

WORKING WITH THE SCRIPTURES

August 8, 2021 (*Jn. 6:41-51; Eph. 4:30 – 5:2*)

As not only our children but many American adults as well tend increasingly toward obesity these words, whether spoken by medical experts recommending a more balanced diet or by nutritionists pointing out the value of healthier school lunch choices, seem to be directed right at us: "You are what you eat."

"I am the living bread...". As Covid restrictions in many areas are gradually relaxing people are coming back to church and again coming forward to receive Communion. Row after row, it seems that almost everyone "goes to Communion" on Sunday. But does what we eat on Sunday make any difference on Monday?

Overheard at the coffee machine: "Fred was let go last week." "What happened?" "Don't know, but it must have been pretty bad. He's got a wife and a couple of kids, you know. Wonder if he got any kind of severance package." Does anybody *call* Fred? Or are they too busy going through his desk to see what kind of stuff he left behind? For that matter, what kind of stuff *did* Fred leave behind? Notes? Files? Or was Fred so angry that he either took everything with him or destroyed it? What really happened? Was Fred "let go"? Or did he *quit*? Is it possible that somebody's trying to twist the story of Fred's leaving in order to make either Fred or the company look bad?

"All bitterness, fury, anger, shouting and reviling must be removed from you, along with all malice." Paul was talking to the Ephesians but sometimes it seems that his words could just as easily be directed at us – especially during rush hour (or even on our way out of the parking lot after Mass!).

"[B]e kind...compassionate, forgiving one another as God has forgiven you...". This "becoming what we eat" is harder than it looks! Couldn't we just concentrate on *eating* and forget that *becoming* part? "[T]he bread that I...give is my flesh for the life of the world." Now Jesus' words are directed at us. "You are what you eat". What *do* we eat on Sunday? And does it make any difference on Monday?

Inspiration for the week

Are we willing to be taught by God? If we are, then we will begin to see things and make judgments using a Divine lens. Often, we perceive things with purely human eyes and reference points. When we do this, reality can lose its Divine spark and we miss what God is trying to say. When using human eyes exclusively, Jesus is at best perceived simply as a prophet who has some wise things to say. The human element has a difficult time seeing Jesus' divinity and recognizing him as the Bread of Life that comes down from heaven. We can easily get stuck on Jesus' human associations and overlook the marvelous wonders God wants us to see. If we really allow ourselves to be taught by God, we will then come to see the truth about Jesus and the abundant everlasting life God offers. Jesus becomes the key that unlocks all of our relationships: with God, others, ourselves, and creation. He, as the true and lasting bread from heaven, shows us the gifts of faith, hope, and love that God bestows on us. Through this divine lens we see that all life sparkles and glows with God's love.






Time to Come Back To Mass!

Question: What is the difference between a transitional deacon and a permanent deacon?

Answer: There are two types of deacons in the church. Both are members of the clergy. Both have the same liturgical role. Both have the service of the community as their primary work. One is called a permanent deacon, usually a married man ordained as a deacon with no intention of becoming a priest. They preach, baptize, witness marriages, conduct funeral services, and look after the needs of the poor. They also visit the sick and take Communion to them, although they cannot celebrate the sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. They might also assist the pastor in his administrative duties. Permanent deacons are usually well known and respected in their communities and have roots there.

A transitional deacon is one who functions as a deacon for a period of time prior to ordination as a priest. His diaconate assignment serves as a kind of internship of ordained ministry. During his year or two as a deacon, he will learn the practical aspects of parish life, getting a firsthand look at the life of a priest. His work has a different focus than a permanent deacon in that he is looking forward to ordination as a priest.






