

THE FAMILY IS AT THE HEART OF THE CHRISTMAS MYSTERY

Christmas Season. Please know that I am grateful to have you institution that we must preserve. It is God's plan for the as a part of St. Mary parish.

Let's continue to wish each other "Merry Christmas!" for the next two weeks. The celebration of the Christmas mystery extends beyond December 25th. We have the 8-day octave of Christmas that stretches to the celebration of Mary, the Mother of God on January 1st. December 26th is the feast of the Holy Family. We celebrate Epiphany on the following Sunday and conclude the Christmas season with the feast of the Baptism of the Lord. In fact, some people even follow the tradition of observing the Christmas Season all the way through "Candlemas" (the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord) on February 2nd.

The birth of Jesus, fully God and fully man, changed human history. God became man and was born into our world! He was born into poverty. He was born vulnerable. He was born into the love of a family.

Whenever I think of the mystery of Christmas I think of one of outside of the Catholic Church and, thus, attempt to live the titles that the prophets gave to the savior who would be born for us: "Emmanuel," which means, "God with us" (Isaiah 7:14; Matthew 1:23). Jesus truly is "God with us." Jesus was born into our world just as we were born. He lived a fully human life. Though he had a fully divine nature, in his human nature he truly grew in wisdom and stature (Lk 2:53). He knew what it was to be tired, to hunger, to thirst, to love, to mourn, to pray, to suffer, to forgive, and to die. Jesus knows what we experience. He sees us. He has compassion on us. He loves us.

In light of the Feast of the Holy Family, I wish to reflect briefly on the mystery of the family. In some ways, we can consider the family to be an "endangered species." In 1968, 85% of children under the age of 18 lived with two parents (regardless of marital status). By 2020, only 70% did, according to the U.S. Census Bureau's Current Population Survey. Children living with their mother only accounted for 11% of children in 1968. In 2020 that category rose to 21%. Many different factors contribute to the tragedy of divorce and/or single-parent households. We never want to judge or stigmatize single-parents. Many single-parents and divorced parents do a heroic job raising their children in difficult situations. They find ways to raise strong faith-filled children.

They are part of our Church and we need to support them! However, there is a reason why the family with a mother and Merry Christmas! I want to wish you and your family a blessed father who live together with their children remains an family. God has endowed men and women with unique gifts that complement each other and contribute to the healthy development of children. Children who lack stable loving families often suffer higher rates of anxiety, depression, anger, aggression, etc.

> The Catechism of the Catholic Church states that "in a world often alien and even hostile to faith, believing families are of primary importance as centers of living, radiant faith. The Church has called the family the "domestic church" because "it is in the bosom of the family that parents are 'by word and example... the first heralds of the faith with regard to their children." (CCC, 1656, quoting Vatican II, Lumen Gentium 11). Another alarming trend is that more and more adults are not getting married. More adults are intentionally having children outside of wedlock and considering marriage to be an inessential option. Those Catholics who do marry often marry family life without the grace of the sacrament of Holy Matrimony.

Marriage and family are not valued among members of society and among the baptized in the same way that they were in years past. We need to resist that trend. We need to prioritize marriage and the family.

Families: continue to be intentional about the time that you spend together eating, praying, recreating. Find ways to continue to learn your faith together. Go to Mass together. Married couples: Spend time together. Go on date nights. Do not take your marriage for granted. Put away your smart phones and tablets. Look one another in the face and talk to each other. Communicate. Share your lives with each other. The family is the first place where we receive love and give love. We need our families. God set the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph before us in order to give us a model to follow. I realize that the Holy Family possesses a holiness that is a far cry from our own messy reality. God gives us grace, however. If we commit ourselves to our families and strive to love and accompany each other then God will bring healing and fruit even where we suffer dysfunction. God bless our families.







THE HOLY FACE OF JESUS DEVOTION

Tuesday, January 4th, 6:00 PM

Jesus promised, among many other blessings, that honoring His Holy Face through this devotion offers:

- The Conversion of many sinners and mercy granted to their souls disfigured by sin, and,
- Reparation for outrages against the Majesty of God – Communism, Atheism, cursing, desecration of Sundays and Holy Days and other grave insults.

The Holy Face devotion began when Jesus revealed

Himself to Sister Mary of St. Peter, a French Carmelite, in 1845. In one of His many revelations to her, He said this of His Holy Face:

"Offer It unceasingly to My Father for the salvation of your country".

