John 17:3

This year we are beginning to live into the new FLC vision. A vision gives us direction and inspires us to act. At its heart what leaders of First Lutheran Church have envisioned is that we will become intentional about living like Christ.

Now, as April begins, we arrive at the heart of Holy Week, where we experience the depth of Jesus' self-offering in love. The whole journey of Lent has been encouraging us to notice and pay attention to the way that Jesus lives and loves, in relation to God and each person he encounters. Jesus' repeated invitation is to embrace this way of being and to live like him.

How do we learn this? How can we become intentional about following him?

During the time I lived in Racine, for several years I met my friend Jim almost every week for lunch. He directed a local community choir, so we shared common musical interests and pursuits. Jim also worked as the founding director of a nonprofit business that helps people without a work history to find sustainable jobs. Every week we would get together and share stories about music-making and what was happening with our work and our families. Always, these conversations led to a deeper reflection on how God was at work in the joys and challenges of the week.

The mission of Jim's nonprofit was focused on helping people get jobs, but he always insisted that the real work was transforming lives. For him the Racine Vocational Ministry was clearly a ministry. He heard and saw God at work in the people he encountered every day, and he helped them to see and recognize this too.

Our weekly lunch conversations were times of mutual mentoring, during which we encouraged one another to know God at work in our own lives and to grow deeper in the ways we sensed God calling us to live the way of Jesus. I regularly left those conversations with a new insight, greater clarity, or a renewed feeling of hope, ready to take the next steps. We often expressed to each other our gratitude for being able to share the journey together.

In John's Gospel the heart of the matter is the life that Jesus has come to share with the world. Praying for his friends and followers, Jesus identifies life with knowing God. "Eternal life is to know you." For the writer of John's Gospel, this is a deep, experiential knowing. Jesus shares that experience with his disciples on the way, through shared daily life and intimate conversation. I sense that relationships of mutual mentoring, as I experienced with my friend Jim, are one of the best ways we have to nurture a community that becomes intentional about living like Christ.

*Who helps you to reflect on your experiences and notice God at work, to embrace challenges and grow deeper in trust, to live more fully into the way of Christ?*

*Who do you encourage to live with the freedom and love of Christ?*





## **How to activate LUAD (Lutherans United Assisting After Disasters) in case of a disaster**

### **Message from LUAD President, Tom Irwin:**

As I write this article, I am grateful for the weather during the first two weeks of March. Here in the northern area of our synod (Beaver Dam) the temperatures have been ideal for the slow reduction of our snow-pack. The river looks good and the lake level does not seem to have risen. Meanwhile, east facing lawns now show green grass and the farm fields have dirt showing.

One thing we have learned from the past few years is that flooding and other weather-related disasters can occur at any time. If flooding should occur (or any other weather disaster) it is important that survivors, synod churches, and volunteers know how to reach LUAD so we can help. Here are five ways to reach LUAD:

Ideally a local congregation would contact either the synod office or LUAD directly. For example, if flood damage occurred in Beaver Dam, either First Lutheran or St. John's Lutheran would contact the synod office or LUAD. LUAD is set up to serve communities through their local ELCA congregations. In order to activate LUAD we need a sponsoring congregation. The sponsoring congregation gives us a place to meet, when possible serves lunch to volunteers and with LUAD's help applies to the synod for LUAD disaster funds.

It is important to know that LUAD serves the whole community, not just Lutherans. We work with local emergency offices. You don't have to be Lutheran to help. Friends from other denominations can volunteer.

Let us hope and pray for a disaster free year in throughout the synod area but know that we are ready and eager to help if necessary.

The FLCW Board met March 3, 2021 in the Fellowship Hall, First Lutheran Church wearing masks and practicing safe distancing. Twelve people were present representing the 5 remaining Circles, board officers, committee chairman and one staff representative (Renee).

A person or people willing to oversee the Lutheran World Relief project is/are still needed. This job would include checking with the various Circles and individuals who pack each World Relief kit to monitor their progress, help pack up the kits for shipment when due (think it is September) and deliver the packed boxes to the location for shipment in Madison. People

in charge of each kit area are listed in the FLCW Handbook. Please contact Jan Pinnow 352-7022 if you would be interested in taking this part of the WWR project over.

Donations collected at Circle meetings and other functions should be converted to a check made out to FLCW and accompanied by the newly developed "contribution form" before taking them to the office to be left for the FLCW Treasurer. Cash is not secure in that mailbox. Forms were handed out at the March 3 meeting. More are available in the church office.

Updating the FLCW Handbook and deciding upon donating quilts locally were topics tabled until the May meeting.

Page 12 of the FLCW handbook lists church members and the time periods they are responsible for sending birthday cards to members over 90. Ruth Keehn has volunteered to be responsible for April-September. If you know members who have turned 90 since 2019, please call Ruth (752-7303) to get their name on the list.

About 65 cookbooks remain to be sold for \$10 each. A label has been placed in the front cover of these listing the corrections. Labels are available from the church office (some will be in the plastic bin), at Jeannine Bown's (call first 754-2071) or will be sent if you call Jeanette (868-4240) for cookbooks sold earlier.

## Second Harvest: Another Way to Help

Are you feeling cooped up inside? Looking to help others? If so, Mat and I invite you to join us in our new adventure with Second Harvest. In addition to helping with our monthly food distribution at First, we have begun to drive to Madison once each week to help organize and package the food that goes out to sites like ours.

The first week we opened a box of 138 frozen hamburgers, cracked them apart, put them into bags of 7 or 8, and then sealed the bags shut. Those bags were put back into the boxes and we sealed them shut for shipment out. Second Harvest supplied gloves to keep our hands warm and all necessary supplies. Mat was a pro after the first box. I, on the other hand, fought, for most of my shift, with the machine that sealed them shut.

This week we created variety packs of frozen items donated by area businesses. After checking for expiration dates, our goal was to take the truly random array of items, pack an assortment into plastic garbage bags which were placed into boxes for delivery.

The Second Harvest website makes this whole process very easy. We are able to sign up for any open 3.5 hour shift (either AM or PM) that needs to be filled at one of three sites: Stoughton, the Alliant Center, or Dairy Drive in Madison. We prefer to drive to the Dairy Drive location because it is just off the Stoughton Road exit, requiring only a minute of Beltline driving and avoiding heavy traffic.

COVID precautions are enforced, helping us to feel very comfortable. The staff has been welcoming, providing instruction and guidance as needed. **If you are interested, but would like to hear a bit more about our experience, feel free to call on my cell: 608-449-7722.**

So many people living with food insecurities count on Second Harvest Food Bank. The need for volunteers is never-ending. Every shift **is** an adventure... new tasks, new people, and new ways to serve.
