

FROM THE DESK OF MSGR. STEVE KNOX



Dear Friends in Christ,

Epiphany of the Lord

The word "Epiphany" means to make manifest, and what is made manifest in today's Gospel is the Lord Jesus. The Magi follow a star and it brings them to the Christ child. They come bearing gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. King Herod is bent on destroying the child because of a perceived threat to his power. Warned of this danger in a dream, the Magi depart back to their country by a different route.

There are some powerful spiritual lessons flowing from this Gospel. Jesus is the Bread of Life who was born into our world to be that spiritual nourishment that satisfies our spiritual hunger. He came to save us from our sins and to set us free. The Magi are on a spiritual journey: following this star and seeking satisfaction for their souls. They reflect all of us. At times, we seek to satisfy our deepest spiritual hunger with things that fall short. We may think that certain material possessions, power, titles, or high octane pleasures will bring us to the Promised Land. They may provide temporary satisfaction but after a while we will realize there has to be something more. When the Magi came before Jesus, they realized this is what they truly hungered for. That ancient line from St. Augustine rings true, "Our hearts are restless until they rest in God". The Magi reflect a healthy spirituality. They are on the move, and they are growing.

King Herod, on the other hand, is an example of where we don't want to end up. He is self-centered, fearful, and possessed by his power and material possessions. He is not free. He is enslaved by his ego and the things he owns, which sadly now own him. Many people in our world end up in the same situation as King Herod.

We read that the Magi bring gifts to Jesus. While the gifts they bring are significant; the amazing thing is that they receive the ultimate gift, a relationship with Jesus Christ. Their spiritual hunger and search brought them to Jesus, the Bread of Life. We all desire satisfaction of the soul, and Jesus can only provide what we desire at the deepest level.

Jesus desires that we keep learning and growing. In a sense, a Christian is always on the move because on this side of Heaven, we will never have completely arrived. Our God is a generous God, and he always has more to give us. We never retire from discipleship because even at an advanced age, God can do great things through us to touch the lives of others.

Prayer is the key. As we enter into this New Year, may the Lord bless each one of us in our friendship with him. May we always take time to be with him in prayer. May we allow him to nourish our souls through the sacraments and the ministry life of our parish. It will be another year of navigating this pandemic, so we will need wisdom and a spirit of perseverance. Let us not lose heart, rather, may we always trust in the Lord. May our search for God lead us deeper into his love.



2022 INTENTIONS GUIDELINES

Mass and Flame of Faith Intentions are now open through **June 2022** and can be accessed on our website or in person. Mass Intentions are Masses prayed for someone and are read during the intercessory prayers at Mass.

Starting in July, St. Bridget will add a Collective Mass to one of the Sunday Masses each weekend. The Collective Mass will be open to three individuals intentions per Collective Mass for three different families. This will help accommodate the need for more Mass Intentions.

Flame of Faith Intentions are for the Presence Lamp in the Sanctuary and the Vigil Lights in the Adoration Chapel. These burn starting on a Sunday through Saturday for someone.