Our own image of the Holy Face, which will be on display, has been pressed to the traveling relic of the Holy Face of Jesus, a relic verified by the Vatican as having been touched to Veronica's Veil, the True Wood of the Cross, and the spear that pierced Christ's side.

This was a favorite devotion of St. Theresa, the Little Flower. She said that the suffering, wounded Face of her dear Jesus was the foundation of all her piety.



BLESSING RELIGIOUS ITEMS


Mondays following the 8:00 AM Mass

"CHALKING THE DOORS" HOUSE BLESSING FOR EPIPHANY

Next Sunday, January 2nd, is Epiphany (also known as Twelfth Night, Theophany, or Three Kings Day). This day marks the occasion of a time-honored Christian tradition of "chalking the doors." The formula for the ritual — adapted for 2022 — is simple: take chalk and write the following above the entrance of your home: 20 + C + M + B + 22.

The letters have two meanings. First, they represent the initials of the Magi — Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar— who came to visit Jesus in His first home. They also abbreviate the Latin phrase, Christus mansionem benedicat: "May Christ bless the house." The "+" signs represent the cross, and the "20" at the beginning and the "22" at the end mark the year. Taken together, this inscription is performed as a request for Christ to bless those homes so marked and that He stay with those who dwell therein throughout the entire year.

The chalking of the doors is a centuries-old practice throughout the world, though it appears to be somewhat less well-known in the United States. It is, however, an easy tradition to adopt, and a great practice whereby we dedicate our year to God from its very outset, asking His blessing on our homes and on all who live, work, or visit them there.

The timing for the chalking of the doors varies somewhat in practice. This prayer may be prayed on the traditional Feast of the Epiphany — the Twelfth Day of Christmas. Most often, the chalking takes place after Epiphany Mass, and can be done at any church, home, or dwelling.

PRAYER:

When all have gathered, a suitable song may be sung. The leader makes the sign of the cross, and all reply, "Amen." The leader greets those present in the following words:

Let us praise God, who fills our hearts and homes with peace. Blessed be God forever.

R/. Blessed be God forever.

In the following or similar words, the leader prepares those present for the blessing:

The Word became flesh and made his dwelling place among us. It is Christ who enlightens our hearts and homes with

his love. May all who enter this home find Christ's light and love.

One of those present or the leader reads a text of sacred Scripture, for example, Luke 19:1-9:

Listen to the words of the holy Gospel according to Luke:

Jesus came to Jericho and intended to pass through the town. Now a man there named Zacchaeus, who was a chief tax collector and also a wealthy man, was seeking to see who Jesus was; but he could not see him because of the crowd, for he was short in stature. So he ran ahead and climbed a sycamore tree in order to see Jesus, who was about to pass that way. When he reached the place, Jesus looked up and said to him, "Zacchaeus, come down quickly, for today I must stay at your house." And he came down quickly and received him with joy. When they all saw this, they began to grumble, saying, "He has gone to stay at the house of a sinner." But Zacchaeus stood there and said to the Lord, "Behold, half of my possessions, Lord, I shall give to the poor, and if I have extorted anything from anyone I shall repay it four times over." And Jesus said to him, "Today salvation has come to this house because this man too is a descendant of Abraham."

The intercessions are then said:

Leader: The Son of God made his home among us. With thanks and praise let us call upon him.

R/. Stay with us, Lord.

Leader: Lord Jesus Christ, with Mary and Joseph you formed the Holy Family: remain in our home, that we may know you as our guest and honor you as our Head. We pray:

R/. Stay with us, Lord.

Leader: Lord Jesus Christ, you had no place to lay your head, but in the spirit of poverty accepted the hospitality of your friends: grant that through our help the homeless may obtain proper housing. We pray:

R/. Stay with us, Lord.

Leader: Lord Jesus Christ, the three kings presented their gifts to you in praise and adoration: grant that those living in this house may use their talents and abilities to your greater glory. We pray:

R/. Stay with us, Lord.

After the intercessions the leader invites all present to say the Lord's Prayer.

The leader says the prayer of blessing with hands joined:

Lord God of heaven and earth, you revealed your only-begotten Son to every nation by the guidance of a star. Bless this house and all who inhabit it. Fill us with the light of Christ, that our concern for others may reflect your love. We ask this through Christ our Lord.

R/. Amen.

The leader concludes the rite by signing himself or herself with the sign of the cross and saying:

May Christ Jesus dwell with us, keep us from all harm, and make us one in mind and heart, now and forever.


R/. Amen.

It is preferable to end the celebration with a suitable song, for example, "O Come, All Ye Faithful" or "We Three Kings."






Thanksgiving Dinners




