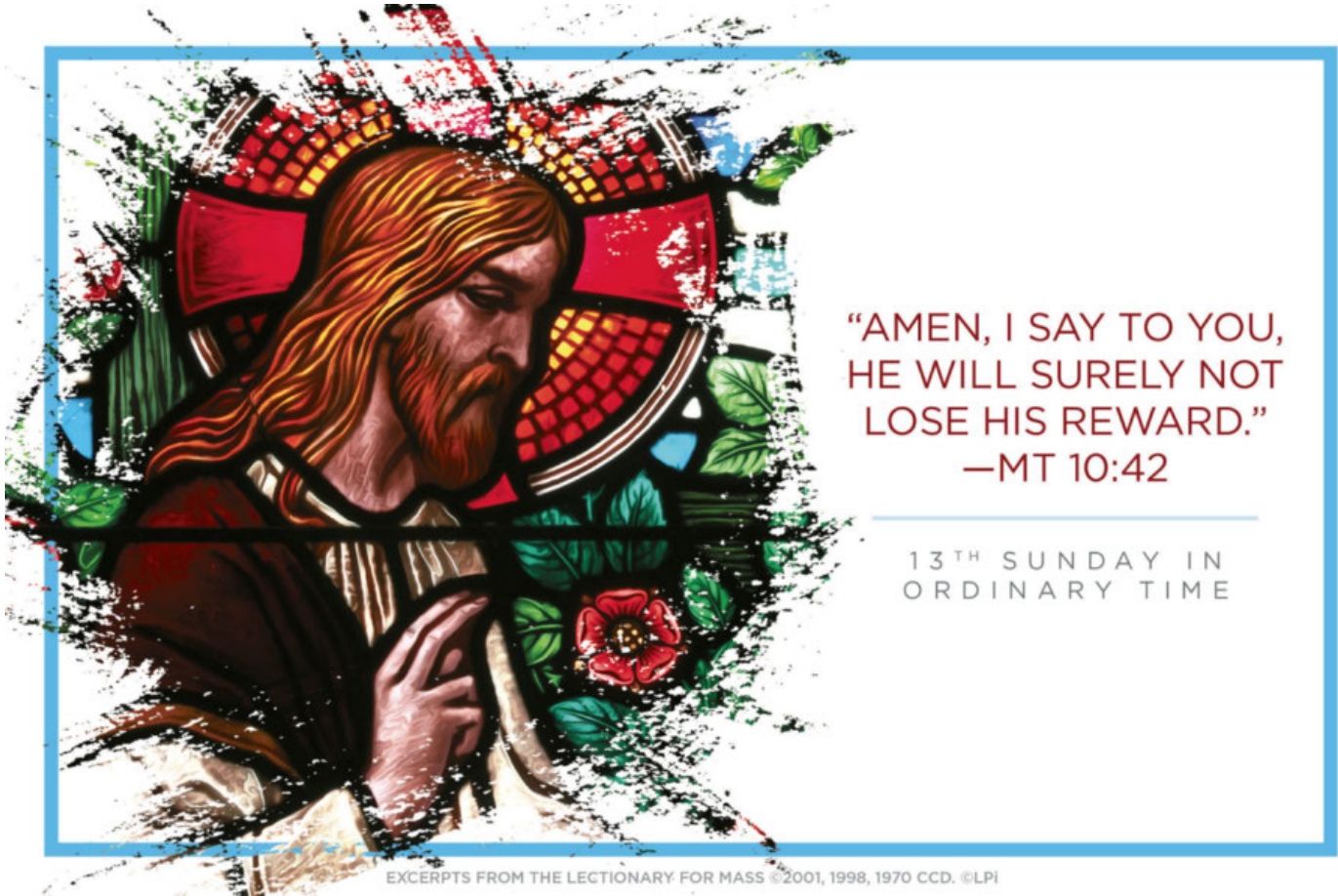

INDEPENDENCE DAY

On July 4, 1776, the Continental Congress meeting in Philadelphia courageously declared the thirteen colonies independent from Great Britain. Today, 247 years later, we celebrate this declaration. With our fellow Americans, we celebrate our freedom on this Independence Day, the Fourth of July. As Catholics, we especially pray for religious liberty today and the days ahead, as we experience and live through the many outside influences trying to take that liberty away.

Many of the colonists who came to America in the 17th and 18th centuries were fleeing religious persecution. As the successors of our immigrant forefathers, amazingly we still are.

