Dear Friends in Christ,

The Sacredness of Human Life

This coming week, we have two commemorations in our country that touch on the sacredness of human life. Monday, January 17th, marks the Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. observance in our country, and Saturday, January 22nd, in the Catholic Church marks the Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children. While quite different in their focus, both commemorations connect on a fundamental spiritual truth. The truth is that human life at every stage has a dignity, value, and worth reated in the image and likeness of God

because we are created in the image and likeness of God.

Dr. King one time observed that, "we have learned to fly in the sky like birds, and swim in the sea like fish, but we have not learned the simple act of living together." Racism, ethnic and religious hatred, and all types of prejudice exist in our world. The good news is that education and interaction has helped to improve relations between different races, ethnicities, and religions. We still have a long way to go. We know that Heaven will not be compartmentalized or segregated and that all hatred and prejudice will cease. On this side of eternity, most people need more purification and conversion when it comes to eliminating prejudicial attitudes from their minds and hearts. As we grow in our relationship with God, we not only see our own dignity and value more clearly, but we are also strengthened to see the fundamental dignity of others. Our Catholic value of the sacredness of life is core to our belief system and is the thread that weaves through all our social and moral teachings.

On Saturday, January 22nd, we have a special day of prayer for the legal protection of unborn children. Each one of us spent time in the womb and thank goodness we are here! Sadly, many unborn children meet their demise because of abortion. Many in our country fail to see the humanity of unborn human life, and therefore feel there is no right to life. In our Catholic tradition, we would see human life as being present from the time of conception. Advances in ultrasound technology help us to realize that even at very early stages of development human life is present. Our country is very divided on this issue, but we have to hold fast to our beliefs in this area of morality. The unborn are the most vulnerable, and the Gospel message of Jesus challenges us to see his presence in the least of our brothers and sisters (Matthew 25).

Let us continue to pray for a greater respect for human life in our world. Please pray for an end to all forms of violence, prejudice, and hatred. The Lord calls us to be instruments of reconciliation and peace. Let us also pray for an end to abortion and other practices that diminish human life. May we also be there to assist women experiencing crisis pregnancies. May we be a Christ-like presence to help reconcile those burdened by guilt and shame over having had an abortion. The Lord's mercy and forgiveness is greater than any sin we can commit if we are humble and contrite. May we be strengthened to put Matthew 25 into practice.

The Church has an excellent pastoral ministry called Project Rachel that can assist in the reconciliation/healing process for those suffering from post-abortion aftermath. 



2022 INTENTIONS GUIDELINES

Mass and Flame of Faith Intentions are now open through **June 2022** and can be accessed on our website or in person. Mass Intentions are Masses prayed for someone and are read during the intercessory prayers at Mass.

Starting with the July Masses, St. Bridget will add a Collective Mass to one of the Sunday Masses each weekend. The Collective Mass will be open to three individuals intentions per Collective Mass for three different families. This will help accommodate the need for more Mass Intentions.

Flame of Faith Intentions are for the Presence Lamp in the Sanctuary and the Vigil Lights in the Adoration Chapel. These burn starting on a Sunday through Saturday for someone.

- •Limit of **8 Mass Intentions per year per family**. Of the 8 Masses, only two can be Sunday Masses or 1 Sunday and 1 Holy Day.
- •The donation for each Mass is \$12.
