

WORKING WITH THE SCRIPTURES

May 2, 2021 (Acts 9:26-31; 1 John 3:18-24; Jn. 15:1-8)

It was late in the afternoon when my friend called. She had just been diagnosed with a rare form of cancer. The prescribed treatment would be difficult – her days a blur of tests and scans, doctors, nurses and more specialists than she had names for. A myriad of people doing the deeds that love does.

“Children, let us love not in word or speech, but in deed and truth.” The dictionary defines “deed” as a “thing done intentionally or consciously”. We hear a lot of talk about love but this Scripture passage seems to say that talk's not enough. We are to love in ‘deed’ if we are truly children of God. In other words, actions speak louder than words.

Jesus tells us that He is the vine onto which we must be grafted. “Whoever remains in me and I in him will bear much fruit...” How are we to bear this fruit? This fruit is the result of our deeds.

For the healthcare professionals who cared for my friend the fruit of their deeds was the physical, emotional and spiritual wellbeing of their patients. Real estate agents bear good fruit when they are truthful regarding properties they represent. Factory workers bear good fruit when they put in an honest day's work; employers, when they pay an honest day's wage.

Jesus wasn't interested in people who just talked a good talk. He expected his followers to love “...in deed and truth”. When Saul arrived in Jerusalem the disciples were afraid of him because, even though he was saying all the right things, his previous deeds had produced a very different kind of fruit. It was only when they were able to see that his talk was reflected in his deeds that they accepted him into their company. The same is true today. Actions still speak louder than words.

So what do our deeds say about us? Is our talk reflected in our deeds? Does our work bear honest fruit? Are we grafted cleanly to the vine that is Jesus? Or are there still some places where we need to be pruned?

Inspiration for the week

Anyone familiar with gardening knows that proper and timely pruning is essential. The health of the plant depends upon it. An unpruned tree can quickly produce suckers that zap many of the essential nutrients from its body. Pruning requires patience and vision. Studies reveal that plants often respond defensively to being pruned, displaying reactions that are similar to hurt or discomfort. Pruning is not easy but necessary. A hard lesson for us to learn is that we also need to be pruned. We become far healthier when we allow God to stretch, refine, and form us into the best version of ourselves. The fruit that then comes from our vines will be more abundant, nutritious, and robust. Left to our own devices we can easily find ourselves running amuck and spiraling out of control. Without a proper vision and trust in the Master Pruner, we will never find the contentment we desperately desire. Nor will the work of the Gospel stand a chance of succeeding.



From the Nurse

The focus for May is to raise awareness about the impact high blood pressure can have on your health.



Normal blood pressure levels are:

- Systolic (top number) <120
- Diastolic (bottom number) <80

At risk levels are:

- Systolic 120-130
- Diastolic 80-89

High blood pressure levels are:

- Systolic 140 or higher
- Diastolic 90 or higher

Stroke and high blood pressure are two common health related conditions we hear about a lot. Why? Because stroke is the 5th leading cause of death in the United States with high blood pressure as the leading cause of a stroke. A stroke happens every 40 seconds and every 4 hours someone dies of a stroke. 80% of strokes can be avoided.

Blood pressure of 130/80 is considered high range which was reduced in 2017. As a result of lowering guidelines it is believed that this will allow for earlier intervention and education.

Signs of a stroke:

FAST

- F-face drooping
- A-arm weakness
- S-speech slurred
- T-time to dial 911

She always has such a positive attitude when she comes in. When her friend's husband passed away suddenly, she was right there to comfort and help them in any way she could. We are blessed to know you and we appreciate you Kay! Kay's words to live by: "Be faithful unto death, and I will give you a crown of life."

Did you know?

Question: What is the work of the Sacristan?

Answer: They are not always very obvious but they are not invisible either. Such is the liturgical role of the Sacristan within a parish. Many parishes have a Sacristan, but some do not. But even in those parishes that have one, the Sacristan's duties may seem mysterious to some observers.



The *General Instructions of the Roman Missal* describes the Sacristan's role in Chapter III: Duties and Ministries in the Mass, in a single line

105. A liturgical function is also exercised by:

a) The sacristan, who diligently arranges the liturgical books, the vestments, and other things that are necessary for the celebration of Mass.

The holy preparations in which Sacristans are entrusted are the basic framework for the beautiful and sacred objects that are used and carried out before, during, and after the Mass. It's a serious job that one must undertake with care and wisdom. Many of the Sacristan's duties are related to taking care of the Sacristy (hence the name *Sacristan*) and the sacred items in the Sacristy. This is the secure area of the church which serves as a holding room for the sacred items used in the Holy Mass. It is usually a small room off to the side of the altar. In the sacristy, there is a standing observation of silence. In this small space, all linens used in the Mass are cleaned according to strict requirements. The altar cloths are first soaked to remove any remnants of The Blessed Sacrament before laundering. This water containing the Holy Body must be poured directly into the sacrarium or onto the ground, no exceptions. The linens are then ironed and replaced.

The Sacristan usually arrives about thirty minutes before Mass begins. He or she makes sure the priest has the required collections for the altar. This includes the chalice, cruets, linens, oils, crosses, candles, and celebration bells. All must be kept in pristine condition. The Sacristan also ensures all lamps and candles have sufficient light to last for the entire Mass. At the priest's discretion, the Sacristan may also be responsible for ensuring that there are sufficient fresh hosts and the proper amount of duly authorized wine for the communion procession. Once Mass has ended, the altar cloths are cleaned, as is the altar itself. Once the sacred items are put away, the Sacristan sometimes sees to it that all books and bulletins have been cleared away in the pews. He or she may also help with training altar boys and decorating for weddings and funerals. Quite often Sacristans are also responsible for keeping the holy water reservoirs clean and filled at all times.

While there is no official training for a becoming a Sacristan, being well read in liturgical books and calendars is a must. He or she must be a regular parishioner approved by the pastor with a joyful willingness to serve. If you are interested in being a Sacristan for your parish, talk to your pastor. You may be needed more than you know!




