Synod on Synodality: As you know, Pope Francis has begun a Synod on Synodality, a two year, worldwide undertaking during which Catholics are being encouraged to offer feedback to the Church through their local dioceses. As part of this process, on each Sunday in February we will reflect on the Synod and its three themes:

February 6: The Synod on Synodality

February 13: The theme of Communion

February 20: The theme of Participation

February 27: The theme of Mission

After each Mass there will be an opportunity for people to remain for questions and answers, comments and discussion. On February 27, a survey will be made available for people to submit their feedback in written form by Palm Sunday, April 10. The results of our survey will be presented to the Synod of Bishops via reports compiled by the Diocese of La Crosse and the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops.

A note from the parish office: Anyone that requested and received a year end donation report for 2020 will be sent a report for 2021 from last year's list. - **St. Kilian's PCCW** is pleased to announce that they will award up to four scholarships of \$250.00 each to graduating high school seniors who are enrolled on a full-time basis in a two or four year college, university or technical college. Eligible students must be:
- 1: Active members of St. Kilian's Parish and regularly attend Mass. They must show involvement in the parish, such as: Mass server, reader, usher, choir member, musician or participant in other parish activities.
- 2: Show strong moral character.
- 3: Show satisfactory academic achievement. Scholarships will be awarded after completion of the first semester and the student remains in good academic standing. Applicants must fill out the application and attach two reference letters from a CCD teacher and/or other Church leader that support the student's parish involvement and good character. Application forms will be available at the parish office or via e-mail. Applications must be sent to the parish office by FEBRUARY 28.

READINGS AND OBSERVANCES

Gospel Meditation February 20, 2022

Sometimes, Jesus' teachings don't seem to make practical sense. When we hear things like love your enemies and do good to them, turn the other cheek when struck, give to anyone who asks, do to others as you would have them do to you, be merciful, stop judging, forgive, and give to others, we get a bit unsettled. After all, it's okay for God to do all of these things, but does He really want us to do them, too? Many good-hearted Christians really draw the line with some of these ideals and say, "No way!" They even remark that if someone did something hurtful to someone they loved, they would have no reservations seeking severe retribution. There is still this persistent thinking, even among those who consider themselves Christian, that a violent action deserves a violent response. Somehow, we continue to justify this.

Yet, it is most clearly against the very grain of the Gospel. Part of our difficulty has more to do with understanding God's love. We wrongly think that sinful or hurtful actions and evil people somehow are seen as lesser in God's eyes. They are not. God loves the sinner as much as He does the saint. And, both of these inclinations exist in every human being, even those who consider themselves holy. Both the capacity for good and the disposition toward evil exist in every one of us. Viktor Frankl has this to say when reflecting on the Holocaust: "Our generation is a realistic generation because we have learned what a human being really is. When all is said and done, man is that same creature who invented the gas-chambers of Auschwitz; but he is also that being who walked upright into those chambers with the prayer 'Shema Yisrael' on his lips." If we believe in God, we have to act like God. Whether we like that idea is another issue. If we don't then perhaps, we need to reconsider our faith and whether we really believe in Jesus Christ. We are made in the image of God, not the image of ourselves. The Christian must, at all costs, leave resentment and the need for retaliation behind, lose defensiveness and bring into the mind and heart the realization of who we represent in this world.


Prayer to St. Michael
