CHRISTMAS 2021 MESSAGE

The love of God was on full display for us in this Advent season. Amidst the darkness of the winter months, the unfortunate tragedies that unfolded, amidst the lowliness of our own hearts at times, God continues to turn the darkness into light, to raise up the lowly, and fill our hearts with hope. For no darkness is too dark, no desert too dry, no creature too lowly. The one who redeems everything is breaking into our world, eager to love us back into wholeness as we proclaimed, "Come, Lord Jesus, come!"

It was John the Baptist who brought to light the one who was to follow him. The one whom he was unworthy to even unfasten the thongs of his sandals. As with all the prophets, John the Baptist had those who liked and followed him, and those who did not. And we might wonder how many people missed the opportunity to encounter God in a new and deeper way. The Gospels are full of accounts of those who missed the opportunity to encounter God himself in the person of Jesus. Similarly, are there ways we may have missed opportunities, in ways we didn't expect, or because we ignored a person or situation. Asking ourselves if we truly sought to encounter God by our participation at Mass and the sacraments, or if we were just too busy to open our hearts and follow him?

God gave us intellect and reason so that we can search for truth. Saint Augustine and Saint Anselm of Canterbury refer to this as "faith seeking understanding." We may not see fire coming down from heaven, but sometimes, isn't there that burning in our hearts when we experience God's presence. These are times when God is present to us, inviting us to dive deeper into our faith and grow closer to him. If we are to continue to call ourselves Catholic Christians, then we know we have to put our faith in to action in order to be fruitful in the kingdom of God. As the psalmist prays, "Lord, make us turn to you; let us see your face and we shall be saved."

In this year of St. Joseph, we have consecrated ourselves and our parish to the trustee of the common treasure of God and man: the person of Jesus Christ. Bishop Jacques Bossuet (+ 1704) was a French bishop, theologian, and renowned orator, who described the great treasures were committed to the trust of St. Joseph. First, was the holy virginity of Mary, which he protected under the veil of marriage. The second, the person of Jesus Christ, whom the heavenly Father placed in St. Joseph's hands so that he may serve as the earthly father of the holy child. The third, and most admirable, was that Joseph was to keep the secret and sanctity of trust as a trustee of God. God's plan was not to reveal the mystery of Jesus Christ to the world before his hour had come. We do not read in the Gospel anywhere where Joseph spoke or whatever happened to him after Jesus began his ministry.

Many good things continue to happen in our parish community that reflect God's presence to us. We encourage your presence, as well, so that we strengthen our praise and worship to please God and to continue to have the ability to touch the lives of so many with the "Good News!"

O Jesus, radiant dawn of our world, herald of beauty, open our eyes to see you.

O Jesus, Word made flesh, voice of God, open our minds to contemplate you.

O Jesus, redeemer of all, hand of salvation, open our hearts to you.

Follow the rhythm of the dance with joy and listen to what the Word who became flesh tells us about what the next steps can be. Today, heaven remains the same, but earth has been profoundly changed.


