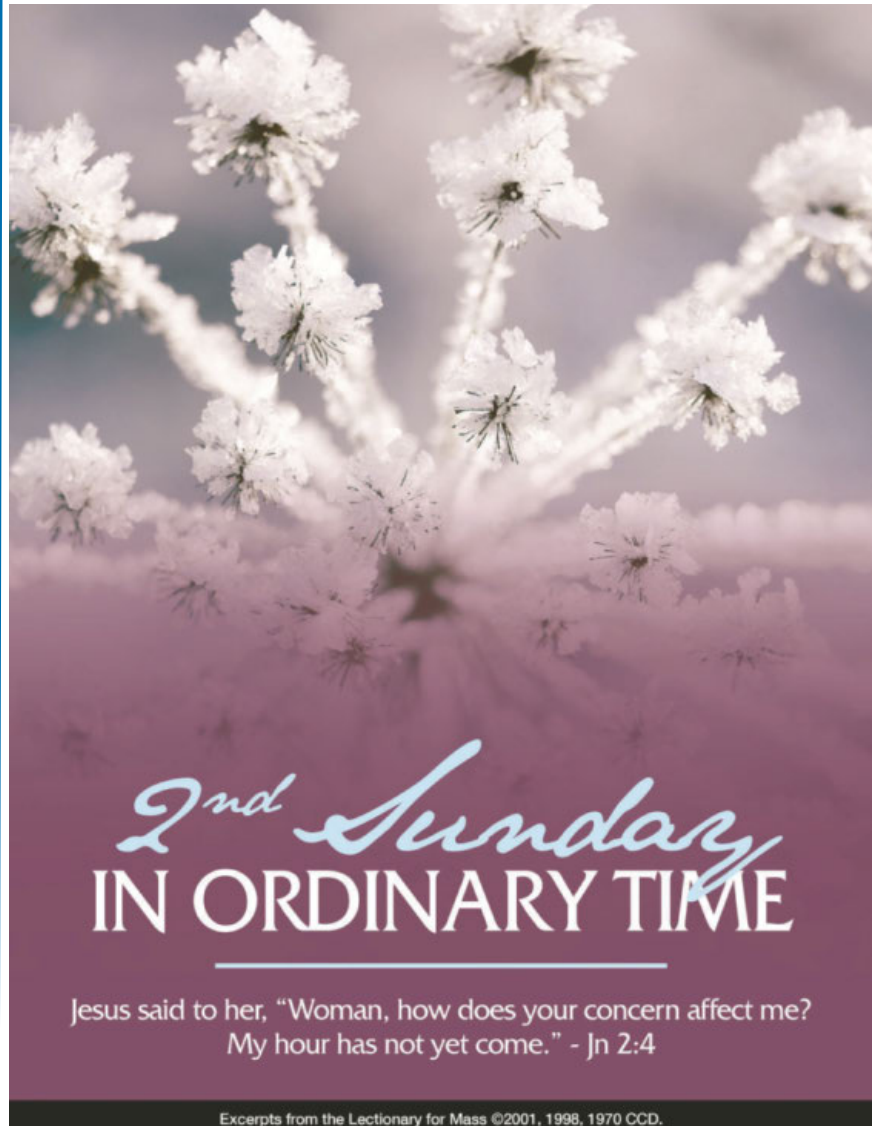

Intro to the Liturgy of the Day

January is not a common month for weddings in this country. Nevertheless, a wedding is at the center of today's Gospel. It is at this wedding feast that Jesus performs his first miracle, changing water into wine. Though we are not here today to celebrate a wedding, today's celebration includes both feast and miracle, ones we often take for granted. Let us consider the miracle that takes place in our presence today—the bread and wine becoming Christ's Body and Blood—and give thanks for the invitation we have been given to this Eucharistic feast.

Father Linus Umoren, C.M.

Reflection for the Second Sunday in Ordinary Time— Year C

A priest is driving down to New York and he's stopped in Connecticut for speeding. The state trooper smells alcohol on his breath and then he sees an empty wine bottle on the floor, and he says, "Sir, have you been drinking?" The priest says, "Just water." The sheriff says, "Then why do I smell wine?" And the priest looks down at the bottle and says, "Good Lord, He's done it again!" He has turned water into wine again."

We have just finished the Christmas season. At Christmas, we read and lived through the experience of the Word becoming flesh. Then, as the word lives among us, we shift our liturgical attention to "Ordinary Time."

This weekend we read the story of the first miracle of Jesus in the gospel of John "There was a wedding at Cana in Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus and his disciples also went to the wedding. When the wine ran short, the mother of Jesus said to him, "They have no wine" (2:1-11NAB). We cannot tell whose wedding this was. But Mary seems to be a stakeholder at the wedding.

Jesus' first miracle took place following Mary's appeal. Mary believed that her son could be of help. Though it is not clear what type of intervention she expected from her son, we witness a confident mother's reference to her son, "Do whatever he tells you." The miracle took place at the beginning of Jesus' public ministry.

We do not know how this miracle happened. Did Jesus pray over the water? Did he announce in a loud voice saying, "everybody should watch this?" All we can understand from the narrative is that "Jesus told them, "Fill the jars with water." So they filled them to the brim. Then he told them, "Draw some out now and take it to the headwaiter." So they took it. And when the headwaiter tasted the water, it had become wine.

This miracle seems to have taken place in silence, and his disciples' reaction was that of disbelief. Jesus revealed his glory through the miracle in Cana and silently defined the goal of his coming, and the meaning of the Word made flesh. By Jesus' presence at the marriage at Cana, the Church privileges it to underscore the innate goodness of marriage where Christ is always present to provide for the couple.

There are many miracles of God's grace that we experience daily. There are also great things that happen in our life through Mary's intercession. Most of these happen silently and are hardly noticeable. If only we strive to do whatever He tells us.

Insights for this weekend's readings
Second Sunday in Ordinary Time
January 16, 2022

Isaiah 62:1-5. Psalm 96:1-2, 2-3, 7-8, 9-10.
1 Corinthians 12:4-11. John 2:1-11.

Believing Signs. At first glance, these readings lead us to bride and groom, gifts, and marriage. But there are important things underneath, important truths at the heart of these proclamations. God has not and will not abandon us (Isaiah). Charisms, that is, gifts of the Spirit, are given to everyone to use for the common good, not just one's own good (Corinthians). The miracle of water to wine is the first of many signs of the Messiah, the Christ (John).

God's signs and good activity are everywhere.

- ◆ What evidence do I have that God is with us still?
- ◆ What gifts that I have, given by the Spirit, will I put to use for the good of another?
- ◆ Christ is active all the time. What little and big signs of this goodness can I be part of? What signs will I rejoice in?
