BE OPEN IN MERCY TO YOUR NEIGHBOR


In today's Gospel (Luke 10:25-37) the scholar of the law "stood up to test Jesus." In "testing" Jesus, the scholar of the law was doing the same thing that the devil did to Jesus for 40 days in the desert (Luke 4:2). (It is never a good thing to be acting like the devil.) Usually, when a person is testing someone, the person is not open to learning something new. They just want to test someone to see if they hold the same truth. Still, the scholar's question is an excellent question: "What must I do to inherit eternal life?" Jesus responds by asking him how the Law of Moses would answer the question. The scholar of the Law answers by quoting Deuteronomy need. 6:5 ("You shall love, the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your strength") and Leviticus 19:18 ("You shall love your neighbor as yourself"). Bingo! Correct-o-mundo! He came up with the correct answer and Jesus told him so. "Do this and you will live."

Sadly, the scholar of the Law is really not searching for the truth. "But because he wished to justify himself, he said to Jesus, 'And who is my neighbor?" The scholar believes that he is already righteous in the eyes of God and he wants to justify himself. People today do this all the time. They will say, "I am basically a good person... I do not need God, Jesus, the Church, the grace of the sacraments." The better response is to go before Jesus in humility and say, "I am a sinner, I cannot justify myself, I need the grace of God to make me righteous... Lord, I believe in you, now please tell me what I should do in order to walk in the ways that lead to eternal life."

It seems that the scholar of the Law was trying to place limits on who could be considered his neighbor. If he had to love his neighbor as himself then it would be best to only have a few neighbors—and they should be the neighbors that are easy to love.

Jesus did not take the bait. Instead, he responded with the beautiful parable of the Good Samaritan.

Jesus begins with a man who fell victim to robbers and was left for dead. The priest and the Levi went out of their way to avoid the man. The Good Samaritan takes care of the man. Instead of trying to define who is and




who is not one's neighbor, Jesus paints the picture of a man in need and asks which person WAS NEIGHBOR to the robbers victim. Never mind who is your neighbor, how are you going to be a neighbor to one who is obviously in need. To love your neighbor as yourself is to show mercy to one in need.

Who do you see in your daily life who is in need of mercy? They might not be as obvious as someone who is beaten and left for dead in the street. It might be a family member who is struggling and just needs someone to listen to them. It might be a kid at school who is alone and just needs a friendly smile and a kind word. It might be an elderly person who is homebound, feels lacking in purpose, and could use a visit.

We have our St. Mary St. Vincent DePaul Society who responds with mercy to friends in need of financial help. We have the local soup kitchen where we volunteer at. Check out website walkingwithmoms.com . This week take a look around you and ask yourself, "who is in need of mercy." That is your neighbor. Show them mercy and you will truly be living.







Answered by Fr. DiTomo

Question: "What is a priest's day like? Do you do your own grocery shopping and cooking. Do you have to clean the rectory?" (Typed by mom for her anonymous 10 year old.)

Thanks for the great question! One thing that I love about being a priest is that every day is a little different. There are certain things that we do every day. Some days have surprises (the phone rings in the middle of the night because someone needs a priest to come to the hospital). Our days include things like: offering the Holy Mass, hearing confessions, going out to the hospital to anoint the sick, bringing Holy Communion to homebound parishioners, visiting the nursing homes, giving educational presentations, celebrating funerals, visiting religious education classes, preparing couples for marriage, hanging out with the youth group, attending meetings for different ministries, meeting with parishioners who have questions about prayer or need counseling, blessing homes, preparing homilies, etc. We

also have to reply to emails, return phone calls, and meet with parish staff members. Our days can be quite busy. We each have a "day off" where we can relax. When we are not doing ministry, we are doing things other people do: exercise (Fr. Jerome swims and Fr Rico plays badminton), watch movies, hang out with friends and family, etc.

Yes, we priests at St. Mary do our own grocery shopping. On Tuesday and Saturday evenings a generous parishioner will drop off a meal for us through the St. Mary Priest Meal Ministry. We are so grateful for those meals! On the other evenings, we priests fend for ourselves. We usually cook for ourselves or, occasionally, go out to eat or have dinner with a parish family in their home. We all have busy schedules so the only day that we priests get together for a scheduled common meal is Saturday evening. We do not have to clean the rectory. We pay a parishioner to clean the rectory for us once every other week. Of course, we have to keep things tidy in between cleaning day. We also do our own laundry.

One of the best things about being a priest is that you get to see God at work in the lives of your people every day! To all young men reading this, you should think and pray about your vocation. Maybe the Lord is calling YOU to be a priest?

HAITI HIGHLIGHTS

THE CHAPELS OF ST. LOUIS PARISH

Fr. Emile, the pastor of our sister parish, has three outlying chapels in addition to



the main parish of St. Louis. The 3 outlying chapels are very old and were constructed with poor materials and are now beginning to present challenges in maintaining them especially being located so remote from any road. The chapels are each approximately 2-, 4-, and 6-hours walking distance from the main parish. Father visits them



throughout the year to say Mass; otherwise he has deacons that do a Sunday service and provide for the spiritual needs of the people. The chapels are also used as schools for the primary grades. Between the 3 chapels, there are over 400 children attending classes in the buildings.

St. Matthew chapel, which is approximately 3-4 hours walking or riding a mule, recently had several of the wood rafters rot through and are no longer supporting the roof. Father asked for our help in repairing the structure so the parishioners can safely attend services and the children attend school. We were able to send him the needed dollars to bring materials up the mountain and the local folks will do the labor.

Fr. Emile sends a message of gratitude and his prayers for our ongoing support of his mission along with the people of St. Matthew expressing their gratitude to all of us for the prayers, compassion and support we provide for them. Please continue to pray for our sister parish, and for peace, law, and order for the country of Haiti, so that we, and others of the world can continue our missions in helping God's children.

May the Lord continue to bless you for your charitable hearts.




