Parish News & Notes

From Fr. Frank

"I am going fishing." That's what Peter says in this Sunday's Gospel. ([John 21:1-14](#)). It's no surprise to hear such words from Peter. After all, Peter and his brother, Andrew, as well as James and John and several of the other Apostles were all fishermen. When Jesus called them to come follow him, they left their nets and their boats, and became his disciples. Jesus told them "Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men." (Matthew 4:19).

What is surprising is to hear that statement from Peter just days after the Resurrection of Jesus. Peter says, "I am going fishing" and six Apostles join him in the boat. They return to their former profession.

In the Gospel of John, the Risen Lord had appeared to those very Apostles that first Easter Sunday evening and commissioned them to share his mercy and forgiveness with all people. The following Sunday, he came again and Thomas proclaimed him "My Lord and my God."

But apparently the wonder of those events had already receded in their minds. Now it was back to life as usual. However, the Lord appears a third and final time in the Gospel of John and shows the Apostles they cannot go back to fishing. His Resurrection makes things different. Life has to change.

Peter and the other Apostles fish all night and catch nothing. But when they heed the advice of the Risen Lord who appears to them on the beach, their catch of fish is beyond expectation. The Gospel says they caught 153 fish. No random number, for according to scholars that was how many species of fish were thought to exist at that time. All kinds of fish, all kinds of people, were to be "caught" for the Gospel. Further, despite the size of the catch, the Gospel relates their net was not torn. The net had room for all, just as Christ's Church was to have room for people of every race, nation, and way of life.

The Apostles were to be fishers of people. As Jesus had "caught" them, so they were to go forth and bring people into God's embrace, into God's Church. The Risen Lord would be with them, guiding them, strengthening them, challenging them. If we truly believe in the Resurrection and the mission we have received to share our faith, we cannot live as usual. Like the Apostles, we cannot just go back to "fishing."

Sacrament of Matrimony

Arrangements must be made a minimum of 6 months in advance with the Pastor. Couples are required to attend a Pre-Cana session and a Natural Family Planning (NFP) class. FOCCUS is required and will be done with Fr. Frank for those doing marriage preparation with him.

Sacrament of Baptism

Baptisms are held during Mass and are not scheduled during Advent and Lent. Call the parish office to schedule a baptism.

Parents seeking Baptism for their child must be a registered parishioner for at least six months prior to the Baptism. Non-parishioners would need a letter from their pastor giving permission to have the Baptism at St. Isidore Parish.

A one time attendance to a Baptism Prep. Class is required before baptism. Godparents (not members of St. Isidore Parish) are required to have a letter from their pastor stating they are a *Catholic in Good Standing*. A copy of the child's birth certificate, sponsor names and sponsor forms are to be submitted to the office before a baptism. This is so all records can be kept as accurate as possible.

Sponsors

Please contact the parish office if you have been asked to be a sponsor and are needing a letter stating that you are an active Catholic. You will need to have been a member of St. Isidore Parish for 6 months to receive this letter.

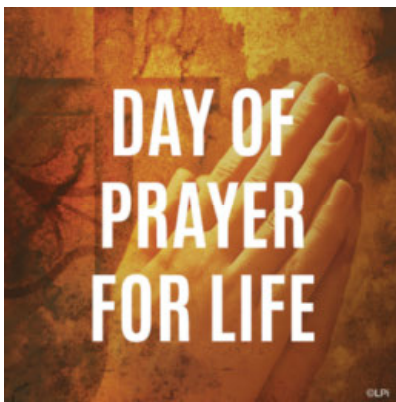

Tuesday Morning Summer Liturgy

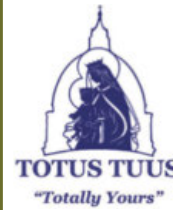

Gifts in Disguise

Have you ever opened a gift and wondered what the giver was thinking?

I won't call out any of my family or friends here, but suffice to say, I think we have all been the confused recipient of a sweater that wasn't our size or a gift card to a store where we don't shop. But we smiled all the same and said how much it meant to us, because we know that when it comes to gifts, it's all about the gesture.

Suffering is a lot like that — the gift you never asked for, and don't really want to receive. Sometimes we look at suffering and, like the apostles who see Jesus as a stranger on the shore, we don't recognize it for what it can be. We don't appreciate the catalyst suffering can be for change, for growth, for grace.

What was the gift that you received in disguise? Was it a relationship that confounded and frustrated you? Was it a job that tested your spirit? An obstacle that stopped you dead in your tracks? A rejection that threatened to break your spirit?

If I go back and look at the worst gifts I've ever gotten, chances are that I didn't like them because I didn't know what to do with them — they were more fitted for someone else's interests, someone else's life. It's the same with suffering. We're tempted to cast suffering aside when it comes our way because it doesn't fit the person we are. Suffering is made to fit the person God knows we have the ability, with His grace, to become.

Hang onto that suffering. Unlike the misshapen sweater, it really will come in handy.
