From the Pastor's Desk~

The Ascension of our Lord is the best starting point to understand and embrace the truth of Pentecost. On his return to Heaven, Jesus first reminded his followers of a few non-negotiables as they neared their new reality. To experience success sharing the Good News, the disciples and Apostles needed to not forget the following: 1. Jesus considered them his friends 2. They were loved 3. Jesus believed in them, and 4. Not to be fearful because He would be with them until the end of time. With these promises clearly stated, Jesus was free to return to His Father and send the fullness of the Holy Spirit upon those first believers.



Pentecost didn't happen in a vacuum; it occurred within a living relationship with Jesus. The Holy Spirit would help the early Church understand what Jesus' public ministry was all about. The Advocate's gifts of wisdom and understanding would open their minds to the "why" Jesus did what he did and their souls to the "what" it was all about. With Pentecost, the friends of Jesus embarked on a new adventure. Their journey with our Lord didn't end; it was just beginning. With Pentecost, the Church was now able to not just do what Jesus did but to be Jesus, to be Christ, to one another and the world. With vitality and vibrancy, they would now give witness to our Lord. The entirety of the Gospels, the Acts of the Apostles, and the Epistles are the framework within which we continue to live and share our Catholic Christian Faith. For two millennia, the Spirit has guided us through an ocean of adversity, challenge, success, and celebration. The tradition and history we claim as our own are treasures unequaled in the annals of Human time. Everything experienced by those first believers is still working among us. The Holy Spirit has yet to abandon us. She, like our Lord, is with us until the end.

In his telling of the events of Pentecost, St. Luke masterfully crafts in a few words what will become and remains today the essential Christian "Calling Card,"; a timeless and universal invitation to accept the promise of new and eternal life in Jesus Christ. **"Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven staying in Jerusalem. At this sound, they gathered in a large crowd, but they were confused because each one heard them speaking in his own language. They were astounded, and in amazement they asked, 'Are not all these people who are speaking Galileans? Then how does each of us hear them in his native language? We are Parthians, Medes, and Elamites, inhabitants of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt, and the districts of Libya near Cyrene, as well as travelers from Rome, both Jews and converts to Judaism, Cretans and Arabs, yet we hear them speaking in our own tongues of the mighty acts of God."** Upon reflection of these words from scripture, we can glean the focus of our mission today.

The name "Jesus" is known throughout the world. People always have and will react to Jesus in varied ways; curiosity and interest, hostility and rage, indifference, doubt, belief, acceptance, and surrender. What can't be denied is that the world knows about Jesus and has many questions about him. Like the Apostles and disciples before us, we have been charged with the duty to answer those queries through our example, by how we live our professed faith in Jesus Christ. And, like our forebearers, we do so in many ways, shapes, and forms.

Our Lady of the Holy Family, Our parish has emerged from the displeasure of Renew My Church and the awkwardness of COVID alive and well. We've all had the opportunity to reevaluate our priorities, discover our core beliefs and values anew, and embark upon a different way of living during these trying times. What hasn't changed is our primary responsibility and mission as Catholic Christians- to share the Good News of Jesus with the world. The Holy Spirit hasn't changed either. She is still with us, leading us to where we need to be.

On Pentecost Sunday, we will again offer Holy Mass at 6 pm in our parish garden chapel, the first of our Sunday Summer Evening Mass Season. For 15 weeks, the many voices of our community will come together as the Body of Christ, the Church. Together we will celebrate the gift of Jesus in the Eucharist and have time for friendly fellowship afterward. On some evenings, we will offer presentations and videos on different topics. And throughout the entire Summer Season, we will revisit Pope Francis' papal message of May 8, 2022, **"Called to Build the Human Family."**

I hope you will be able to come and celebrate with us in our parish garden chapel at least once during the summer. Feel free to ride your bike over with a friend or bring your Doggo and favorite lawn chair. We will be blessed with your presence! Peace. Fr Peter

La Ascensión de nuestro Señor es el mejor punto de partida para entender y abrazar la verdad de Pentecostés. A su regreso al Cielo, Jesús recordó primero a sus seguidores unos cuantos puntos no negociables mientras se acercaban a su nueva realidad. Para experimentar el éxito al compartir la Buena Nueva, los discípulos y Apóstoles necesitaban no olvidar lo siguiente: 1. Jesús los consideraba sus amigos 2. Que eran amados 3. Que Jesús creía en ellos, y 4. Que no tenían miedo. No tener miedo porque Él estaría con ellos hasta el final de los tiempos. Con estas promesas claramente establecidas, Jesús fue libre de regresar a su Padre y enviar la plenitud del Espíritu Santo sobre esos primeros creyentes.

