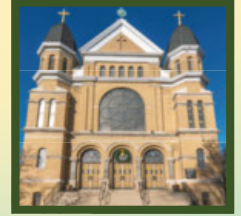

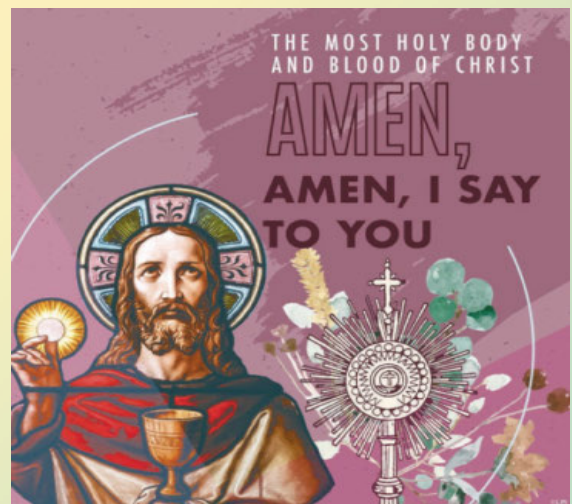

## From the Pastor's Desk~

Last week, in referencing Pope Francis's Message of May 8<sup>th</sup>- Good Shepherd Sunday, I wrote of one of the ways God sees us and invites us to see ourselves. Francis noted that we are, "Called to be protagonists together of the Church's mission"; heroes in the story of our salvation. We don't often see ourselves in that light. The title "hero" is for others, usually nameless and unknown to us personally. But, when we accept Jesus' invitation to be his friends and disciples, we are heroes. Today, I want to say a bit more about the word our Pope used in his message; "protagonists."

The Oxford Dictionary has this to offer. A protagonist is "the main figure or one of the most prominent figures in a real situation." With this description, we don't soar high in the imagination and art of modern Comics. Here, our feet are firmly planted in the real world, and our attention focuses on everyday life's challenges. As protagonists, we shape and influence the direction of our story's theme. As Catholic Christians, our story is how we give witness to the truth of Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior.

I invite you to bring this image into your private prayer and reflection. Reflect upon the many chapters of your life's story. Remember, you are in the starring role. How have you left your mark on the journey? As protagonist/hero, what and who have recurring roles in the tale? Can you name the challenges and struggles? What are the successes? What are the failures? How have all of these happenings crafted who you are today? We all have many responsibilities and play a variety of roles in life. We're children and siblings, spouses and partners, neighbors and fellow citizens, best friends and worst enemies. Parents and grandparents give of themselves entirely to their children. Where do you readily make a sacrifice for the good of others?

Once you have a clear picture of your life's story in mind, ask where and how God has been with you. Is He part of the supporting cast or a bystander? Where is God, His son Jesus, or the Holy Spirit in the script? Are they regulars, or do they just make the odd and casual "cameo" appearance? As you reflect upon your story, perhaps it is our Blessed Mother or one of the Saints who join you in your role as protagonist. Hopefully, you're not all alone.

Today we honor all our fathers and those men who embrace the responsibility of parenting children not their own. Their love and dedication deserve our recognition and admiration. Fathers also show us what it means to be a protagonist in the Church's mission. Fathers and mothers share in the work of nurturing, educating, protecting, and preparing their children to live happy and peaceful lives. Fathers, especially, have long accepted the role of protagonist hero for their families in the face of our world's challenges.

Before our modern society became the norm in the Western world, the roles of parents were more clearly defined. Mothers carry their children in the womb for nine long months before giving birth. Infants need constant care and attention and utterly depend upon Mom for food and succor. Babies take years to grow into a stage of freedom and self-sufficiency, meaning that mothers stay close to the kids in a relatively confined environment for many years. Dads, of course, do their part within the family circle. Still, for millennia they had to look out at the horizons to watch for

any danger, prey, or enemy lurking beyond the home as heroes within the dynamic duo of mom and dad. We're blessed that they continue to do so in our day.

We will have an Ice Cream Social after our 6 pm Summer Sunday Evening Mass in our parish garden. You don't have to be a father to attend or get an ice cream, but we hope our Dads can make it over for a little celebration. Happy Father's Day! *Peace. Pmc*



La semana pasada, al referirme al Mensaje del Papa Francisco del 8 de mayo, Domingo del Buen Pastor, escribí sobre una de las formas en que Dios nos ve y nos invita a vernos a nosotros mismos. Francisco señaló que estamos "llamados a ser protagonistas juntos de la misión de la Iglesia"; héroes en la historia de nuestra salvación. No solemos vernos a nosotros mismos bajo esa luz. El título de "héroe" es para otros, normalmente sin nombre y desconocidos para nosotros personalmente. Pero, cuando aceptamos la invitación de Jesús a ser sus amigos y discípulos, somos héroes. Hoy quiero hablar un poco más de la palabra que nuestro Papa utilizó en su mensaje: "protagonistas".

El diccionario de Oxford dice lo siguiente Un protagonista es "la figura principal o uno de los personajes más destacados de una situación real". Con esta descripción, no nos elevamos en la imaginación y el arte del Cómic moderno. Aquí, nuestros pies están firmemente plantados en el mundo real, y nuestra atención se centra en los retos de la vida cotidiana. Como protagonistas, damos forma e influimos en la dirección del tema de nuestra historia. Como cristianos católicos, nuestra historia es la forma en que damos testimonio de la verdad de Jesucristo, nuestro Señor y Salvador.

