



Intro to the Liturgy of the Day

We gather together today to worship the Lord, as faithful people have done throughout history. Two noteworthy examples are described in our readings. When Ezra the priest read the Torah in the streets of Jerusalem after the Jewish people had returned from exile, it brought people to tears. Reflection for the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time— Year C

A child asked his father, "How were people born?" So his father said, "Adam and Eve made babies, then their babies became adults and made babies, and so on." The child then went to his mother, asked her the same question and she told him, "We were monkeys then we evolved to become like we are now." The child ran back to his father and said, "You lied to me!" His father replied, "No, your mom was talking about her side of the family."

The gospel of Luke which we read this weekend describes one of the liturgical practices of the Jews. It is Sabbath and people go to the synagogue to pray and to hear the reading from the Torah and the book of the Prophets. The Rabbi read and explained the words of the scripture. Whoever reads the second text would usually do the explanation or sermon on the text. In the context that we read this weekend, Jesus a young Rabbi does the reading. And people are willing to hear the word of God. So, Jesus takes the opportunity to launch his message. The chosen text is from the prophet Isaiah: "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me ... He has anointed me to bring good news to the poor, to proclaim liberty to captives and new sight to the blind; to free the oppressed and to announce the Lord's year of mercy." Interestingly, Jesus proclaims that the text is fulfilled in their hearing because he (Jesus) is the primary "minister of the divine favor." Christians believe that through Jesus Christ, God's promise to destroy the evils of the world, to eradicate injustice, hatred and oppression has already begun. We believe that God has not only promised to do it but he is doing it right now in our time.

Third Sunday in Ordinary Time
January 23, 2022

Isaiah 62:1-5. Psalm 96:1-2, 2-3, 7-8, 9-10. 1Corinthians 12:4-11. John 2:1-11.

We devote this day to the celebration, study, and spread of the Word of God.

Nehemiah 8:2-4a, 5-6, 8-10. Psalm 19:8, 9, 10, 15. 1 Corinthians 12:12-30. Luke 1:1-4; 4:14-21.

Believing the Word of God. We are the Body of Christ (Corinthians) assembling as the graced community of believers (Nehemiah) each week to give thanks and praise, to share in Communion, and then sent to serve. We are part of the great Communion of Saints to whom is handed down the living Word of God – both the Scriptures and the Tradition as well as the very person of Christ who is the spoken Word of God (Luke). During the first Mass in a brand-new church building, the bishop shows the *Lectionary* to the assembly and says:

World Marriage Day



The document The Mystery of the Eucharist in the Life of the Church was approved by the full body of the USCCB and has been published, here is a link to the document - https://www.usccb.org/resources/mysteryeucharist-life-church I have not finished reading it vet but plan to in the coming weeks and I encourage you to read it too. The USCCB also put the wheels in motion for the National Eucharistic Revival set to officially launch on Corpus Christi Sunday in 2022 with activities in 2022, 2023, and the National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis in July 2024, with both in-person and virtual dimensions, which aims to form and send forth more than 80,000 Eucharistic missionaries. Stay tuned for more on the National Eucharistic Revival in the coming months. 