Pentecostés no ocurrió en el vacío; ocurrió dentro de una relación viva con Jesús. El Espíritu Santo ayudaría a la Iglesia primitiva a comprender en qué consistía el ministerio público de Jesús. Los dones de sabiduría y comprensión del Abogado abrirían sus mentes al "por qué" Jesús hizo lo que hizo y sus almas al "qué" se trataba. Con Pentecostés, los amigos de Jesús se embarcaron en una nueva aventura. Su viaje con el Señor no terminaba, sino que acababa de empezar. Con Pentecostés, la Iglesia era ahora capaz no sólo de hacer lo que Jesús hizo, sino de ser Jesús, de ser Cristo, para los demás y para el mundo. Con vitalidad y vivacidad, ahora darían testimonio de nuestro Señor.

La totalidad de los Evangelios, los Hechos de los Apóstoles y las Epístolas son el marco en el que seguimos viviendo y compartiendo nuestra fe cristiana católica. Durante dos milenios, el Espíritu nos ha guiado a través de un océano de adversidades, desafíos, éxitos y celebraciones. La tradición y la historia que reivindicamos como propias son tesoros sin parangón en los anales del tiempo humano. Todo lo que experimentaron aquellos primeros creyentes sigue actuando entre nosotros. El Espíritu Santo aún no nos ha abandonado. Ella, como nuestro Señor, está con nosotros hasta el final.

En su relato de los acontecimientos de Pentecostés, San Lucas elabora magistralmente en unas pocas palabras lo que será y sigue siendo hoy la "tarjeta de visita" cristiana esencial; una invitación intemporal y universal a aceptar la promesa de una vida nueva y eterna en Jesucristo. **"Había en Jerusalén judíos devotos de todas las naciones bajo el cielo. Al oír este sonido, se reunieron en una gran multitud, pero estaban confundidos porque cada uno les oía hablar en su propia lengua. Quedaron asombrados y preguntaron asombrados: '¿No son galileos todos estos que hablan? Entonces, ¿cómo es que cada uno de nosotros los oye en su lengua materna? Somos partos, medos y elamitas, habitantes de Mesopotamia, de Judea y de Capadocia, del Ponto y de Asia, de Frigia y de Panfilia, de Egipto y de las comarcas de Libia cercanas a Cirene, así como viajeros de Roma, tanto judíos como conversos al judaísmo, cretenses y árabes, y sin embargo les oímos hablar en nuestra propia lengua de los poderosos hechos de Dios."** Al reflexionar sobre estas palabras de la Escritura, podemos deducir el enfoque de nuestra misión de hoy.

El nombre "Jesús" es conocido en todo el mundo. La gente siempre ha reaccionado y reaccionará ante Jesús de diversas maneras: curiosidad e interés, hostilidad y rabia, indiferencia, duda, creencia, aceptación y entrega. Lo que no se puede negar es que el mundo conoce a Jesús y tiene muchas preguntas sobre él. Al igual que los Apóstoles y los discípulos que nos precedieron, se nos ha encomendado el deber de responder a esas preguntas con nuestro ejemplo, con la forma en que vivimos la fe que profesamos en Jesucristo. Y, al igual que nuestros antepasados, lo hacemos de muchas maneras, formas y modos.

Nuestra Señora de la Sagrada Familia, Nuestra parroquia ha salido viva y bien del disgusto de Renovar mi Iglesia y de la incomodidad de COVID. Todos hemos tenido la oportunidad de reevaluar nuestras prioridades, descubrir de nuevo nuestras creencias y valores fundamentales, y embarcarnos en una manera diferente de vivir durante estos tiempos difíciles. Lo que no ha cambiado es nuestra principal responsabilidad y misión como cristianos católicos: compartir la Buena Nueva de Jesús con el mundo. El Espíritu Santo tampoco ha cambiado. Sigue estando con nosotros, guiándonos hacia donde debemos estar.

El domingo de Pentecostés, volveremos a ofrecer la Santa Misa a las 6 de la tarde en la capilla del jardín de nuestra parroquia, la primera de nuestra temporada de misas vespertinas de verano. Durante 15 semanas, las muchas voces de nuestra comunidad se unirán como el Cuerpo de Cristo, la Iglesia. Juntos celebraremos el don de Jesús en la Eucaristía y tendremos tiempo para la convivencia. Algunas tardes, ofreceremos presentaciones y videos sobre diferentes temas. Y a lo largo de toda la Temporada de Verano, revisaremos el mensaje papal del Papa Francisco del 8 de mayo de 2022, **"Llamados a Construir La Familia Humana"**.

Espero que puedas venir a celebrar con nosotros en la capilla de nuestro jardín parroquial al menos una vez durante el verano. Siéntase libre de venir en bicicleta con un amigo o traiga su Doggo y su silla de jardín favorita. ¡Seremos bendecidos con su presencia! Paz. Padre Peter

The campaign will continue through June 30. If you haven't donated to *The Society of Our Lady Campaign* yet, there is still time!

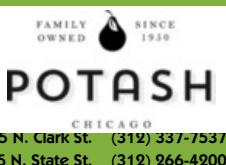
