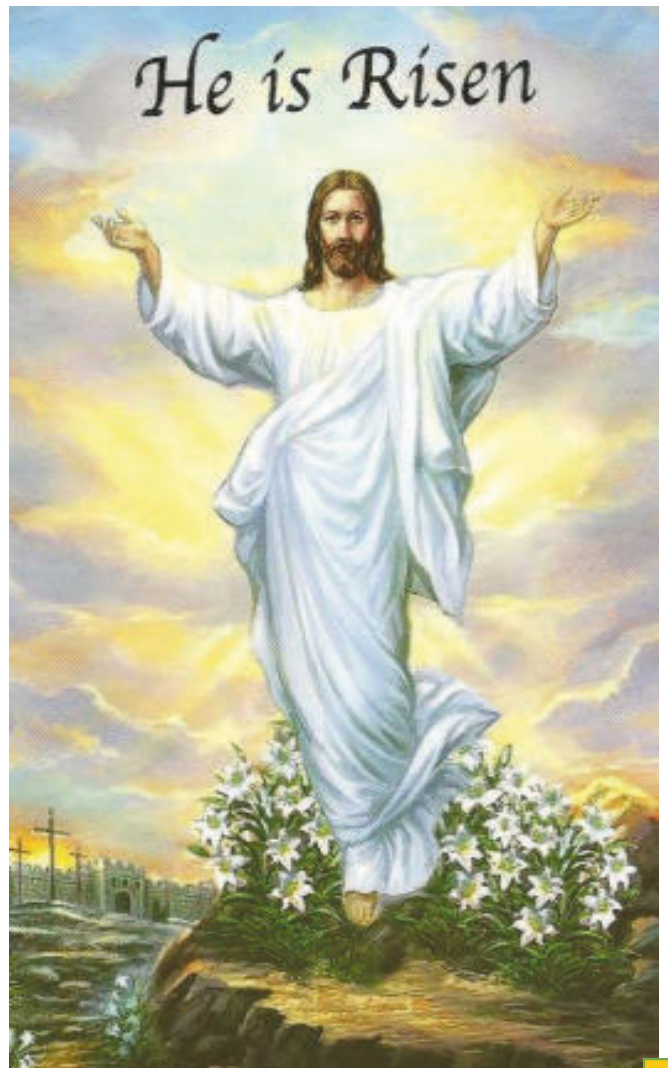

The Legend of the Dogwood

There is a legend that, at the time of the crucifixion, the dogwood had been the size of the oak and other forest trees.

So firm and strong was the tree that it was chosen as the timber for the cross.

To be used for such a cruel purpose greatly distressed the tree, and our Lord, nailed upon it, sensed this, and in his gentle pity for all sorrow and suffering said to it:

“Because of your regret and pity for my suffering, never again shall the dogwood tree grow large enough to be used as a cross.

Henceforth it shall be slender and bent and twisted, and its blossoms shall be in the form of a cross, two long and two short petals.

And in the center of the outer edge of each petal there will be nail prints,

brown with rust and stained with red,

and in the center of the flower

will be a crown of thorns,

and all who see it will remember.”

Leave It in the Tomb

Today, on the most important day of the liturgical year, the Apostle Paul is calling us out.

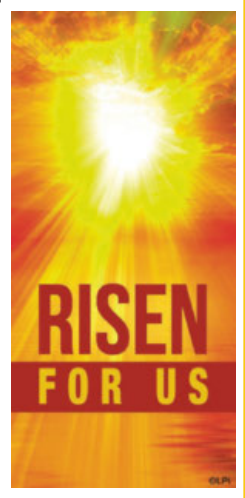
“I see you hiding in that tomb,” he says. “I see you baking with that old, stale yeast, thinking no one will notice.”

He says it a little more elegantly, I’ll grant you. But the message is this: If you want to be raised with Christ, you’d better be ready to step out of the shadows. Seek what is above — not what is on earth.

I can feel myself responding almost reflexively, “Great idea, Paul — but I’m pretty comfy here.” Because sometimes, it’s just easier to stay in the tomb. It’s easier to crouch in the shadows and look outward at everyone else, thinking of the changes they could make or the sins they could overcome.

Today we are called to embrace newness. New hearts, new lives, new futures, new chances. If there’s anything keeping you from that, you need to leave it in the tomb. It’s a little scary, sure — maybe Jesus thought so before he stepped into the light of that first Easter morning. But no loaf of bread worth eating was ever baked using stale yeast that wouldn’t rise. No new life worth having was ever lived through the broken sins of yesterday. No Easter morning ever dawned without the tomb sitting empty.

Step into the light. He is waiting for you.

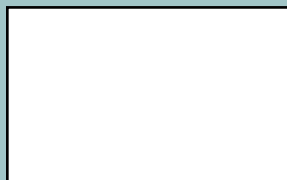

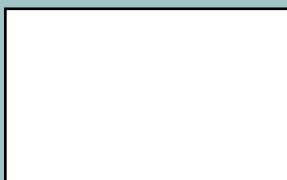
