HOW SHOULD CATHOLICS RESPOND TO PRIDE MONTH? Church teaching on homosexuality

Now that June is here rainbows are cropping up everywhere: on corporate advertisements, on professional baseball team uniforms, on candy bar wrappers, in shop windows. June, we are told, is "Pride Month," a month for members of the LGBTQ+ community to celebrate their identity. How are Catholics to respond? <u>We proclaim the truth in love</u>.

What is the truth regarding homosexuality? The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* covers "chastity and homosexuality" in three paragraphs under its treatment of the Sixth Commandment (2357-2359). In paragraph 2357 the Catechism states: "Basing itself on Sacred Scripture, which presents homosexual acts as acts of grave depravity, tradition has always declared that 'homosexual acts are intrinsically disordered' [CDF, *Persona humana* 8]. They are contrary to the natural law. They close the sexual act to the gift of life. They do not proceed from a genuine affective and sexual complementarity. Under no circumstances can they be approved."

Those words will seem harsh to many people. Some argue that "the Church hates gays!" Of course, this is not true. The Church is required to hold fast to true meaning of human sexuality as revealed by God. If we really love someone we will desire their salvation and we will present them with the truth. Here is the truth. Sexual love is meant to be an expression of total self-gift between one man and one woman, united in the lifelong covenant of marriage. Authentic sexual love is free, total, faithful, and fruitful. Holding fast to this truth the Church also condemns other forms of sexual expression as sinful: rape, adultery, "hooking up" (aka fornication), polygamy, masturbation, contraception, pornography, etc.

For a long time sex was considered inseparable from marriage and the procreation of children. With the development of artificial contraception in the 1960s, it became easier to separate sex from marriage. Men could engage in adultery with less fear of getting caught through an unintended pregnancy. Since sex no longer

necessarily lead to procreation, sex outside of marriage increased. Many people cling to the option for abortion when, to their apparent shock, their sexual activity resulted in pregnancy! <u>Once sex was separated from</u> <u>marriage and the procreation of children, any form of</u> <u>sexual expression seemed valid</u>. If it felt good, do it! **We all want to love and be loved**

While Church teaching states that homosexual *acts* are sinful, homosexual inclination is not sinful. We still do not know everything that contributes to same-sex orientation (biological/genetic, psychological, social causes). However, the Church teaches that <u>homosexual persons, like everyone else, are called to chastity (</u>CCC 2359). They are a part of the Church. They are our brothers and sisters and we are called to walk with them and support them as we all strive to follow Jesus and grow in holiness together.

Heterosexuals, homosexuals, and those who question their gender all have some basic things in common: <u>we all want to love and be loved. We also all</u> <u>want to belong</u>. No one wants to feel alone or excluded.

Our culture is obsessed with labels (gay, straight, trans, cis, etc). Many people feel the pressure to identify with a label and pigeonhole themselves. However, the true label that covers us all is "loved by God." Every human being alive in this world was created by God and willed by God into existence. If you are reading this know that God loves you! Jesus Christ, the Son of God incarnate, died on the cross and rose from the dead to redeem you! That is how precious you are to God. That is another true label: "redeemed." If you were baptized then your most important identity is as a "beloved son or daughter of God."

Regardless of your sexual desires, Jesus Christ is calling you to become a saint! Every desire that we have (even our sexual desires) are ultimately related to our desire to love and be loved. <u>That desire can only be fully</u> <u>satisfied by Jesus Christ</u>. We are all sinners. Let's all follow Him together.



ASK FATHER

Question: "Is Jesus—God and Christ—one person?" (Anonymous)

Answer: Excellent question to try to answer on Trinity Sunday! The dogma of the Holy Trinity states that there is one God in three persons. The Father is God. The Son is God. The Holy Spirit is God. However, there is one God,

not three gods. The Father, Son, and Holy Spirit are God. However, the Father is not the Son, the Son is not the Holy



Spirit, the Holy Spirit is not the Father. Confused yet? Well, we are grappling with the deepest of mysteries here (if we lowly human beings could easily understand God then He would not be God). The Father, Son, and Holy Spirit are coeternal. They have always existed, none were created. Sometimes we say that the Son is "the Word" or eternal image that the Father has of Himself. The Holy Spirit is the love between the Father and the Son.

In the fullness of time, God the Son took to Himself a human nature in the womb of the Blessed Virgin Mary. He was born into our world and known as Jesus of Nazareth (or, Jesus "the Christ"—the Messiah). Jesus Christ is one person who has two natures (a divine nature and a human nature). He is fully God and fully man. Even though the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit are not the same person—they are all one in that they share the divine nature. Scripture says of Jesus Christ that he is "the image of the invisible God" (Colossians 1:15). Jesus said "I and the Father are one" (John 10:30). We can also see how the Son is different from the Father when Jesus prays to the Father (see, for example, John chapter 17). —Answered by Fr. DiTomo
