NEW YEAR, JANUARY 1, 2022, SOLEMNITY OF MARY MOTHER OF GOD (Num. 6:22-27; Gal. 4:4-7; Lk. 2:16-21) Mary Mother of God

Beloved brothers and sisters, on this 1st day of January in the new year of 2022, the Holy Mother Church celebrates the Solemnity of MARY MOTHER OF GOD. The Church confesses that the Word uniting to himself in his person the flesh animated by a rational soul, became man... Mary truly became the Mother of God by the human conception of the Son of God in her womb... (cf. CCC. 466). Mary is not divine but she as close to divinity as any creature can get. She is the daughter of the Father, the mother of the Son and the spouse of the Holy Spirit. The insistence on Mary's creature hood far from detracting from our love of her only makes our relationship more intimate. She really is one of us. In Jesus, born of Mary, God's ancient promise and blessing is fulfilled. God has revealed His face to us in Mary's child, born of at the appointed time. Mary pondered these great mysteries in her heart: the great things the Lord had done in her life and what privileges she had been given to be called "Mother of God." Mary is mother of God and we are children of God which we must remember always. It is not celebrated as a Holy Day of Obligation this year in the U.S. because it falls on Saturday but we're encouraged to attend Mass of the Solemnity this day. All generations now have called her blessed, and so do we on this day, at the opening of the year. Happy New Year to everyone!

THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD, JANUARY 2, 2022 (Is. 60:1-6; Eph. 3:2-3a; Mt. 2:1-12)

On this Sunday, January 2, the Holy Mother Church celebrates the Feast of the Epiphany of the Lord. Epiphany from its Greek meaning and in the context of the Christian celebration is the commemoration of the manifestation, or showing forth, of the glory of God in Jesus Christ, the Eternal Word of God made flesh. Here we commemorate especially the coming of the wise men. In the 1st reading of today, the Prophet tries to encourage God's people and assure them that Jerusalem would again be a great city. He sees Jerusalem becoming a light for the world. His vision is that the Jews would no longer be the only people to learn about God and worship God, but people from all nations to visit Jerusalem to be nourished by God's word and to worship at God's holy temple. St. Matthew, in today's Gospel sees the visit of the Magi to the infant Jesus as the fulfillment of the words of the prophet. "When Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, in the days of Herod the King, behold, there came wise men from the East to Jerusalem, saying, Where is he that is born King of the Jews? For we have seen his star in the east, and are come to worship him?" (Mt. 2:1-2). Doesn't this sound like what we come to Mass to do? We gather in prayer, we sing a few songs, we listen to God's word, and we adore and receive Jesus once again in the Eucharist as he makes himself known to us. Just as the wise men, we offer him our love and our praise and our treasure. May the glory of Christ shine in our lives all through the New Year!

GRATITUDE: A couple of events took place in our parish within the season of Advent and leading up to our Christmas/New Year celebrations. My parish home visits/family blessings have been awesome so far. I hope to begin again towards the spring of 2022.
