CONSIDER NATURAL FAMILY PLANNING

Why Natural Family Planning?

July 24-30 is Natural Family Planning Awareness Week. Through Natural Family Planning (NFP) a couple observes and charts certain physical signs that indicate whether the woman's body is in its infertile or fertile period.

Why is Natural Family Planning relevant to Catholic married couples? The Catholic Church teaches that "for just reasons, spouses may wish to space the birth of their children" (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 2368). A husband or wife might be experiencing a serious physical or mental health issue or some other external issue such as a desperate financial situation. These could constitute a just or grave reason to space the birth of children (see Pope St. Paul VI, Humane Vitae, 16). In discerning whether or not to space the birth of children spouses have the "duty to make certain that their desire is not motivated by selfishness but is in conformity with the generosity appropriate to responsible parenthood" (CCC, 2368). In cases where the spouses do have serious reasons to space births "the Church teaches that married people may take advantage of the natural cycles immanent in the reproductive system and engage in marital intercourse only during those times that are infertile" (Humane Vitae, 16).

What about artificial contraception?

Since the 1960s artificial contraception has become extremely popular. However, the Catholic Church teaches that "every action which, whether in anticipation of the conjugal act, or in its accomplishment, or in the development of its natural consequences, proposes, whether as an end or as a means, to render procreation impossible' is intrinsically evil" (CCC 2370, quoting Humanae Vitae, 14). A person might ask, "How are Natural Family Planning and the birth control pill really different since the intention is the same—to avoid pregnancy?" Natural Family Planning actually makes use of the natural cycle of fertility and infertility that God has designed for women. When a couple uses NFP they are simply making use of observation to know whether they are fertile or infertile and then they decide whether to engage in the marital act or abstain based on their readiness to receive the gift of new life. Artificial contraception, on the other hand, renders a woman sterile for as long as she takes it. The Church also teaches that the sexual act is designed to be an expression of the complete gift of self between a man and a woman. Through the sexual act a husband and a wife say to each other, "I give all of myself to you in a love that is free, faithful, fruitful, and total... I hold

nothing back from you (including my fertility)." If a couple is in an infertile period or even perpetually infertile, their conjugal love can still be spiritually fruitful as it unites them closer to each other. With artificial contraception, however, the sexual act becomes a lie (CCC 2370,



quoting Pope St. John Paul II, *Familiaris Consortio*, 32). Objectively speaking, the use of artificial contraception is a mortal sin (as is the use of condoms, pursuing male or female sterilization, etc).

When the Church reaffirmed the traditional teaching against contraception with the publication of Pope St. Paul VI's 1968 encyclical *Humanae Vitae*, many bishops and priests failed to adequately explain this teaching to the faithful. I have heard from many people that their parish priest told them: "Just follow your conscience." I am sorry that the Church did not do a better job equipping the Catholic faithful to live out this beautiful truth. However, we can always start anew!

Remain open to life

I think that being open to the gift of new life has to be one of the most challenging aspects of married life. Children are a tremendous blessing, but also a serious responsibility. However, the Lord rewards generous souls who trust him.

I want to personally thank all of those married couples who have practiced openness to life. They have done so in a culture that often judges and mocks large families. I also want to encourage married couples to remain open to life. Husband and wives: talk to each other about whether you can receive another child as a gift from God. One of the benefits of NFP is that it involves sacrifices on the part of both the husband and the wife (both need to abstain from sexual relations during the infertile times). NFP encourages both husbands and wives to know about the fertility cycle. While NFP is not easy, it is very effective and avoids other pitfalls involved in the use of contraception (side effects from chemicals, etc.). On page 14 of this bulletin you will see a list of instructors that can help you learn one of the NFP methods.

Cemetery Update

Dear St. Mary parishioners,

In the past I had informed you that we were entering into a contract to obtain land for the creation of a new cemetery for St. Mary. Unfortunately, we were not able to complete that transaction. **At this time I have to announce that we have no plans for a future cemetery**. I am sorry if this news comes as a disappointment to anyone.

I am aware that many people in our parish wish to make plans for their place of burial. The Huntley Cemetery (which borders St. Mary Cemetery) still has many grave spaces available. Many Catholics rightly desire to be buried in a consecrated space. As a reminder, when a Catholic is buried in a non-Catholic cemetery the grave (or columbarium niche) is blessed by the priest or deacon during the rite of committal. Thus, the space does become consecrated.

