



THE FAITHFUL DISCIPLE

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

It was several years ago now, but the scene is still vivid in my mind. My son stood confidently in front of the altar as the music rose in a crescendo and his bride stepped into sight. The love and joy he felt trickled down his cheek as she walked down the aisle. He broke into a smile as she joined him, and proudly took her hand to promise to become one with her forever. Isaiah writes: "As a bridegroom rejoices in his bride so shall your God rejoice in you." Isaiah was talking about the nation of Israel, but God loves and rejoices in each of his children and wants us to know the joy of being loved by him. He generously shares his gifts with us, "different kinds of spiritual gifts but the same Spirit." St. Paul explains to the Corinthians. All spiritual gifts come from God, and all are important and necessary: "To each individual. the manifestation of the Spirit is given for some benefit." God's gifts are distributed uniquely to each person to use in our own unique way to "announce his salvation, day after day," and invite others to discover the joy of his great love.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

You are a masterpiece! This message was conveyed at the camp our diocese held each year to help teens recognize that they are God's beloved sons and daughters, called and gifted by the Holy Spirit to be missionary disciples. Discerning what our gifts are and how to use them can be challenging. The Gospel about the wedding at Cana offers an interesting guide. Mary tells the waiters, "Do whatever he tells you." By reserving time for listening and not speaking during prayer, we can hear what Jesus is "telling" us. Jesus then says to the waiters, "Fill the jars with water." We can "fill our jars" with the knowledge of how to live as disciples by reflecting on Scripture, Finally, Jesus tells the waiters, "Draw some out," We can "draw" on his love for strength and courage when we need it, but more importantly, we are called to "draw some out" to share with others. In sharing the "good wine," the Good News of Jesus Christ, others will begin to believe in him, too.

PRAYER As the new year gets under way, devote time to discerning the unique spiritual gifts, or charisms, you have been given. Make time for silent prayer and reflecting on Scripture each day.

BURN THE MORTGAGE >>>>>LEGACY FUND

Before June 5th, our 175th Anniversary celebration, we will have achieved another milestone for our parish. The original mortgage from six years ago at \$2.4 million will be paid off in FULL! Thanks be to God and thanks to all of you who either contributed to our Capital Campaign, the numerous Burn the Mortgage events and fundraisers, and the numerous memorials given. Overall, a total labor of love for our parish and it's financial well-being! Thanks!

The second of our goals you voted for in our Capital Campaign is our Bell Tower project; to restore the original bells from the old Church and have them ringing the Angelus once again. Shortly, we will secure a local Milwaukee company, one of our parishioners works for them, who have agreed to build the steel tower for us in the \$68,0000 range. In addition, we are currently working with the Verdin Bell Company to obtain a contract where they would provide the bell ringing system, the Carilion system, lighting, and other mechanical and electrical systems. That will probably cost us approximately \$65,000 as well. The project needs to be done well and as you know that will come at a cost. We have raised a little over half of the total project cost, but we can not proceed until we have it fully funded.

In addition to the other goals discussed during our Capital Campaign, included the installation of stained glass in the main window over the sanctuary and the side windows, that did not get accomplished when the new Church was built due to a lack of funds. You have also heard me say that the carpeting in the Narthex of the Church is coming to the end of its life expectancy. The ideal and long-term solution would be to replace it with a hard surface, cleanable material.

With these other projects on the horizon, I am establishing a LEGACY FUND, to assist us in moving forward with these items without incurring debt ever again. So the current BURN THE MORTGAGE fund/account will now be called the LEGACY FUND. Legacy would imply by its' name that we will be leaving our parish in excellent shape for future generations of St. Stephen's parishioners. That is a Legacy we can be proud of! God be with us always!

A very young brother and sister were playing on the beach when the all too familiar ice cream truck made its daily rounds.
