NO TIME FOR RELATIVISM AND INDIFFERENCE

Merry Christmas and Blessed Epiphany!

As we reflect on today's Gospel (Matthew 2:1-12) we realize that the pursuit of truth requires sacrifice. The magi come "from the East." Scholars debate about the background of the magi. However, we do know that they were gentiles (non-Jews) who travelled a long distance in order to come to Bethlehem and honor the newborn king of the Jews.

Today we live in a culture dominated by relativism ("what is true for you is true for you; what is true for me is true for me") and indifferentism ("it does not really matter what a person believes about God or anything else"). The magi, however, are a witness to the fact that the human person is meant to search for the truth. They were not content with the world that they lived in. They were not content with their limited experience. They heard stories about the Jews awaiting a Messiah king. They may have even been familiar with the Jewish prophesy that a star would accompany his birth (see Numbers 24:17). They felt compelled to go see the newborn king. They endured a long journey to do so. When they

found him, they did him homage and gave him gifts.

This is exactly what we do at Mass. we travel throughout our week contemplating God's presence. We long to see him. Finally, on Sunday,



we come to present our gifts to God: our joys, praise, sorrows, crosses, work, intentions, questions, all of it. While we do not bow down prostrate before the Christ child, we do kneel in humble adoration before Jesus truly present in the Most Blessed Sacrament. We worship. We need to search for the truth and worship the one true God and savior of the human race. It matters.

I hope that everyone had fine celebrations of Christmas. I will be away on vacation from January 2nd through the 12th. Know of my prayers for all of you. God bless!





The Seventh Commandment

YOU SHALL NOT STEAL

-CCC, NOS, 2401-2463



THE GOOD THIEF NEXT TO CHRIST CRUCIFIED

Respect People and Their Possessions

"The seventh Commandment forbids theft. Theft is the usurpation of another's goods against the reasonable will of the owner. . . . Every manner of taking and using another's property unjustly is contrary to the seventh commandment. The injustice committed requires reparation. Commutative justice requires the restitution of stolen goods."

-CCC, nos. 2453-2454

The Seventh Commandment forbids stealing or theft, which involves taking someone's money or property "against the reasonable will of the owner." Theft includes not only robbery but also actions such as embezzlement, computer theft, counterfeit money, fraud, identity theft, copyright violations (including pirating things such as music or computer software), and mail scams.


To keep this Commandment, we need to acquire the virtues of moderation in our possessions, justice in our treatment of others, respect for their human dignity, and solidarity with all peoples. Moderation curbs our attachment to worldly goods and restrains our appetite for consumerism. Justice helps us respect our neighbor's rights and be interested in their human well-being. Solidarity opens our hearts to identifying with the whole human family, reminding us of our common humanity.

We should not steal from each other, pay unfair salaries, cheat in business, or exploit people's weaknesses to make money. Promises should be kept and contracts honored to the extent that the issues are morally just (cf. CCC, no. 2410). We need to safeguard property rights, pay our debts, and fulfill obligations freely incurred. The government has the right and duty to safeguard legitimate ownership of money and property and to protect people from robbery and injury.


THE HOLY FACE OF JESUS DEVOTION

The Holy Face devotion began when Jesus revealed Himself




"Offer It unceasingly to My Father for the salvation of your country".





"CHALKING THE DOORS" HOUSE BLESSING FOR EPIPHANY

Next Sunday, January 2nd, is Epiphany (also known as Twelfth Night, Theophany, or Three Kings Day). This day marks the occasion of a time-honored Christian tradition of "chalking the doors." The formula for the ritual — adapted for 2022 — is simple: take chalk and write the following above the entrance of your home: 20 + C + M + B + 22.

The letters have two meanings. First, they represent the initials of the Magi — Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar— who came to visit Jesus in His first home. They also abbreviate the Latin phrase, Christus mansionem benedicat: "May Christ bless the house." The "+" signs represent the cross, and the "20" at the beginning and the "22" at the end mark the year. Taken together, this inscription is performed as a request for Christ to bless those homes so marked and that He stay with those who dwell therein throughout the entire year.