Te invito a llevar esta imagen a tu oración y reflexión privada. Reflexiona sobre los muchos capítulos de la historia de tu vida. Recuerda que tú eres el protagonista. ¿Cómo has dejado tu huella en el camino? Como protagonista/héroe, ¿qué y quiénes tienen papeles recurrentes en la historia? ¿Puedes nombrar los retos y las luchas? ¿Cuáles son los éxitos? ¿Cuáles son los fracasos? ¿Cómo han contribuido todos estos acontecimientos a crear lo que eres hoy? Todos tenemos muchas responsabilidades y desempeñamos diversos papeles en la vida. Somos hijos y hermanos, cónyuges y parejas, vecinos y conciudadanos, mejores amigos y peores enemigos. Los padres y los abuelos se entregan por completo a sus hijos. ¿Dónde estás dispuesto a sacrificarte por el bien de los demás?

Una vez que tengas en mente una imagen clara de la historia de tu vida, pregúntate dónde y cómo ha estado Dios contigo. ¿Forma parte del reparto o es un espectador? ¿Dónde está Dios, su hijo Jesús o el Espíritu Santo en el guión? ¿Son habituales, o sólo hacen una extraña y casual aparición como "cameo"? Al reflexionar sobre tu historia, tal vez sea la Virgen o alguno de los santos los que se unan a ti en tu papel de protagonista. Afortunadamente, no estás solo. Hoy honramos a todos nuestros padres y a aquellos hombres que abrazan la responsabilidad de criar hijos que no son suyos. Su amor y dedicación merecen nuestro reconocimiento y admiración. Los padres también nos muestran lo que significa ser protagonista en la misión de la Iglesia. Padres y madres comparten la labor de criar, educar, proteger y

preparar a sus hijos para que vivan felices y en paz. Los padres, especialmente, han aceptado desde hace mucho tiempo el papel de héroe protagonista de sus familias frente a los desafíos de nuestro mundo.

Antes de que nuestra sociedad moderna se convirtiera en la norma en el mundo occidental, las funciones de los padres estaban más claramente definidas. Las madres llevan a sus hijos en el vientre durante nueve largos meses antes de dar a luz. Los bebés necesitan cuidados y atención constantes y dependen totalmente de la madre para alimentarse y socorrerse. Los bebés tardan años en crecer hasta alcanzar una etapa de libertad y autosuficiencia, lo que significa que las madres permanecen cerca de los niños en un entorno relativamente confinado durante muchos años. Los padres, por supuesto, hacen su parte dentro del círculo familiar. Aun así, durante milenios tuvieron que mirar al horizonte para vigilar cualquier peligro, presa o enemigo que acechara más allá del hogar como héroes dentro del dúo dinámico de mamá y papá. Tenemos la suerte de que sigan haciéndolo en nuestros días.

Dear Parishioners and Friends:

Greetings and thank you for the opportunity to provide an update on Our Lady of the Holy Family Parish's Society of Our Lady Campaign for pastoral year 2021-2022.

Last November, we sought your support of OLHF's 16th annual Society of Our Lady Campaign, which helps bridge the gap when our weekly Offertory collection does not meet budget, which has been the case the past several years. As we continue to come out of the pandemic, we haven't been able to meet our weekly Offertory budgeted goal of \$4,500.

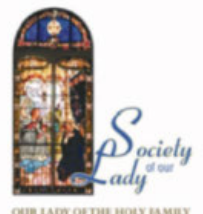

**St. Thomas More | June 22**



Sir Thomas More was a humanist and statesman in Tudor England. He is still widely known today as the author of Utopia. More was a prolific writer and theologian. A true martyr of the Church, he was beatified by Pope Leo XIII in 1886, and canonized by Pope Pius XI on May 19, 1935.

More was born in London in 1478, the son of Sir John More, a lawyer and judge. He attended Oxford where he studied Latin and Greek, as well as formal logic. He left Oxford in 1494 to train as a lawyer in London. After attaining the Bar, he spent time discerning a call to the priesthood. Though attracted to the Franciscan order More remained a lay Christian, continuing to fast, pray, and wear a hair shirt. He was married twice, the loving father of three daughters, a stepdaughter by his second marriage,

and one son. More wrote many letters to his children when he was away on business and his daughters were known for their academic abilities, as they received the same education as his son, an anomaly at the time.

More rose to the Privy Council in 1514. He became the good friend and advisor to Henry VIII, and in 1521 he was knighted. In 1529 he was made Lord Chancellor of England. However, this appointment was the beginning of the end for the saint. He could not support the break with the Church in Rome when Henry failed to receive from the Pope the annulment of his first marriage to Katherine of Aragon to wed Anne Boleyn. More resigned as Lord Chancellor and continued to refuse to accept Henry as the head of the Church in England. Eventually he was imprisoned, tried, and sentenced to a traitor's death, to be hanged, drawn, and quartered. Henry commuted the sentence of his former friend to the more humane beheading. More was executed at Tower Hill, on July 6, 1535, before his death he famously proclaimed that he was "the king's good servant, but God's first." © LPI

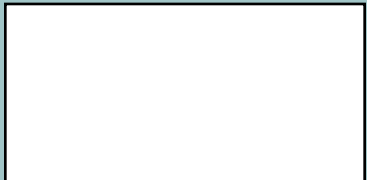
