## From the Pastors Desk.....

I recently watched a video of a conversation between Bishop Robert Barron and Alex O'Connor on a YouTube link sent to me from Bishop Barron's **Word On Fire Institute** (the link is provided above). O'Connor identifies himself as a "Cosmic Skeptic," a kind of atheist or agnostic not yet convinced on the notion of God. In the hour-long exchange moderated by the host of the show "The Big Conversation," the two wade into the deep waters of varied philosophical ideas on God's nature and His existence, pro and con. It is a lively and thought provoking watch. I encourage you to take a look.

Early on in the debate, Bishop Barron rightly points out the inherent difficulty in any attempt to describe God. God is forever beyond any attempt of definition or explanation. Citing some of the big-hitters of classical Catholic philosophy (Augustine, Aquinas, and Ignatius of Loyola), Barron reminds the audience that we are forever at a horizon when encountering God. Loyola's "God is always more-'*Deus semper maior*', and Augustine's "If you comprehend God, you do not know God-'*Si comprehendis, non est Deus*'", nicely frame the impossible challenge. It seems as if we will never arrive at our destination. Deep waters, indeed!

Of course, as believers in the great mysteries of Christian faith-Incarnation, Resurrection, and the Trinity, to name a few-we know that with Jesus we have the promise of knowing God and being one with Him through our baptism into the Body of Christ. The infinite horizon or the great chasm between our human journey and eternal joy is bridged as we allow Jesus into our hearts and we walk anew with our Risen Lord and His Kingdom of Heaven.

Easter celebrates resurrection and new life. Our Pascal time of 50 days ends at Pentecost, where we embrace the gift of our new journey with Jesus. We renew our commitment to serving our Lord when we remember how all the Church's ministries were born when the fullness of the Holy Spirit descended upon the Apostles as Jesus Ascended into Heaven. As vital and vibrant disciples of Christ, we as parish take possession of our part of the journey to organize and exercise our ministries in service to the Gospel. We, the Catholic Community of Our Lady of the Holy Family, have an opportunity to share this Good News with our entire neighborhood. Still, we will need the cooperation of all in how we direct our time, treasure, and talent to Jesus and His mission.

Together with our parish pastoral staff, Parish Pastoral Council, and Finance Committee, I'm happy to announce that we have made progress on our ambitious agenda, establishing a solid foundation for our newly created and recently named parish. Here is a list of some of the items we will unveil during the Easter Season.

- Our new Omnidirectional Video Camera and updated Sound System in Church will be installed, allowing us to share our Sunday Mass celebrations with our friends unable to attend in person.
- Our Garden Chapel, adorned with new landscaping, five statues, and a marble altar (hopefully) will be ready for use by mid-May
- Our Finance Committee will present both our parish budget for the next fiscal year and a financial report for our current year by the end of May.
- Our Committee of the Catholic Works of Mercy will open our parish Food Pantry within the next few weeks.
- All of our Liturgical ministries can begin the process to safely return to active service in cooperation with the larger Archdiocese and Medical/Health experts within our local government.
- First Communion and Confirmations will be celebrated before Pentecost.

These works of faith can only be realized through your prayer and committed help. I ask every parishioner and member of our community to honestly discern how you will be able to join in our labor of love and evangelization. Each of the committees of our Parish Pastoral Council will host informational sessions to assist in your discernment. Let us all trust in the Holy Spirit. She will move our hearts to where they need to be.

Hace poco vi un vídeo de una conversación entre el obispo Robert Barrón y Alex O'Connor en un enlace de YouTube que me enviaron desde el Instituto Word On Fire del obispo Barrón (el enlace está arriba). O'Connor se identifica como un "escéptico cósmico", una especie de ateo o agnóstico que aún no está convencido de la noción de Dios. En el intercambio de una hora de duración, moderado por el presentador del programa "The Big Conversation", ambos se adentran en las profundas aguas de las variadas ideas filosóficas sobre la naturaleza de Dios y su existencia, a favor y en contra. Es un espectáculo animado y estimulante. Le animo a que lo vea.

Al principio del debate, el obispo Barrón señala con razón la dificultad inherente a cualquier intento de describir a Dios. Dios está siempre más allá de cualquier intento de definición o explicación. Citando a algunos de los grandes de la filosofía católica clásica (Agustín, Aquino e Ignacio de Loyola), Barrón recuerda a la audiencia que siempre estamos en un horizonte cuando nos encontramos con Dios. La frase de Loyola "Dios es siempre más-'*Deus semper maior*', y la de Agustín "Si comprendes a Dios, no conoces a Dios-'*Si comprehendis, non est Deus*'", enmarcan muy bien el desafío imposible. Parece que nunca llegaremos a nuestro destino. ¡Aguas profundas, ciertamente!

Por supuesto, como creyentes en los grandes misterios de la fe cristiana -la Encarnación, la Resurrección y la Trinidad, por nombrar algunos- sabemos que con Jesús tenemos la promesa de conocer a Dios y ser uno con Él a través de nuestro bautismo en el Cuerpo de Cristo. El horizonte infinito o el gran abismo entre nuestro viaje humano y la alegría eterna se salva cuando permitimos que Jesús entre en nuestros corazones y caminamos de nuevo con nuestro Señor Resucitado y su Reino de los Cielos.

La Pascua celebra la resurrección y la nueva vida. Nuestro tiempo pascual de 50 días termina en Pentecostés, donde abrazamos el regalo de nuestro nuevo viaje con Jesús. Renovamos nuestro compromiso de servir a nuestro Señor cuando recordamos cómo todos los ministerios de la Iglesia nacieron cuando la plenitud del Espíritu Santo descendió sobre los Apóstoles cuando Jesús ascendió al cielo. Como discípulos vitales y vibrantes de Cristo, como parroquia tomamos posesión de nuestra parte del camino para organizar y ejercer nuestros ministerios al servicio del Evangelio. Nosotros, la Comunidad Católica de Nuestra Señora de la Sagrada Familia, tenemos la oportunidad de compartir esta Buena Noticia con todo nuestro vecindario. Sin embargo, necesitaremos la cooperación de todos en la forma de dirigir nuestro tiempo, tesoro y talento a Jesús y su misión. Junto con nuestro personal pastoral parroquial, el Consejo Pastoral Parroquial y el Comité de Finanzas, me complace anunciar que hemos avanzado en nuestra ambiciosa agenda, estableciendo una base sólida para nuestra recién creada y recientemente nombrada parroquia. He aquí una lista de algunos de los elementos que desvelaremos durante la temporada de Pascua.

- Se instalará nuestra nueva cámara de vídeo omnidireccional y un sistema de sonido actualizado en la iglesia, lo que nos permitirá compartir nuestras celebraciones de la misa dominical con nuestros amigos que no puedan asistir en persona.
- Nuestra Capilla del Jardín, adornada con nuevos jardines, cinco estatuas y un altar de mármol (con suerte) estará lista para su uso a mediados de mayo.