By the time of the American Revolution, the number of Catholics in the thirteen colonies was rather small: about 25,000 among 2.5 million colonists. For over a century, the small body of Catholics in the thirteen colonies clung to their religious faith despite active persecution and denial of their civil rights. They supported the American Revolution with the hope independence from Britain would bring them greater religious liberty in the new republic. It did to a degree. Our Constitution which followed, cemented our inalienable rights, but again it appears only to a degree.

The First Amendment allowed Catholics the freedom to practice their faith, yet did not eradicate the cultural anti-Catholicism that persisted, and is alive today.

On this Independence Day, as we pray for the protection of religious freedom in our nation, let us also remember in prayer the millions of our brothers and sisters throughout the world who are persecuted and suffer injustices because of their faith. Not only are so many denied the right to live their faith or to worship, so many Christians and other minorities, innocent individuals and communities, are subjected to barbaric acts of violence, evicted from their homes and native lands, or sold as slaves. Some are killed, or brutally tortured. It is a great sacrilege that this evil is being done in the name of God. We are living in a new age of Christian martyrdom. May these present-day martyrs inspire us by their faith and courage! Their suffering and death was not in vain: their lives bear eloquent witness to the love of Jesus Christ.

Today's celebrations alone do not end our prayers and efforts on behalf of religious liberty. May God who gave us life and liberty, bless us, our nation, and the world with renewed determination to protect these cherished gifts!

BUDGET FOR FISCAL YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 2023-24

The parish budget for the fiscal year July 1, 2023 through June 30, 2024 was submitted to the Archdiocese on 04/27/23. Overall, it's a balanced budget with a cash surplus of \$42,000. Total income and contributions are forecast to be about \$950,000 for next fiscal year. This is down \$100,000 from the current year mostly due to having received a large single donation in 2022-23 which is not expected to be repeated. The budget calls for weekly collections to remain comparable to this year but includes higher receipts from new fundraising activities and campaigns.

Operating expenses are expected to increase next year by \$71,000 which is 11% more than this year's budget. Inflation has increased parish costs specifically relating to utilities, building maintenance supplies, and casualty, liability and property insurance. The parish is also investing more money in new church activities, programs, communications, liturgies and music. Competitive salary increases are projected for staff and clergy.

Though we no longer have an active day school, costs continue to be incurred to maintain the school facilities. Next year's spending of \$47,000 is slightly higher than both this year's budget and last year's actual expenditures.

Religious education programs are a focal point of the parish's ministries. Costs associated with these programs will increase 8% over this year's budget.

The parish welcomed Jenny Drzewiecki to the parish staff as its Ministry and Communications Director. Jenny started in this newly created position on March 1st of this year.

The parish expects to spend \$130,000 on capital expenditures next year. This amount is an estimate based on previous expenditures. Aging mechanicals and possible roof repairs are major concerns.

Reimbursements from the Archdiocese's Love One Another campaign are expected to pay for these expenses.

THE CALL AND CHALLENGE

In today's Gospel Jesus says we must love him more than we love our parents or our children. He doesn't stop there. He also says we must take up our cross. The first three verses of the Gospel ends with a 3rd challenge:

"Whoever finds his life will lose it, and whoever loses his life for my sake will find it.

This is a lot to take in. Seems to be too much of a challenge. I find myself equivocating. I think maybe the love Jesus is a different kind of love than my love of my parents and children. For example, if I am asked which child of mine do I love the most my answer is of course I love them equally. My love may be expressed in different ways according to how I think they need my love. I know Jesus says He comes first.

Next there is the challenge to take up my cross. Most of us have heard we should not complain about the pain of our illness or the aches and pains of our aging body. We are told dealing with the pain is one of our crosses in life. Yet of course nothing compares to Jesus's Cross. He volunteered for His Cross.

I look further for explanations that make these challenges by Jesus easier to accept. The daily Mass readings I find in my daily prayer book. Often I look for more understanding of the verses in my Bible. There is not a footnote for the first verse about loving Jesus more than family. The second verse has a footnote that this is Matthew's first mention of the cross. It is obvious Jesus is saying it is the disciples cross but in saying "and follow after me" is a first hint Jesus has a Cross too..

The third verse about losing our life for Jesus sake had this footnote:

"One who denies Jesus in order to save one's earthly life will be condemned to everlasting destruction; loss of earthly life for Jesus' sake will be rewarded by everlasting life in the kingdom." footnote for [Matt 10:39]

There is no escaping how serious this teaching is. Odds are I will never be challenged to give my life to deny Jesus and God. It is amazing to me how many saints still put themselves in situations where they knew they may give their lives!