The chalking of the doors is a centuries-old practice throughout the world, though it appears to be somewhat less well-known in the United States. It is, however, an easy tradition to adopt, and a great practice whereby we dedicate our year to God from its very outset, asking His blessing on our homes and on all who live, work, or visit them there.

The timing for the chalking of the doors varies somewhat in practice. This prayer may be prayed on the traditional Feast of the Epiphany — the Twelfth Day of Christmas. Most often, the chalking takes place after Epiphany Mass, and can be done at any church, home, or dwelling.

PRAYER:

When all have gathered, a suitable song may be sung. The leader makes the sign of the cross, and all reply, "Amen." The leader greets those present in the following words:

Let us praise God, who fills our hearts and homes with peace. Blessed be God forever.

R/. Blessed be God forever.

In the following or similar words, the leader prepares those present for the blessing:

The Word became flesh and made his dwelling place among us. It is Christ who enlightens our hearts and homes with

his love. May all who enter this home find Christ's light and love.

One of those present or the leader reads a text of sacred Scripture, for example, Luke 19:1-9:

Listen to the words of the holy Gospel according to Luke:

Jesus came to Jericho and intended to pass through the town. Now a man there named Zacchaeus, who was a chief tax collector and also a wealthy man, was seeking to see who Jesus was; but he could not see him because of the crowd, for he was short in stature. So he ran ahead and climbed a sycamore tree in order to see Jesus, who was about to pass that way. When he reached the place, Jesus looked up and said to him, "Zacchaeus, come down quickly, for today I must stay at your house." And he came down quickly and received him with joy. When they all saw this, they began to grumble, saying, "He has gone to stay at the house of a sinner." But Zacchaeus stood there and said to the Lord, "Behold, half of my possessions, Lord, I shall give to the poor, and if I have extorted anything from anyone I shall repay it four times over." And Jesus said to him, "Today salvation has come to this house because this man too is a descendant of Abraham."

The intercessions are then said:

Leader: The Son of God made his home among us. With thanks and praise let us call upon him.

R/. Stay with us, Lord.

Leader: Lord Jesus Christ, with Mary and Joseph you formed the Holy Family: remain in our home, that we may know you as our guest and honor you as our Head. We pray:

R/. Stay with us, Lord.

Leader: Lord Jesus Christ, you had no place to lay your head, but in the spirit of poverty accepted the hospitality of your friends: grant that through our help the homeless may obtain proper housing. We pray:

R/. Stay with us, Lord.

Leader: Lord Jesus Christ, the three kings presented their gifts to you in praise and adoration: grant that those living in this house may use their talents and abilities to your greater glory. We pray:

R/. Stay with us, Lord.

After the intercessions the leader invites all present to say the Lord's Prayer.

The leader says the prayer of blessing with hands joined:

Lord God of heaven and earth, you revealed your only-begotten Son to every nation by the guidance of a star. Bless this house and all who inhabit it. Fill us with the light of Christ, that our concern for others may reflect your love. We ask this through Christ our Lord.

R/. Amen.

The leader concludes the rite by signing himself or herself with the sign of the cross and saying:


Q & A—Dropped Host

Question: What happens to a consecrated host if it accidentally falls to the ground?


Answer: This a very practical question because, as we all know, accidents happen, even during the most careful celebration of the liturgy. The short answer to this question is that nothing happens to the consecrated host. The Real Presence of Jesus remains in the consecrated host or any consecrated wine that might accidentally be spilled.

Another question we might ask is: How should the minsters respond if the Eucharist is dropped or spilled? If this happens, the priest, deacon, or extraordinary minister of holy Communion should immediately pick up the dropped host and consume it. If it is a case of the Precious Blood being spilled, the minister would use the purificator (and additional purificators if needed) to clean the spill and then the area should be reverently washed as soon as the Mass is over and the water poured into the sacrarium (a special sink that is located in church sacristies for reverently disposing of holy water, the water used to clean sacred vessels, etc.).


