USE PASSING THINGS FOR ETERNAL GLORY

In today's Gospel (Luke 12:13-21) someone in the crowd tries to drag Jesus into a family squabble over money: 'Teacher, tell my brother to share the inheritance with me.' The request seems odd and petty. Apparently, people often tried to command Jesus to advocate for them in their personal conflicts possessions while still (recall last Sunday when Martha commanded Jesus to tell Mary to help her—Luke 10:40).

Jesus responds to inheritance dispute to teach the crowd about worldly possessions: 'Take care to guard against all greed, for though one be rich, one's life does not consist of possessions.' Jesus then tells a parable about a man who builds large barns to foundation, nothing is holy, bestow in abundance hold his bountiful harvest. He delighted in his riches and contented himself with a future where he could just kick back, "rest, east, drink, be merry!" Ironically, the man would die that night. His plan to experience joy through his material wealth all came to naught. As the old adage goes, "you cannot take it with you."

Our First readings from Ecclesiastes ponders the apparent futility of human labor: For what profit comes to man from all the toil and anxiety of heart with which he has labored under the sun? (Ecclesiastes 2:22). You work hard and you worry. When you died you leave everything to someone who has not worked for it. It seems absurd.

If we keep the God in the center of our lives, however, our daily work is not absurd. Our daily work has meaning and value. Hard work and toil was part of the punishment for the Original Sin (Genesis 3:17). However, our work takes on a new meaning when we do it work virtuously, sacrificing for those we love, serving our neighbor, and offering the day's work to God. In addition, most men and women work and save up money to give to pass on to their children and their grandchildren.

However, if a person forgets about God and allows material possessions to become the center of their life then such a person really is embarking on a life of futility. As our Lord reminds us: one's life does not consist of possessions.

In our second reading from the letter to the Colossians St. Paul exhorts us: If you were raised with Christ, seek what is above, where Christ is seated at the right hand of God. Think of what is above. not of what is on earth (Col 3:1-2). This, then is the great challenge. How do we value material keeping our gaze on heaven?



The opening (Collect) prayer from last Sunday's Mass is instructive: "O God, protector of those who hope in you, without whom nothing has firm your mercy upon us and grant that, with you as our ruler and guide, we may use the good things that pass in such a way as to hold fast even now to those that ever endure." Money, houses, cars, boats, vacations, meals are all good things that pass. We are called to make use of them in such a way that we are able to still prioritize those things that will endure: heaven, eternal life, love, etc.

A good question for us to ask ourselves: What does my life consist of? Where is my focus in life? Possessions? Money? Work? ... or is it love of God, love of neighbor, faith, prayer, hope in heaven? One of the best ways to use passing things for eternal glory is to use some of your money to support the Church or give alms to the poor. This weekend Bishop James Thoppil is visiting from the Diocese of Kohima, Nagaland, India. He is our missionary preacher for this year. Please be generous in offering something for his work among Catholics in India. Please continue to support the good work of our St. Vincent DePaul Society as they help our friends in need. Tithing is a way to not only support the Church, but also to keep greed in check. Remember, material blessings come from God. I am grateful for the generosity of the people of St. Mary! Let's keep it up!


MONTH FOUR-DEVELOPING BABY/ SPIRITUAL ADOPTION PROGRAM

Facial expressions similar to parents of the baby can be seen at this time. This month REMS (rapid eye movements) have been recorded – a sign of dreaming. Your baby is now about 9 inches in length. 

THE HOLY FACE OF IESUS DEVOTION

Jesus promised, among many other blessings, that honoring His Holy Face through this devotion offers:

- The **Conversion** of many sinners and mercy granted to their souls disfigured by sin, and,
- **Reparation** for outrages against the

Majesty of God – Communism, Atheism, cursing, desecration of Sundays and Holy Days and other grave insults.

The Holy Face devotion began when Jesus revealed Himself to Sister Mary of St. Peter, a French Carmelite, in 1845. In one of His many revelations to her, He said this of His Holy Face:

"Offer It unceasingly to My Father for the salvation of your country."

Our own image of the Holy Face, which will be on display, has been pressed to the traveling relic of the Holy Face of Jesus, a relic verified by the Vatican as having been touched to Veronica's Veil, the True Wood of the Cross, and the spear that pierced Christ's side.

This was a favorite devotion of St. Theresa, the Little Flower. She said that the suffering, wounded Face of her dear Jesus was the foundation of all her piety.

Question: Why when discussing birth control is the focus always on the woman and not also on the man? Why isn't the Church condemning or attempting to restrict the sale of condoms fervently as being done for birth control pills? -Anonymous

Thank you for your question. Keep in mind that when priests address topics, whether in homilies or bulletin letters, we cannot cover topics in an exhaustive fashion. Homilies and written articles have to be kept to a certain length. We cannot say everything or touch on every nuance that we would like to. You make a good point. Openness to life is a responsibility that should be equally shared between husband and wife. Actually, this is one of the benefits of Natural Family Planning. When a couple uses NFP the

husband plays an active role. He is aware of his wife's fertility cycle. In

addition, if a couple has discerned that they need to avoid coming together during the wife' fertile time then the husband has to also bear the sacrifice. He has to abstain just as his wife has to abstain. There is a greater share of sacrifice and communication with NFP. When a woman uses birth control pills she bears all of the responsibility and the side effects. Of course, men can be guilty of contracepting, as well. They could passively fail to communicate to their wife their desire to be open to life. They could actively pressure their wife to use artificial contraception. They could use condoms or practice withdrawal. Some men choose to sterilize themselves through a vasectomy. These methods of contraception are also gravely sinful (a vasectomy is a form of mutilation, damaging a healthy part of the human body). Of course, sometimes a husband and wife disagree on whether to be open to new life in their marriage. Sometimes this clash can cause great anguish on the part of one of the spouses. They should be encouraged to continue to pray and communicate with their spouse. They also might want to speak to a priest in order to receive counsel. I am not aware of current efforts by the Church in this country to restrict the sale of condoms or birth control. Rather, the Church asserts its right to teach on the morality of these practices for Catholics.