Three verses preceded today's Gospel:

"Do not think that I have come to bring peace upon the earth. I have come to bring not peace but the sword. For I have come to set a man against his father, a daughters against her mother, and a daughter-in-law against her mother-in-law; and one's enemies will be those of his household."

[Matt 10:34-36]

Reading more than just the Sunday readings can bring more understanding and context. Jesus message is serious, hard and saving!

Thiên Chúa có chỗ đứng nào trong cuộc đời chúng ta?

Đọc lại Kinh Thánh chúng ta thấy ngày xưa dân Do Thái rất nhiều lần đã quì gối thờ lạy con bò vàng. Họ chọn con bò vàng làm thần tượng thay cho Thiên Chúa. Còn ngày hôm nay, nhiều người trong chúng ta cũng đã chọn làm thần tượng cho mình. Con bò vàng ngự trị trong thẳm sâu cõi lòng họ là tiền tài, là danh vọng, là lạc thú... Còn chúng ta thì sao? Mang danh hiệu là Kitô hữu, rất nhiều lần chúng ta đã tuyên xưng đức tin, đã chọn lựa Đức Kitô và đã dành cho Ngài địa vị số một trong cuộc sống của chúng ta. Chúng ta liên tục thực hiện khẩu hiệu sau đây:

– Thiên Chúa là thứ nhất, tha nhân là thứ hai, còn tôi là thứ ba.

De Leo là một quân nhân Hoa Kỳ, sau khi từ giã chiến trường Việt Nam trở về, anh kiếm được một chân canh giữ tượng nữ thần tự do ở Nữ Ước. Công việc của anh là chăm sóc cho ngọn đuốc trong tay và chiếc mũ triều thiên trên đầu bức tượng. Anh phải làm thế nào cho ngọn đuốc luôn cháy, những khung cửa sổ bằng kính nơi ngọn đuốc và mũ triều thiên lúc nào cũng sạch sẽ. Chỉ vào ngọn đuốc, anh hãnh diện nói:

– Đó là ngôi nhà nguyện của tôi. Tôi dâng hiến nó cho Chúa và tôi thường lên đó để cầu nguyện vào những lúc rảnh rỗi.

Đối với anh, Thiên Chúa là thứ nhất.

Tuy nhiên, anh còn làm được nhiều việc khác nữa. Hội Hồng thập tự đã cấp giấy khen cho anh sau khi anh hiến nửa lít máu lần thứ sáu mươi năm. Khi hay biết những công việc bác ái Mẹ Têrêsa đang làm bên Ấn Độ, anh đã gửi tặng Mẹ 12.000 đô la, ngoài ra anh còn bảo trợ cho sáu em bé mồ côi, thông qua các tổ chức từ thiện.

Và như thế, đối với anh, tha nhân là thứ hai.

Riêng bản thân anh thì như thế nào? Chính anh đã nói với phóng viên tờ Los Angeles Times như sau:

– Tôi chẳng giàu xã hội tính, cũng chẳng bận áo quần hợp thời trang, nhưng tôi có được tính khôi hài. Tuy nhiên vấn đề là tôi không có đủ tiền để cưới vợ, và cũng chả giữ lại được đồng nào làm của riêng.

Và như thế đối với anh, bản thân mình là thứ ba.

Lúc đầu mọi người đều nhìn anh bằng cặp mắt nghi ngờ và họ mỉm cười, nhưng giờ đây thì tất cả đều nhìn nhận anh một cách nghiêm chỉnh và anh thực xứng đáng với danh hiệu là người giữ ngọn lửa của nữ thần tự do. Với chúng ta cũng vậy. Chúng ta phải đặt Chúa vào địa vị, vào chỗ đứng số một, đồng thời phải cố gắng thực thi sự lựa chọn ấy suốt dọc cuộc đời của mình. Như trái đất xoay quanh mặt trời thế nào, thì mọi tư tưởng, mọi lời nói và mọi việc làm của chúng ta cũng phải xoay quanh Đức Kitô như vậy, để rồi chúng ta có thể nói lên như thánh Phaolô:

– Tôi sống, những không còn là tôi sống, mà là chính Đức Kitô sống trong tôi.

Nói cách khác, Đức Kitô chính là thần tượng số một của lòng chúng ta.

Có như vậy thì trong ngày sau hết, chúng ta mới được Ngài đón nhận vào quê hương nước trời.
