From the Pastor's Desk~

Being Loved and Sent

Jesus is now on the road to Jerusalem. Now we hear him sending disciples out to each town that he intends to visit. And he gives his famous instructions about them shaking the dust from their feet (Gospel).

Today we too are sent out to spread news of the kingdom, just like the disciples. Not a duty imposed by guilt or command, but by gratitude for the great goodness of God to each of us and all of us—as liturgical spirituality would say—especially in this time of world and individual troubles.

Last week Jesus was recruiting followers, in tough language ("Let the dead bury their dead!"), and now he is giving army-like instructions as to how the seventy-two disciples are to act when they go journeying to the towns ("Carry no money bag, no sack, no sandals"). In light of what we saw during Holy Week, are you and I ready to be recruited to this kind of life? Jesus must have been loved a lot, since he acted with much gratitude and self-surrender on the cross. When a person is cared for, gratefulness is the obvious response.

Real love, once truly given and accepted, cannot be erased.

We are to imitate him. So let us look more closely and find what he was responding to. One answer could be a theoretical one about the Trinity, about Jesus being the Christ, close to the Father. Gratitude surely is at the heart of the Trinity. But on Sunday we will have very earthy images. Take a look at the First Reading. It is a beautiful "welcome home" for people who had been exiled from Jerusalem, who had hung up their harps because their broken hearts could not sing in captivity.

The Lord tells them to

suck fully of the milk of [Jerusalem's] comfort, that you may nurse with delight at her abundant breasts! ... As nurslings, you shall be carried in her arms, and fondled in her lap; as a mother comforts her child, so will I comfort you.

These are Godly, mothering images, immediate, compelling. It is the peace given by God's motherhood. It is the peace that our wild and wooly lives emerge from and can journey back to!

Surely this is what gave Jesus courage on the cross. As a man, he was comforted at the breast of the Holy Spirit. And notice that he would ask that most terrible question, "why have you forsaken me"? His hope-against-hope, his memory of love gave him bravery, even enmeshed in sin and danger and death.

Such fullness is what we also receive or at least remember, one in which we are loved, one which sends us into the world even when we cannot recall the fond love that God had for our wriggling, snotty, childish selves. We can still call to mind what we knew of it in the past, and maybe in our adulthood at this very moment. Real love, once truly given and accepted, you know, cannot be erased. The comfort that fondled us as babies still nestles near the very center of our selves.

We need to look for it.

If we do have to search for it, as Jesus seemed to, then we must wait and hope and pray, and not give up. Jesus did not give up, on the cross or on the road to it.

¿No es nuestro deber también salir y predicar la buena noticia del reino de Dios? Este domingo recordamos ese llamado. No es un deber impuesto por la culpa o por un mandato, sino por la gratitud. Según la espiritualidad litúrgica, es para pagar la enorme bondad de Dios hacia todos y cada uno de nosotros.

La paz emana de esta maternidad de Dios.

¿Te acuerdas de lo que sucedía la semana pasada? Jesús iba reclutando. Hablaba con palabras muy duras ("Dejen que los muertos entierren a sus muertos"), y ahora da instrucciones casi militares sobre cómo se deben comportar los setenta y dos mientras viajan a los pueblos. ("No lleven talega, ni alforja, ni sandalias") ¿Nosotros nos encontramos dispuestos a ser enviados cuando vemos, desde el Viernes Santo, lo mucho que Dios haría para amarnos y compartir nuestras vidas?

Cuando alguien te ama y permanece a tu lado, ¿no es normal responder con gratitud?

¿Qué fue lo que Jesús experimentó que lo hizo tan agradecido, que lo hizo ofrecerse y rendirse en la cruz? Queremos saberlo porque deseamos imitarlo.

Una respuesta podría ser teórica: que Jesús es la Segunda Persona de la Trinidad, lo más cerca que se puede estar al Dios del amor. Pero este domingo veremos algunas imagines muy terrestres que ilustran esa respuesta.

Veamos la primera lectura. Es una hermosa bienvenida a un pueblo que había estado exiliado de Jerusalén, que había colgado sus harpas por no querer cantar en el cautiverio.

El Señor les dice

Mamarán a sus pechos y se saciarán de sus consuelos, y apurarán las delicias de sus ubres abundantes ... Llevarán en brazos a sus criaturas y sobre las rodillas las acariciarán; como a un niño a quien su madre consuela, así los consolaré yo.

Imágenes maternales, inmediatas, totalmente cautivadoras.

La paz brota de esta maternidad de Dios. Nuestras vidas impredecibles emergen de ella y de alguna manera regresan siempre a ella.

Jesús se había criado en el seno de María. Ella dio a luz a Jesús, lo amó y lo crió. Por ella y con ella, se crió también en el seno del

Espíritu Santo. Su ser físico tenía las mismas necesidades que todos los demás, pero su naturaleza divina ya estaba colmada, en todo momento, en la unión tierna que es la Trinidad.

Cuando abrío sus brazos en la cruz, le hizo al Dios que lo había amamantado, la pregunta más terrible de todas, "¿Por qué me has abandonado?" Aun en ese momento, en la agonía



del alma y del cuerpo, recordaba el amor que lo había acuñado. Su esperanza radical lo permitió permanecer en la cruz.

Tú y yo: cuando nos olvidamos del amor de Dios por nuestros seres inmaduros y a veces desagradables, todavía podemos reconocer que conocíamos en el pasado ese tipo de amor. Y que volveremos a conocerlo. Necesitamos esperar, orar, y, sí, sufrir.

Dios es el punto crucial de nuestras vidas. Dios nos envía al mundo. Cuando alguien nos ama y permanece a nuestro lado, ¿no seguimos aprendiendo a responder con amor?



St. Oliver Plunkett July 1

Saint Oliver Plunkett was the last Roman Catholic Martyr to die in England. He was canonized in 1975, the first new Irish saint in almost 700 years.

Oliver was born in Loughcrew,
Oldcastle, County Meath in
November 1625, the son of the
Baron of Loughcrew. As a young
man, he wanted to become a
priest, but it was illegal to travel to
the continent to enter seminary.
Even so, he undertook the
dangerous journey with four other
young men and a Papal Envoy.
They were pursued by English
privateers, storms at sea, and
robbers on land. However, Oliver
entered Rome in 1647, and was
admitted to the Irish College. He

was an excellent student and was ordained on January 1, 1654. Oliver remained in Rome, studied law and served as chaplain at Spienza University, ministered at Santo Spirito hospital, and cared for the poor and ill.

By 1657 he was a professor of Theology and later of Apologetics or Controversies at Propaganda College.

The 1650s were a difficult time in for Catholics in Ireland, the majority of population, as Cromwell passed many penal laws against them, and the practice of Catholicism was banned. During this time Oliver was appointed by Irish bishops to be their

agent in Rome. Following the Restoration of Monarchy, Pope Clement IX appointed Oliver Archbishop of Armagh and Primate of all Ireland 1669. Oliver returned to a country where the Catholic Church was in disarray and divided.

He had to travel largely incognito and perform his duties in makeshift locations. He is credited with unifying the Church and in traveling across the eleven dioceses under his purview, confirming thousands, and ordaining several priests.

In 1673 persecution of Catholics was again on the rise and bishops were banned. Oliver went into hiding, but in 1679 he was arrested and charged with treason. He was hanged, drawn, and quartered at Tyburn in July 1681. Before his death he publicly forgave those responsible.
