



#### Reflection for the Feast of The Holy Family-Year C

A Sunday school teacher asked her students to draw a picture of Jesus' family. After collecting the drawings, she noticed that one little boy's drawing depicted an airplane with four heads sticking out of the windows. "I see you drew three heads to show Joseph, Mary and Jesus," she said to the boy. "But who does the fourth head belong to?" The boy replied, "That's Pontius the pilot."

This weekend we celebrate the Feast of Holy Family: The family of Joseph, Mary, and Jesus. It is always easy to think that because we call this family holy, it was at the same time a perfect family. But, Unfortunately, my family looks nothing like that. So, I feel disappointed.

To be a real family, the family of Joseph, Mary, and Jesus had to have its struggles and difficulties. Let us begin with the conception narrative: "When his mother Mary was betrothed to Joseph, but before they lived together, she was found with child through the Holy Spirit. Joseph, her husband, since he was a righteous man, yet unwilling to expose her to shame, decided to divorce her quietly" (Matt 1: 18-19). First family problem. Joseph suspected that Mary could have been unfaithful. How did Mary feel about this? She was troubled. Another trial for the holy family came so soon. "While they were there (Bethlehem in Galilee), the time came for her to have her child, and she gave birth to her firstborn son. She wrapped him in swaddling clothes and laid him in a manger because there was no room for them in the inn" (Lk 2:6-7 NAB). Mary and Joseph were nervous because of the lack of space in the inn. In other words, the holy family had difficulties and their struggles.

In this weekend gospel, we see Jesus as a teenager. Although I am not trying to pick on teenagers, teenage children can bring some untold conflict to their families. Since "teen-age" comes with "expected" challenges, the teenagers in our families need special companionship. For example, Mary and Joseph struggled to understand and accompany Jesus. Such pain is evidenced in Mary's question to Jesus, "How could you have done this to us?" But Jesus responds, "Why were you looking for me. I was in my father's house."

The Feast of the Holy family brings us to one point. A family is a unit of lovers — a small unit where everybody practices their little virtue. This virtue may range from compassion to humility, gentleness, patience, forgiveness. The family is the domestic Church because it is the first place where we all learn the meaning of love and trust. No family is perfect. But every family is holy to the extent that it is a place of security, welcome, care, love, concern, and forgiveness, not in the absolute sense, but always open to renewal and purification. Perhaps the question for us this weekend is, how does our family support each other in times of stress and sadness?





## Donate from your IRA to SSPP Parish or other charities tax-free if over age 72

Annual withdrawals from traditional retirement accounts that accumulated tax-free are required after age 72. However, you can avoid income tax on a required withdrawal up to \$100,000 per year by donating directly to a qualifying charity. Charitable contributions must be made by December 31 and can only be made from IRAs (not a 401(k) or 403(b) unless rolled to an IRA). You don't need to itemize your taxes in order to make an IRA charitable distribution but cannot additionally claim a charitable contribution tax deduction. For a retiree in the 25 percent tax bracket, an IRA charitable contribution of \$5,000 could reduce your income tax bill by \$1,250. Funds must be transferred directly from the IRA to an eligible charity by the IRA trustee in order to qualify for the tax break. 
