

Twenty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time – September 5, 2021

Isaiah 35:4-7a. Psalm 146:7, 8-9, 9-10. James 2:1-5. Mark 7:31-37. Be Opened! Jesus heals a deaf and mute man today who immediately speaks plainly. Before the Baptism of adults and after that for babies and children, the Church imitates Jesus with the Ephphetha Rite [EF-fah-thah]. In opening the ears and mouth, we pray for the grace to hear the word of God and to profess it every day.

- To what right behavior do I turn a deaf ear, a closed mouth?
- What needs opening so I may hear the word of God?
- What needs opening so I may speak truth?





The Anointing of the Sick Sunday, September 12 at 8:30 am Mass

The opening instruction in this rite of the church, **Anointing of the Sick** reveals how the early church saw this sacrament. "Are there any who are sick among you? Let them send for the priests of the Church, and let the priest pray over them, anointing them with oil in the name of the Lord; and the prayer of faith will save the sick persons, and the Lord will raise them up; and if they have committed any sins, they will be forgiven them." In the early church this sacrament was just what it says, an anointing of the sick for health.

Through the centuries this sacrament became more a sacrament of the dying than of the living. It became an anointing to prepare FOR DEATH and was called Extreme Unction. It was part of the prayer called the Last Rites. Many of us who are a little older remember how important these "last rites" were for those about to die.

Thankfully, the reform of Vatican II researched the documents of the early church and this sacrament was returned to its rightful place as the Sacrament of the Sick.

Next Sunday, September 12 at 8:30 am Mass we will have the opportunity to receive this sacrament Anointing of the Sick. If you are suffering in any way: mind, body or spirit, facing surgery or experiencing the challenges of growing older, come and receive this sacrament of healing for encouragement, strength, and comfort.

If you, or a neighbor/friend would like to be anointed, please let them know of this Mass. Sometimes offering a ride to church is a real needed gift.

Choosing Deafness

If you're a parent, you know that hearing evaluations are usually done at a child's annual physical exam starting around age four. The little person gets hoisted up onto the exam table, fitted with a pair of special headphones, and then they need raise their hand when they hear a sound.

I bet all of us parents who have sat through one of these tests with a preschooler — especially a particularly strong-willed one — have experienced a moment where we ask ourselves: I wonder if there's something wrong with her hearing. Is that why she doesn't listen to me? 'Come here, put on your shoes, pick up your toys, finish your carrots, don't touch that' — she isn't being naughty, she just can't hear it!

And then that moment, for those of us whose kids passed the hearing test with flying colors, comes crashing down into a realization that, yep, they can hear just find. They're just choosing deafness.

But how can we really get mad when we remember that we do the same thing to God day in and day out? I often wonder if God, sitting in His Heaven, tires of calling to us in the same way young parents tire of calling out unheeded directions to their small children. Help that person. Hear My voice. Open your heart. Give of yourself here. Talk to Me.