You may also wish to inquire into graves or columbaria at other local Catholic cemeteries (e.g. St. Charles Borromeo in Hampshire, Holy Apostles in McHenry).

will re-open at 7 months. His or her taste buds are now working. Nutrients consumed by his or her mother are passed on to him or her within an hour or two. Three hundred quarts of fluid a day are sent to the baby via the umbilical cord. Fine hair begins to grow on head, eyebrows and eyelashes. Facial expressions similar to parents of the baby can be seen at this time. This month REMS (rapid eye movements) have been recorded – a sign of dreaming. Your baby is now about 9 inches in length. MISSION APPEAL—ALL MASSES NEXT WEEKEND

Bishop James Thoppil from the Diocese of Kohima, Nagaland, India, will be with us next weekend, July 30th through the 31st for our annual Mission Appeal. He writes: "A good Church is a matter of pride and necessity for the small Catholic community in the villages of Nagaland specially in the context of vast majority of Baptists, who look down disparagingly on the small Catholic community. It gives them identity who despite many obstacles and struggles became Catholic and continue to remain Catholic.

The Church will be used like a multi-purpose hall. Besides celebrating the Holy Eucharist whenever the priest visits the community the church will also be used by various groups – women, youth, holy childhood association, Legion of Mary, etc. for their prayer meeting and gatherings. Presently there are about 156 villages with Catholic communities. Many of these communities do not have good Church.

Therefore the goal of my Mission appeal is to build a village Church of 60x30 square feet (or 600 square meters) with a small portico. The cost of the new church is about 32000 US \$, (20 dollars for one square feet build up area). In fact with previous year's mission appeal from the dioceses of St. Petersburg and Palm Beach in Florida, we built a Church for the Community in Moilan."

The Holy Face of Jesus Devotion

Jesus promised, among many other blessings, that honoring His Holy Face through this devotion offers:

• The **Conversion** of many sinners and mercy granted to their souls disfigured by sin, and,

• **Reparation** for outrages against the

Majesty of God – Communism, Atheism, cursing, desecration of Sundays and Holy Days and other grave insults.

The Holy Face devotion began when Jesus revealed Himself to Sister Mary of St. Peter, a French Carmelite, in 1845. In one of His many revelations to her, He said this of His Holy Face: **"Offer It unceasingly to My Father for the** salvation of your country."

Our own image of the Holy Face, which will be on display, has been pressed to the traveling relic of the Holy Face of Jesus, a relic verified by the Vatican as having been touched to Veronica's Veil, the True Wood of the Cross, and the spear that pierced Christ's side. This was a favorite devotion of St. Theresa, the Little Flower. She said that the suffering, wounded Face of her dear Jesus was the foundation of all her piety.

Question: What does it mean to be 'poor in spirit'? -Anonymous

Answer: The Old Testament often mentions that fidelity to God brings material

blessings (see, for example, Genesis 26:4-5, 12-13; Job 42:10 -17). One of the dangers of having material riches, however, is that one can easily fall into pride and forget one's need for God. For this reason, the Law includes this warning: *Beware lest you say in your heart, 'My power and the might of my hand have gotten me this wealth.' You shall remember the Lord your God, for it is he who gives you power to get wealth...* (Deuteronomy 8:17-18). To be poor is to know that

one has nothing except one's relationship with God. In Psalm 34 we pray: *This poor man cried, and the Lord heard him, and saved him out of all his troubles* (34:6). *The Lord is near to the brokenhearted, and saves the crushed in spirit* (34:18). The rich do not seem to need God if they have abundant land, flocks, servants, armies, and luxurious houses to meet their needs. The poor, on the other hand, *know* that they need God. They have to pray to God for a good harvest, for the health of their flock, for safety amidst storms, for protection from their enemies. The poor need to rely on God's providence. Their reliance on God

keeps them humble and trusting in God. Jesus taught a radical truth when he gave the Beatitudes in the Sermon on the Mount. While many Jews thought that the wealthy were blessed by God, Jesus said, "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven" (Matthew 5:3). Jesus even warned about how attachment to riches can prevent a person from following him and entering the Kingdom of God (Matthew 19:16-23). Even if a person does have material wealth, however, he or she can still be detached from material things and be "poor in spirit." To be poor in spirit means to be humble, relying on God as one's only true source of support. The poor in spirit are childlike in their trust in the Father.
