WHY TALK ABOUT ABORTION?

On Saturday, January 22nd, we marked the 49th anniversary of the U.S. Supreme Court's Roe vs. Wade decision. This Court ruled that the Constitution abortion? First, we want to includes a "right to privacy" that extends to a woman's right to have an abortion without excessive government restriction. Since 1973 an estimated 62 million human persons have been killed the trauma that abortion inflicts. We want to protect through abortion.

The Church's teaching on abortion is clear: "Human life must be respected and protected absolutely from the moment of conception. From the first moment of his existence, a human being must be recognized as having the rights of a person—among which is the inviolable right of every innocent being to life" (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 2270)

"Since the first century the Church has affirmed the moral evil of every procured abortion. This teaching has not changed and remains unchangeable. Direct abortion, that is to say, abortion willed either as an end or a means, is gravely contrary to the moral law: 'You shall not kill the embryo by abortion and shall not cause the newborn to perish' " [early 2nd century catechetical document Didache 2, 2] (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 2271)

Here at St. Mary I have had a few parishioners complain to me that they are tired of hearing about abortion from the pulpit. I, too, am tired of having to address it. I wish that we priests never had to address it. Since abortion remains the greatest injustice in our world today, however, we must continue to preach the truth. One woman once asked me: "Why don't you priests preach against gun violence in Chicago?" I replied: "Because, unlike abortion, gun violence is already considered a crime and it is neither celebrated nor promoted by our

society and our government."

Why must priests continue to preach against the evils of protect the lives of innocent babies. Secondly, we want to protect men and women from



their souls from grave sin. We want Catholics to stop voting in politicians who support and even promote abortion. We want desperate women to know that they do not have to kill their child in order to have success in life. We want men to take responsibility for the women in their lives and their unborn children. We want families to support a child who finds themselves in an unplanned pregnancy. We want the Catholic faithful to volunteer at crisis pregnancy centers and work on the front lines to support women in need.

I want any woman who has had an abortion to know that she can experience forgiveness and healing through Jesus Christ. Men who were involved in an abortion need to know this, as well. Come to the sacrament of confession. Do not be afraid! The Church also offers retreats that can help bring healing (check out "Project Rachel" at HopeAfterAbortion.org, or by phone (815) 387-3379, or email projectrachelrockford@gmail.com).

We still await a decision from the U.S. Supreme Court in the Dobbs case. Perhaps this will be the year that Roe vs. Wade is overturned. Even if that happens the battle to protect human life and build up a culture of life will continue.




