

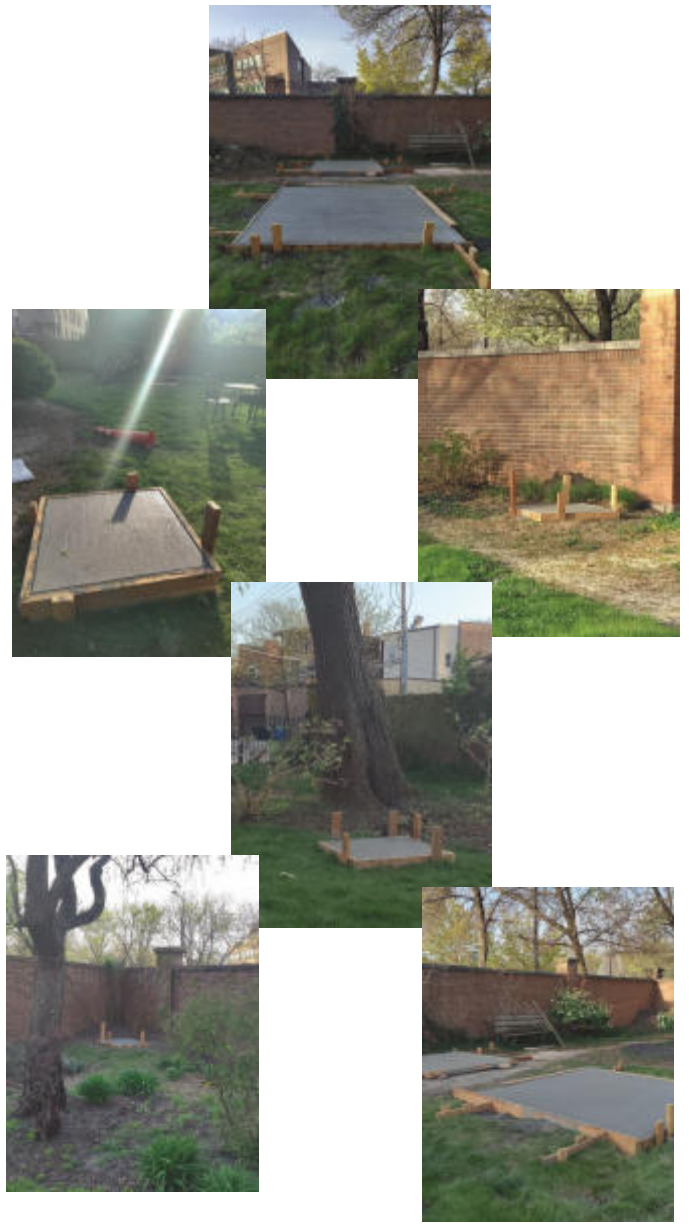

## From the Pastors Desk.....

We are closing in on the end of our first Pastoral Year as a newly formed and named parish. Our Archdiocese created the Catholic community of Our Lady of the Holy Family to serve the religious, spiritual, and sacramental needs of all our parishioners. She is also charged with directing all of the parish's resources, ministries, and celebrations in service of our call to Evangelization. The invitation and challenge to become vital and vibrant disciples of our Lord Jesus Christ is an honor and a blessing.

During the Pastoral Year of 2021-2021 we've accomplished several essential tasks, many of which were not announced adequately due to the many limitations to help keep us all safe and healthy during the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic. Our parish has a pastoral team of professional ministers in our offices, our liturgies, and our ministries. Our newly formed Parish Pastoral Council and Finance Committee are poised to embrace their leadership roles within our community. We have learned and will continue to learn how to use the wonders of modern technology in our celebrations and evangelization efforts. Our website, new omnidirectional camera, an upgraded sound system will expand our ability to welcome our sisters and brothers back to the beautiful practice of our Catholic faith.

I've used the insights of Fr. Ronald Rolheiser as a kind of template in organizing our work and ministry. In his book, "The Holy Longing," he speaks to what he calls the "Non-negotiable Essentials" for anyone who claims to be a Catholic Christian. There are four: 1) Personal Morality; 2) Private Prayer and Prayer within and Ecclesial Community; 3) Concern for and Involvement in Social Justice; and a Mellow Heart." These are expressions that attempt to capture the truth and mystery of our faith: how we welcome Christ into our hearts, minds, and souls, and how we are Jesus to those we live with and with those whom we encounter on our journey.

These Non-negotiables manifest in many ways. I'm thrilled to present to our community two new ministries within our parish. They capture the spirit of New Evangelization and the Non-negotiables of Catholic Christian Identity: Our Parish "Food Pantry" and our "Summer Sunday Evening Garden Mass."

In the 25<sup>th</sup> chapter of St. Matthew's gospel, Jesus uses the image of the "Final Judgement" that challenges anyone who claims the title, "Christian." To paraphrase, "*When I was hungry, you gave me food. Thirsty, you gave me a drink. Naked, you gave me clothes, and when I was sick or imprisoned, you visited me.*" Our Corporal/Spiritual Works of Mercy committee is finalizing the last

details with the Greater Chicago Food Depository. Very soon, we will be in the position to put into practice one of the essential, nonnegotiable mandates of our Risen Lord. I know our parishioners and neighbors will join in and volunteer in this labor of love and work of mercy. Other opportunities to be the face of Christ "to" and "in" our neighborhood will spring from our Food Pantry Ministry.

