






- Work with the buildings and grounds committee to select and facilitate professional contractors (electrical, plumbing, snow removal, roofing, construction, etc.)



Scrip Coordinator – Summary of Duties Weekly basis (1-2 hours spent per week,

depending on inventory level):

• Email customers that place online orders to inform them when they can

expect their order

- Monitor scrip email box
- Review sales from past week and Inventory on Hand report
- Create purchase orders in Scripware after deciding which vendors to

purchase from and how much to purchase

• Submit purchase requests, either through online submission portals or via

email (there are 3 vendors that require a call)

• Generate documents using Avery to print local vendor cards

• Contact the scrip pickup person to inform them of orders that require

pickup for the week

Monthly basis (typically takes about an hour; optional in terms of frequency):

• Set order points in Scripware based on past sales history

Quarterly basis (takes about an hour):

Run distribution reports and review for accuracy

• Send preliminary reports to school secretary and NE secretary for review

• Contact customers if any corrections need to be made to distribution

reports

• Provide final reports to both secretaries and business manager

Couple of times per year (couple of hours each time):

• Update the printed order forms based on items that are being stocked

and changes to percentages

• Have been stocking items during holiday season (October – December)

that don't stock during the rest of the year In the past, I have also taken care of any marketing efforts. That could certainly be split off to someone else.
