

From the Pastor's Desk~

Cardinal Blase Cupich emailed all the Archdiocese priests with a link to Pope Francis' message on the occasion of the 59th World Day of Vocations. The document, "**Called to Build the Human Family**," was not written explicitly for an ordained priest or religious but directed to all Catholics who, under their baptismal identity, share in Jesus, priest, prophet, and king. As I read through the document, I realized that it would be an excellent model for our upcoming Sunday Summer Evening Mass season in our parish garden chapel and our continued efforts to become vital and vibrant disciples of Christ.

Our shared challenge and mission as Our Lady of the Holy Family Parish are to be witnesses of our Catholic faith within our community. This is accomplished when we intentionally and actively live our lives so that those around us know and experience the truth of Jesus Christ. Most of us have engaged in this duty of evangelization through participation in the life of the Church in our regular mass attendance, maintaining a personal prayer life, participation in the corporal and spiritual works of mercy, and financially supporting our parish, foreign missions, and our Archdiocese. Many of you serve in leadership roles in the parish and at our Sunday Mass. This is all well and good, and we will continue in these ministries, but the culture and society in which we live are less aware of the beauty and power of our Church. We need to be able to "tell again" the story of our faith. Our community needs to encounter Jesus in ways that make sense to our modern way of life.

Over many decades the parishes of the Archdiocese of Chicago championed the cause of spreading the Gospel. Our schools, hospitals, orphanages, Catholic Charities, devotional societies, and sodalities lifted millions of people from illness, need, and despair. Catholic servants, both religious and lay, had no rival in their ability to dispatch and serve where the need was most dire and where no one else dared to go. Fifty years ago, there were 2,684 priests and 8,331 religious women serving in over 500 parishes, schools, and hospitals, and they gathered countless volunteers and associates to join their ministries. Today there are 70% fewer religious women and half the number of priests serving approximately the same number of baptized Catholics, 2.3 million. These numbers needn't be cause for alarm- as some would like- but as an opportunity to seize a new opportunity for spreading the Good News in ways that make better sense for today's realities.

The levels of educational achievement among modern Catholics have never been as high as they are today (the good Sisters did a great job!). Employment, homeownership, and savings among the average Catholic have never been as secure. Our diversity of culture continues to be a hallmark of our Catholic Identity in Chicago. Historically, I can't think of another time when the average Catholic is better poised to rediscover the truth of Jesus and the richness of the Catholic Church. And, despite the pain many experienced during the initial restructuring of Renew My Church, parishes throughout the Archdiocese are beginning to see a new enthusiasm for our faith.

Our Summer Sunday Evening Mass in our parish garden begins on Pentecost Sunday, June 6th. Just as the first disciples of Christ allowed the Holy Spirit to lead them where they needed to be to share the Good News of Jesus, our parish will again let the same Spirit of Christ help us welcome our community to our Lord. Our garden chapel, dedicated in honor of St.



Hildegard von Bingen, will provide us with a peaceful and beautiful place with our neighbors and friends to celebrate the Eucharist, share our faith, and have some fun. The Pope's May 5th message referenced above will be our guide throughout the fifteen or so weeks of Summer Sunday Evening Mass. Francis's reflection should generate a healthy discussion on how we can engage a new generation of Catholics and those searching for meaning in their lives. I encourage everyone make to our garden chapel at least once during the Summer.

"Called to Build the Human Family" grew out of the current **Synod on Synodality, Communion, Participation, and Mission**

We will hear more about the Synod this upcoming October but our focus this Summer will be the five themes of the most recent message:

- Called to be protagonists together of the Church's mission**
- Called to be guardians of one another and of creation**
- Called to welcome God's gaze**
- Called to respond to God's gaze**
- Called to build a fraternal world**

El Cardenal Blase Cupich envió por correo electrónico a todos los sacerdotes de la Archidiócesis un enlace al mensaje del Papa Francisco con motivo de la 59^a Jornada Mundial de las Vocaciones. El documento, "Llamados a construir la familia humana", no estaba escrito explícitamente para un sacerdote o religioso ordenado, sino que estaba dirigido a todos los católicos que, bajo su identidad bautismal, comparten a Jesús, sacerdote, profeta y rey. Mientras leía el documento, me di cuenta de que sería un excelente modelo para nuestra próxima temporada de misa vespertina de verano en la capilla del jardín de nuestra parroquia y para nuestros continuos esfuerzos por convertirnos en discípulos vitales y vibrantes de Cristo.

