

Reflection for the Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time- Year C

A nun caught three kids stealing from the convent's cherry tree. "Do you know what the Bible says about thieves?" she asked furiously. Sure ma'am," one of the boys answered, "Today you will be with me in Paradise."

Naturally, people like kind-hearted, positive, and affirming people. We all love people to affirm us for what we have achieved. However, I am unsure how welcoming it feels when people confront us about what we did not do very well. For example, when our parents, bosses, teachers, friends, or someone reprimands us, it could be difficult to accept because we don't like the discomfort and depletion it provokes.

Jesus' ministry attracted many people as long as he made them feel good. As Luke describes it in this week's gospel reading, they "were amazed at the gracious words that came from his mouth."

But things changed when Jesus began to challenge their ideals and convictions. He said to them, "Indeed, I tell you there were many widows in Israel in the days of Elijah when the sky was closed for three and a half years, and a severe famine spread over the entire land. It was to none of these that Elijah was sent, but only to a widow in Zarephath in the land of Sidon. Again, there were many lepers in Israel during the time of Elisha the prophet; yet not one of them was cleansed, but only Naaman the Syrian" (Luke 4: 25 NAB). How daring is Jesus to take "the children's food and throw to the dog?" This reference to the widow at Zarephath and Naaman did not sit well with Jesus' audience because he ascribes salvation to non-Jews. He made the Jews feel uncomfortable in their comfort zones.

I think the same happens in our time. When we hear kind words about us, we are attracted to the speaker. That is how politics work. But when words strike our consciences, we disown the speaker and the words. We become troubled. Some people choose a church where they can experience entertainment with excellent and comfortable (not comforting) words. How can we welcome the word of God when it does not conform to our liberal or conservative schemes?
