CHRISTMAS, DECEMBER 25, 2021 CHRISTMAS MESSAGE AND GOOD WISHES TO ALL! Dearest brothers and sisters, this is Christmas! We are here at this moment as a way of returning our love and our way of saying thanks to God for sending His Son Jesus to us, out of love. Jesus came because he loves us, and he wants to gather us into his kingdom where there will be no more suffering or hatred or war or pain, ever.

Beloved ones, we indeed rejoice and celebrate these days God's greatest gift to the world, thus, the giving of His only begotten Son Jesus Christ. In fact, we heard in the 1st readings of the Christmas Night, Dawn and Day, the prophecy of Isaiah, the prophet that lived 700 years before Christ, about the coming of a savior and King who would bring redemption, peace, and justice to God's people and whose reign will be forever. And that was fulfilled in the birth of Christ in Bethlehem. This entails that God has proved the depth of his love for us by allowing his own son to be born of a virgin. Therefore, what we celebrate today is love because: "God so loved the world that he sent his only begotten son... (Jn 3: 16). He comes as the Light to show us the way in the darkness of this world. He invites us to join him in the struggle against the evil in our world. He desires greatly that we would accept his offer of friendship unlike many who refuse this. He became as we are so that he knows us from the inside, our struggles, our difficulties, and our joys too. And finally, he wants us to have the enduring love that he has for his Father, so that here and now we may already start experiencing the deep peace and joy he came to bring us at Christmas.

My prayer for you all this Christmas is that you may experience this Divine peace, hope, joy, and love, in your hearts and homes, in order to gently navigate you into and through the new year. Our world needs this even more in 2022, as it did that Holy Night of the first Christmas, as we face the uncertain times in struggles against the pandemic that is ravaging the world. What child is this? This is our Prince of Peace, the one who lifts our hopes, who gives us joy the type which the world cannot give, a love that leaves us speechless! And who are we to receive this gift from on high? Nothing less than God's holy children! What a joy to celebrate. Merry Christmas once again and a prosperous New Year, in advance! 1ST SUN. OF CHRISTMAS, YR. C., DEC. 26, 2021: THE FEAST OF THE HOLY FAMILY OF NAZARETH (1Sam. 1:20-22, 24-28; Ps. 84; 1Jon. 3:1-2, 21-24; Lk. 2:41-52)

Beloved brothers and sisters, today we celebrate the feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph as a model of all Christian families. Pope Francis had reflected on the 1st reading and the Gospel about the image of two families on pilgrimage to the house of God. Elkanah and Hannah bring their son Samuel to the Temple of Shiloh and consecrate him to the Lord (cf. 1 Sam 1:20-22, 24-28). In the same way, Joseph, and Mary, in the company of Jesus, go as pilgrims to Jerusalem for the feast of Passover (cf. Lk 2:41-52). The Holy Father therefore declares, "how important it is for our families to journey together towards a single goal! We know that we have a road to travel together; a road along which we encounter difficulties but also enjoy moments of joy and consolation. And on this pilgrimage of life, we also share in moments of prayer. What can be more beautiful than for a father and mother to bless their children at the beginning and end of each day, to trace on their forehead the sign of the cross, as they did on the day of their baptism? Is this not the simplest prayer which parents can offer for their children? To bless them, that is, to entrust them to the Lord, just like Elkanah and Anna, Joseph and Mary, so that he can be their protection and support throughout the day."

Keeping in mind that the family life is rooted in the unconditional love of God as witnessed by the Holy Family, we know equally that one of the major threats facing families today is simply; that we don't spend enough time together. We are so busy working, or socializing, or watching TV, or on the phone calls, that we have less and less time for each other. What a pity! Indeed, in our world today, more than ever, the family is under tremendous attack because the Evil One knows that it is the very basis of society. What a great responsibility for all of you who are parents! You are the first and most important teachers and models in the lives of your children. Your vocation is no less important than that of a priest, religious or lay person. It is just a different way of responding to your baptismal calling. To ensure a healthy family, keep to these 2 guiding principles at the top of your family relationships: keep God first and love one another. May God bless our families!


