From Rabbi Jessica Barolsky

At the very end of April, we held our first service in the sanctuary in over a year. There were about ten

people in the room, including our clergy and a few officers and committee chairs who joined us for the spirituality of the moment, as well as to give feedback and suggestions on the old-but-new format of being in a room together. Thanks to the behind the scenes work of Bob Brazner, Andrew Appel, Larry Phillabaum, and countless others, the sanctuary is now wired to be integrated with zoom, so those in the sanctuary can hear those on zoom—and see them on the big screen that is now a semi-permanent fixture—and those on zoom can hear and see those at microphones in the sanctuary.

There were tears in my eyes at many times during that first sanctuary service. I teared up the first time people responded to me; I said "Shabbat shalom," and I heard voices respond "Shabbat shalom" back to me. I teared up when I heard others respond "amen" to a blessing. I teared up when I turned to face the ark, and the ark, in all its glory, was right there. I teared up when I spoke of that week's Torah portion, which mentioned the ner tamid, the eternal light, which was shining above us. I almost teared up as I got ready for the next service, back to fully on Zoom.

We are in a period of transition. Services that are partly in-person are increasing in frequency; services that are fully accessible from Zoom and live-streaming are not going away.

There is discussion of in-person meetings, which doesn't seem quite as terrifying as it did a few months ago. The weather is finally turning warmer, bringing with it the promise of outdoor gatherings.

Even the most welcome transitions are still stressful and hard. We are all trying to figure out what is safe and what is reckless, what is cautious and what is stifling. To state the obvious, those lines are in a different place for everyone, and they are moving constantly. Our tradition teaches us that we aim for the middle between extremes. That middle means that some will think we are reopening too much

those who attended, both in person and online. Being together with other congregants and our clergy, and seeing our beautiful sanctuary with our Torah scrolls made us realize how attached we are to each other and to our building. Perhaps Covid helped us realize we had taken both a bit for granted. Despite our year-long separation, we are still worshipping together, learning together, and serving together. Now we look forward to getting together.

The only thing more exciting than the prospect of getting together at our physical home is the prospect of getting together there when it's free and clear. I want to take this opportunity to express sincere appreciation for those who have already participated in our campaign, regardless of the dollar amount. If the matching challenge is fully met, we will have raised more than two-thirds of our goal! This will be a great accomplishment! But we have a way to go to meet that challenge, and even further to go to meet the challenge of 100% participation. Satisfying our current debt obligation is critical to our financial future, and will provide us the flexibility and strength we will need to adapt to post-Covid synagogue life. 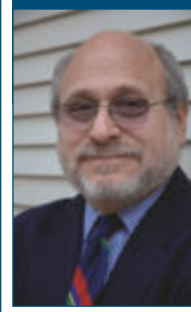

to retire the mortgage." At the present time, approximately ten percent of our membership has stepped up and contributed to our current campaign to retire the mortgage on our synagogue building.

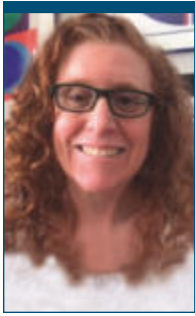

mindset that will help them utilize their Jewish wisdom to navigate the world, to develop their identities, to develop their values, develop their passions, to build community and to think creatively about the problems they face in society, to bring that Jewish lens to bear because there is so much richness, so many texts and so many ideas that can help us in this moment...

This June like each June, Directors of Lifelong Learning are doing what they normally do, wrapping up the current academic year while at the same time already working on the next academic year. We pull out our end of the year check list and our start of the year check list and begin: inventory supplies – check, meet with each teacher individually after they complete their end of year packet – check, etc. Well, maybe even that second example isn't exactly the same as our teachers are meeting with me on Zoom and some of them live in different states or different countries. So, we are possibly doing what we normally do perhaps in new ways and perhaps in new places.

Many, because of this year not being like other years, are also reflecting upon what some have been calling the "Covid keepers." What have we learned this year or what new things have we done this year do we want to bring with us into the next phase of our life, what some are calling the "new normal": Personally? Professionally? In our institutions?

This year I have been so blessed to work at CEEBJ. All of you (the Lifelong Learning Committee, Board of Trustees, parents, learners of all ages, teachers, madrichim, the staff, Andrew, Cantor Barash, Rabbi

Barolsky, and Rabbi Berkson) were willing to see this challenge as an opportunity and to experiment in different ways with what Jewish learning could look like; with where, when, and how Jewish learning and living could be; and in the end with what Jewish learning and engagement is. We continued to build community. We learned more about ourselves. For some, Judaism became more relevant and more fun. Thank you to everyone who participated in any of these experiments from Romemu to the Elul Daily Videos, from Food for Our Souls to Dr. Betsy Stone's scholar-in-residence weekend tied into the *middah of ometz lev* as she addressed, "There's a Reason It Hurts This Much: What Trauma is Doing to Our Brains."

So, now I hope you will join me and the Lifelong Learning committee at our Dream Big sessions so we can discover what our CEEBJ "Covid keepers" are and dream even bigger for this upcoming year. We will share what some of the best thinkers are philosophizing, such as Dr. Miriam Heller-Stem, whom you can hear first hand on June 1 at 6:30 pm through HUCConnects. See page 5 to learn more. We will share a few ideas we are exploring. Most of the time, though, we will ask a few lead questions, be quiet, and take notes so we can learn from you. (You the Romemu parents, you the adult learners, you the Romemu learners, you the teens, you the MJDS parents, you the early childhood parents) Please note, if this format doesn't work for you, please feel free to contact me at scosden@ceebj.org or Jody Lansing at lansingfam@gmail.com and we will be glad to set up a one on one appointment with a member of our Dream Big team. In addition, we will be sending out Dream Big surveys as well. We hope to wrap up our Dream Big gathering by July 2 so we can make some Big announcements about the 5782 (2021-2022) learning year in July and August. In addition to the Dream Big Project, did you know that the Lifelong Learning Committee has partnered with me to start two new task forces, one short-term and one long-term? Yes, the short-term task force is working on creating a b'nai mitzvah handbook and website resource page for our families and the long-term

task force is addressing the Social Emotional Spiritual Learning (SESL) at CEEBJ and is chaired by Dr. Sherry Blumberg and Jennifer Winterfield. To learn more about SESL we hope you can attend the HUCConnects program on June 29, as described on page 5.

I believe this year we began to help our learners/help each other create this mindset that Dr. Heller-Stem describes. Now some of the questions are: What are the next steps for each of our learners on their/our Jewish Journey? How can we best support them/us on that journey individually, as a family, and within community? How do we help them/us to continue to expand their/our circles of caring? How do we help them/us to find their/our purpose and authentic/Higher self?

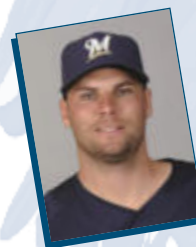

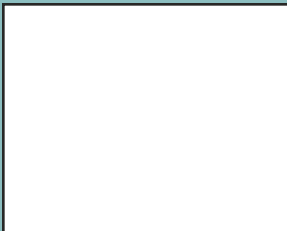
Our garden is complete and the veggies have been planted. We will need help watering the garden throughout the summer. Please let me know if you can help.

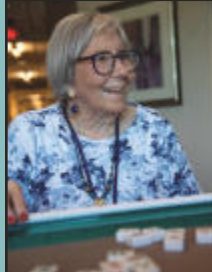