Our rectory backyard is undergoing a "Make Over." In order to mount five stone and marble statues around the perimeter of the yard, we've poured five concrete pads. Front and center will be an altar where we will celebrate a Sunday Evening Mass at 6 pm, weather permitting. Our celebration of Sunday Mass will be a most visible and inviting sign of our Catholic Christian Hospitality. We welcome all our neighbors to be with us. Beginning after Memorial Day, the 6 pm Liturgy will provide a casual setting where people can "Come and See" the goodness of our Lord in our celebration. Our Summer Sunday Evening Mass ministry will end shortly after Labor Day. I'm hopeful that many who attend the Mass will continue to share our faith throughout the year at Our Lady of the Holy Family.

I would like to place the ministries within the Garden Chapel under the patronage of St. Hildegard von Bingen. She was a remarkable woman- religious, "Doctor of the Church, gardener, artist, author and mystic". I encourage you to learn more about her as we begin a discernment process to name and dedicate our Garden Chapel. 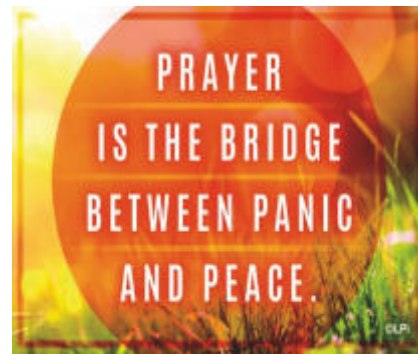
Nos estamos acercando al final de nuestro primer Año Pastoral como una parroquia recién formada y nombrada. Nuestra Arquidiócesis creó la comunidad católica de Nuestra Señora de la Sagrada Familia para atender a las necesidades religiosas, espirituales y sacramentales de todos nuestros feligreses. También está encargada de dirigir todos los recursos, ministerios y celebraciones de la parroquia al servicio de nuestro llamado a la Evangelización. La invitación y el desafío de ser discípulos vitales y vibrantes de nuestro Señor Jesucristo es un honor

y una bendición.

Durante el Año Pastoral 2021-2021 hemos realizado varias tareas esenciales, muchas de las cuales no fueron anunciadas adecuadamente debido a las muchas limitaciones para ayudar a mantenernos a todos seguros y sanos durante la actual pandemia de COVID-19. Nuestra parroquia cuenta con un equipo pastoral de ministros profesionales en nuestras oficinas, nuestras liturgias y nuestros ministerios. Nuestro recién formado Consejo Pastoral Parroquial y el Comité de Finanzas están preparados para abacar sus roles de liderazgo dentro de nuestra comunidad. Hemos aprendido y seguiremos aprendiendo a utilizar las maravillas de la tecnología moderna en nuestras celebraciones y esfuerzos de evangelización. Nuestro sitio web, la nueva cámara omnidireccional y un sistema de sonido mejorado ampliarán nuestra capacidad de acoger a nuestras hermanas y hermanos en la hermosa práctica de nuestra fe Católica.

He utilizado las ideas del padre Ronald Rolheiser como una especie de ejemplo para organizar nuestro trabajo y ministerio. En su libro, "The Holy Longing", habla de lo que él llama los "Elementos esenciales no negociables" para cualquiera que se declare cristiano Católico. "Son cuatro: 1)La moral personal; 2)la oración privada; 3)la oración en el seno de la comunidad eclesial, y 4) la preocupación por la justicia social y la implicación en ella, y un corazón apacible." Son expresiones que intentan captar la verdad y el misterio de nuestra fe: cómo acogemos a Cristo en nuestros corazones, mentes y almas, y cómo somos Jesús para aquellos con los que vivimos y con los que nos encontramos en nuestro camino. Estos no-negociables se manifiestan de muchas maneras. Estoy encantado de presentar a nuestra comunidad dos nuevos ministerios dentro de nuestra parroquia. Capturan el espíritu de la Nueva Evangelización y los no negociables de la Identidad Cristiana Católica: Nuestra "Despensa de Alimentos" de la Parroquia y nuestra "Misa Jardínera del Domingo de Verano".

En el capítulo 25 del evangelio de San Mateo, Jesús utiliza la imagen del "Juicio Final" que desafía a cualquiera que reclame el título de "cristiano". Parfraseando, *"Cuando tuve hambre, me diste de comer. Sediento, me diste de beber. Desnudo, me disteis ropa, y cuando estuve enfermo o preso, me visitasteis"*. Nuestro comité de Obras de Misericordia Corporales/Espirituales está ultimando los últimos detalles con el Deposito de Alimentos Gran Chicago. Muy pronto, estaremos en condiciones de poner en



práctica uno de los mandatos esenciales e innegociables de nuestro Señor Resucitado. Sé que nuestros feligreses y vecinos se unirán y serán voluntarios en esta labor de amor y obra de misericordia. Otras oportunidades de ser el rostro de Cristo "para" y "en" nuestro vecindario surgirán de nuestro Ministerio de Despensa.

Nuestro patio trasero de la rectoría está siendo sometido a un "Make Over". Con el fin de montar cinco estatuas de piedra y mármol alrededor del perímetro del patio, hemos vertido cinco cuadros de cemento. Al frente y en el centro habrá un altar donde celebraremos una misa dominical nocturna a las 6 pm, si el tiempo lo permite. Nuestra celebración de la misa dominical será un signo muy visible y atractivo de nuestra hospitalidad cristiana católica. Damos la bienvenida a todos nuestros vecinos a estar con nosotros. Comenzando después del Día conmemorativo, la Liturgia de las 6 pm proveerá un ambiente casual donde la gente puede "Venir y Ver" la bondad de nuestro Señor en nuestra celebración. Nuestro ministerio de misa vespertina de verano terminará poco después del Día del Trabajo. Tengo la esperanza de que muchos de los que asisten a la Misa continuarán compartiendo nuestra fe durante todo el año en Nuestra Señora de la Sagrada Familia.

Me gustaría poner los ministerios dentro de la Capilla del Jardín bajo el patrocinio de Santa Hildegarda von Bingen.
