

(Josh.24:1-2.15-18; Ps.34; Eph. 5:21-32; Jn. 6:66-69)

**MAKE A RIGHT CHOICE IN LIFE OF
REMAINING WITH CHRIST ALWAYS!**

Beloved brothers and sisters, on this 21st Sunday of ordinary time, the Holy Mother Church invites and encourages us to always make a right choice in life by the freedom God has given us, to ever remain with Christ the Holy One of God, in every circumstance of life. Of course, after life, freedom is God's greatest gift to us. Here we have the power to choose our freedom to obey or disobey, to do good or to do evil.

The choice to or not to serve God and to follow Christ is the connecting point between the 1st reading and the Gospel of today. Joshua who became the leader of God's people after Moses died, gathering the people together after they had entered the Promised Land to renew their covenant with God put a choice before them: to serve the false gods of their neighbors or to serve the true God of their ancestors, Yahweh. Of course, their descendants were seduced by the pagan practices of the Canaanites and thereby turning away from God. This 1st reading episode prepares us for the Gospel where many of Jesus' disciples turned away from him after his teaching on the Eucharist, while others instead, made a right choice of remaining with him. Both choices were without any compulsions.

Notice that when Jesus saw them leaving after he told them that he was going to give them his flesh to eat and his blood to drink, he asked his apostles if they wanted to leave as well. Interestingly, what Jesus was saying was so serious and no compromise at all, that he was willing to let everyone walk away if they chose to. Dearest ones in Christ, as the hard teaching of Christ made people make their choices, since what they heard was not what they expected to hear from him; when we come to the

crossroad of life, we may be confused about which way to go. But then, these are moments when we must make the right decisions, and the decisions and choices we make at such moments shape our future. Many of us come to Christ thinking that everything must be easy. Some come with a very shallow faith. Yet, some of us come with fixed expectations and just to hear what we wish to hear. So, if our expectations are not met, we quit and bid Christ farewell.

Indeed, we must ask ourselves today. How many times have we abandoned God and his Church (stopped going to Mass), especially at difficult moments in life? Remember that there are inevitable moments in life when the authenticity of our faith and fidelity to God must be tested by the fire of afflictions (1 Pt 1:7). When those moments of faith challenges come, will you walk away just as those disciples who parted company with Jesus or like the apostle Peter and his colleagues standing with Christ say: "Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. You are the Holy One of God." Or, like Joshua say: "As for me and my house, we shall serve the Lord." This is a right choice, let us today reaffirm our faith in Christ wholly: Lord Jesus Christ, I'll continue to remain with you, come what may! May God give us His grace!

EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS

Submission as Stewardship.... We aren't comfortable with the idea of submission. Our society champions equality, and rightly so — but it's a mistake to think that submission is at odds with equality. To submit ourselves fully, we must first be free. We must first be our own masters. God has granted us that freedom with the salvation He offers. We are no longer the slaves of sin. Now He asks us to be subordinate to one another, in the name of Christ. What a completely uncomfortable task! What He's asking is for us to be subordinate to the person who irritates us the most. The person we really can't stand. The person who doesn't respect us or appreciate what we have to offer. The person we think we're smarter than, more talented than. The person we envy.

That's the real challenge of stewardship, isn't it? Subordination. Inconveniencing myself by giving of time, of money, of relationship. Putting the needs or wants of another above my own when they haven't done anything special to earn it. I invite you to consider the cross — the most radical expression of submission, and of stewardship, that ever existed. If there was ever someone who deserved superiority, isn't it the God who let Himself be nailed to a tree, who gave so freely of His life, His body, His blood, His everything? 
