





### **Reflection for the Feast of Epiphany**

A husband read an article to his wife about how women use 30,000 words a day to a man's 15,000. The wife replied, "That's because we have to repeat everything to men." The husband turned to his wife and said, "What?"

This weekend we celebrate the solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord. The word Epiphany means "manifestation" or "showing forth." Historically several moments in Christ's early life and ministry have been celebrated as "epiphanies," including his birth in Bethlehem, the visit of the Magi, his baptism by John, and his first miracle at Cana. Perhaps that is why Saint John Paul categorized most of these manifestations as a luminous mystery.

We can compare Epiphany to such expressions as eureka or aha. In other words, that which was hidden or not well known is now revealed. In the epiphany story, the Magi occupies a significant place. The Magi are presented to us as the people through whom the mission of Christ is revealed.

We know little about the personalities of the Magi. Nevertheless, what we know about them is enough to indicate who Jesus is. The Magi came from the East to Bethlehem. They followed the guidance of the star. Therefore, they were likely astrologers who understood the movement of the stars. The Gospel does not say precisely how many Magi paid homage to Jesus. Instead, we assume them to be three based upon naming their three gifts: Myrrh, Frankincense, and Gold. Gold symbolized the kingship of Christ, Frankincense represented the divinity and the eternal priesthood of Christ, and Myrrh, which was used to prepare the dead for burial, symbolized the saving death of Jesus Christ. These gifts revealed the true mission of Christ as a Priest, Prophet and King.

It is noteworthy that the Magi were willing to follow the star to an unknown territory. The journey took them outside their country and their comfort zone. Additionally, they risked the consequences of disobeying Herod, who had told them to come by his place after they found the king. They were truly wise because they knew and interpreted divine signs and understood the dubious intention of Herod. To where does our star lead us? How do we interpret our daily experiences?



# 2022 Epiphany Blessing of the Home



Epiphany means manifestation, or the appearance of Jesus. Besides the manifestation of Jesus to the magi, there are two other epiphanies: the Baptism of the Lord in the River Jordan and Jesus' appearance at the Wedding Feast of Cana. The significance of this day is not just the arrival of the magi but also the coming of Gentiles to adore the newborn King of the Jews. The event recognizes Jesus' lordship over the entire world.

Many traditions have evolved about the magi. They are called kings, astrologers, and wise men. The Bible says there were three gifts, but never says how many magi brought them or what their gender was. Nonetheless, European tradition claims there were three and even ascribed them the names of Melchior, Balthasar and Caspar. In iconography, one is often depicted with dark skin. Their remains are said to rest in an elaborate reliquary in Cologne.

One fitting tradition associated with this feast is the Epiphany Blessing of Homes. A piece of chalk is used to mark  $2\mathbf{0} + \mathbf{C} + \mathbf{M} + \mathbf{B} + 2\mathbf{2}$  over the doorways of the home. The numerals consecrate the new year. The initials remind us of the legendary names of the magi, Caspar, Melchior and Balthasar, and also represent the Latin motto: *Christus mansionem benedicat* ("May Christ bless the house"). Throughout the year those who come and go through that door will enjoy the blessing of Christ.

## **Blessing**

Leader:

Lord God of heaven and earth, You revealed your onlybegotten Son to every nation by the guidance of a star. Bless this house and all who dwell in it.

Fill us with the light of Christ, that our concern for others may reflect your love.

We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.

The leader then writes with chalk atop the door or doorframe the inscription:  $\mathbf{20} + \mathbf{C} + \mathbf{M} + \mathbf{B} + \mathbf{22}$


