

#### **Parish News & Notes**

#### From Fr. Frank

Today, and right on up to the feast of Pentecost, we continue to celebrate Easter; we continue to celebrate the fact that Jesus Christ is still alive and still present with us.

All through this time we will be led by the liturgy to see Jesus - to see Jesus truly and concretely present to us right here and now, right in this contemporary world.

This will not be by our experiencing appearances of the risen Lord as the apostles did, but it will be by hearing the gospel stories and believing, just as the apostles believed; that is, it will be simply by faith.

This is what Jesus says when he tells Thomas, "Blest are they who have not seen and have believed." That is, blest are they who do not see with their eyes, but do see with their faith.

And this is also what St. John says when he tells us why he wrote this story and, in fact, why he wrote his whole gospel: "In order to help you believe," John says, "so that through this faith you may have life."

There it is; there is the only way for us to see, that is, by believing, by faith.

And all the others - all those who do not have faith - how can they see Jesus?

Only by seeing the visible signs and wonders of the visible people of God; that is, by seeing the public, tangible, concrete acts of human goodness that we as a community of faith, that we as a believing people, that we as a church, do in the world.

This is the only way for all of them to see the real, actual, alive presence of Jesus that we already see by our faith.

This is why it is so absolutely necessary for us to really live our faith – not just in order that we might be saved, but in order that they might see.

During these Sundays of Easter we read from the book of Scripture which is known as the Acts of the Apostles - the book that tells us about the early church.

And one of the essential characteristics of that church that the Acts of the Apostles tells us about in our first reading for today is that it was a healing church - healing in the deep-down sense of forgiveness and reconciliation and unity and peace.

This is what the church should be all about.

And what this Scripture reading is certainly telling us is that we, the church of today, must bring to our own time the sign and wonder of being really and truly and fully and only a healing church, a reconciling church, a peace church - a church that witnesses both by word and action, in every possible public forum that witnesses to the primary dignity of human life and all the positive values that go with that.

The resurrection of Jesus, the core of Christian belief, inspires the Church to proclaim the Gospel of Life, with the force of him who has conquered death.

St. John Paul II talked to the world a lot, about what he called the culture of death. A culture that seems to have lost its preferential option for the poor, the weak, the unborn, even.

He called all humanity to work with firmness and courage, so that in our time, so shaken by so many signs of death, there may finally be installed a new culture of life - the fruit of a culture of truth and of love.

Always and everywhere - all of us, together must publicly stand up against the widespread culture of death in all its forms - abortion, euthanasia, capital punishment, war, the arms trade, nuclear (cont'd.)

#### Sacrament of Matrimony

Arrangements must be made a minimum of 6 months in advance with the Pastor. Couples are required to attend a Pre-Cana session and a Natural Family Planning (NFP) class. FOCCUS is required and will be done with Fr. Frank for those doing marriage preparation with him.

#### Sacrament of Baptism

Baptisms are held during Mass and are not scheduled during Advent and Lent. Call the parish office to schedule a baptism.

Parents seeking Baptism for their child must be a registered parishioner for at least six months prior to the Baptism. Non-parishioners would need a letter from their pastor giving permission to have the Baptism at St. Isidore Parish.

A one time attendance to a Baptism Prep. Class is required before baptism. Godparents (not members of St. Isidore Parish) are required to have a letter from their pastor stating they are a *Catholic in Good Standing*. A copy of the child's birth certificate, sponsor names and sponsor forms are to be submitted to the office before a baptism. This is so all records can be kept as accurate as possible.

#### Sponsors

Please contact the parish office if you have been asked to be a sponsor and are needing a letter stating that you are an active Catholic. You will need to have been a member of St. Isidore Parish for 6 months to receive this letter.