Nuestro reto y misión compartida como Parroquia de Nuestra Señora de la Sagrada Familia es ser testigos de nuestra fe católica dentro de nuestra comunidad. Esto se logra cuando vivimos intencional y activamente nuestras vidas para que los que nos rodean conozcan y experimenten la verdad de Jesucristo. La mayoría de nosotros se ha comprometido con este deber de evangelización a través de la participación en la vida de la Iglesia en nuestra asistencia regular a la misa, manteniendo una vida de oración personal, la participación en las obras de misericordia

corporales y espirituales, y el apoyo financiero a nuestra parroquia, las misiones extranjeras, y nuestra Arquidiócesis. Muchos de ustedes desempeñan funciones de liderazgo en la parroquia y en nuestra misa dominical. Todo esto está muy bien, y continuaremos en estos ministerios, pero la cultura y la sociedad en la que vivimos son menos conscientes de la belleza y el poder de nuestra Iglesia. Tenemos que ser capaces de "contar de nuevo" la historia de nuestra fe. Nuestra comunidad necesita encontrar a Jesús de manera que tenga sentido para nuestro modo de vida moderno.

Durante muchas décadas, las parroquias de la Archidiócesis de Chicago han defendido la causa de la difusión del Evangelio. Nuestras escuelas, hospitales, orfanatos, Caridades Católicas, sociedades de devoción y congregaciones sacaron a millones de personas de la enfermedad, la necesidad y la desesperación. Los servidores católicos, tanto religiosos como laicos, no tenían rival en su capacidad de enviar y servir donde la necesidad era más acuciante y donde nadie más se atrevía a ir. Hace cincuenta años, había 2.684 sacerdotes y 8.331 religiosas sirviendo en más de 500 parroquias, escuelas y hospitales, y reunían a innumerables voluntarios y asociados para unirse a sus ministerios. Hoy hay un 70% menos de religiosas y la mitad de sacerdotes al servicio de aproximadamente el mismo número de católicos bautizados, 2,3 millones. Estas cifras no tienen por qué ser motivo de alarma - como querrían algunos-, sino una oportunidad para aprovechar una nueva ocasión de difundir la Buena Nueva de forma que tenga más sentido para las realidades de hoy.

Los niveles de rendimiento educativo entre los católicos modernos nunca han sido tan altos como ahora (¡las buenas Hermanas hicieron un gran trabajo!). El empleo, la propiedad de la vivienda y el ahorro entre el católico medio nunca han sido tan seguros. Nuestra diversidad cultural sigue siendo un sello distintivo de nuestra identidad católica en Chicago. Históricamente, no puedo pensar en otro momento en el que el católico medio esté mejor preparado para redescubrir la verdad de Jesús y la riqueza de la Iglesia Católica. Y, a pesar del dolor que muchos experimentaron durante la reestructuración inicial de Renovar mi Iglesia, las parroquias de toda la Arquidiócesis están empezando a ver un nuevo entusiasmo por nuestra fe.

Nuestra misa vespertina de verano en nuestro jardín parroquial comienza el domingo de Pentecostés, el 6 de junio. Así como los primeros discípulos de Cristo permitieron que el Espíritu Santo los guiará a donde necesitaban estar para compartir la Buena Nueva de Jesús, nuestra parroquia volverá a dejar que el mismo Espíritu de Cristo nos ayude a dar la bienvenida a nuestra comunidad a nuestro Señor. Nuestra capilla ajardinada, dedicada en honor a Santa Hildegarda Von Bignen, nos proporcionará un lugar tranquilo y hermoso con nuestros vecinos y amigos para celebrar la Eucaristía, compartir nuestra fe y divertirnos. El mensaje del Papa del 5 de mayo mencionado anteriormente será nuestra guía a lo largo de las aproximadamente quince semanas de la Misa vespertina del domingo de verano. La reflexión de Francisco debería generar una sana discusión sobre cómo podemos involucrar a una nueva generación de católicos y a aquellos que buscan un sentido a sus vidas. Animo a todo el mundo a venir a nuestra capilla del jardín al menos una vez durante el verano.

"Llamados a construir la familia humana" surgió del actual Sínodo sobre la Sinodalidad, la Comunión, la Participación y la Misión <https://www.usccb.org/synod> que concluirá en 2023. Tendremos más información sobre el Sínodo el próximo mes de octubre, pero este verano nos centraremos en los cinco temas del mensaje más reciente:

- Llamados a ser protagonistas juntos de la misión de la Iglesia
- Llamados a ser guardianes unos de otros y de la creación
- Llamados a acoger la mirada de Dios
- Llamados a responder a la mirada de Dios
- Llamados a construir un mundo fraternal

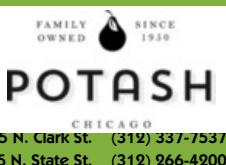
