

PASTOR CLAY'S COLUMN



In Praise of Gifted Teachers

I suppose we all remember fondly a teacher from our past. As a first grader, I fell in love with Mrs. Sosinski, I was so smitten that on

one non-school occasion, I saw her with her husband and my little six year-old heart was broken with my first tinge of jealousy. But, she was a great teacher and ignited in me the desire to read, do arithmetic, and learn about science and art.

Here at Trinity, we are gifted with many great teachers. Some are still in classrooms and others are retired. I keep hearing stories of how effective and beloved they are or have been. Some of our teachers are very much hard at work. I am thinking especially of those in our Trinity Learning Center and Preschool.

As you know by now, we are engaged in a special fundraising appeal in support of our school. With that in mind, I want to tell you about (actually, I want to brag a bit) about our TLC & P teaching staff. We have 22 teachers and staff who work with our community children from age 6 weeks through 4 year old Kindergarten. Some of them are fairly new. Others have been with us as many as 18 years. Most have been with us 4-5 years. Our teachers not only do child care, they also teach the children many things: cooperation, kindness, helpfulness, and exercise. The older children are also learning to sing, the rudiments of reading, and the joys of working together. The teachers are also trained to keep the children safe, provide emotional support, and help families deal with challenging behaviors. All of our teachers have gone through rigorous mandated training and some have college degrees.

As you may have heard, Wisconsin Child Care Centers are monitored by a state organization called YoungStar. They visit schools and centers, giving advice on best practices and evaluating how the centers are doing. They have a five -tier rating system. For a very long time, our school was rated as a Four Star learning center. Recently, even in the face of the pandemic, our teachers have worked together to achieve a Five Star rating. This is the highest rating they can achieve. What's more, among the Five Star centers in the state, YoungStar assesses even more carefully. We are

proud to say that the Trinity Learning Center is deemed to be one of the finest learning centers in the entire state. That is an astonishing accomplishment. You can see why I am so proud of our team.

I want to thank our team here today. Amy Kurkowski has been doing an outstanding job as our school director, ably assisted by Miss Melissa (I'll use the names that the children know them by). Our kitchen staff is Miss Kris and Miss Deb. Our infant care is handled by Miss Kelly and Miss Corinne. One-year-olds are cared for by Miss Tiffany and Miss Bobbi. Miss Amanda and Miss Hannah work with our two-year-olds. Three-year-old children are shepherded by Miss Millissa and Miss Christina. And, our four-year-old Kindergarten teachers are Miss Taylor and Miss Katrina.

Additionally we have several teachers that help out in several areas, depending on daily needs: Miss Amy, Miss Britny, Miss Grace, Miss Laine, Miss Caelyn, Miss Sarena, and Miss Heather. I hope you will join me in praying for our wonderful teachers and the children they care for, and in supporting our special



fund-raising appeal which will support their work.

Dear friends,

Warm greetings from Johannesburg. Schools, businesses and church activities are starting up again after a month-long summer break over Christmas and New Year.

The fourth wave of the COVID-19 pandemic caused by the Omicron variant seems to have peaked in the region as the number of cases declines and vaccination rates increase. However, the loss of life due to COVID complications, the effects on the economy, and people's jobs and income is still very dire. We are also seeing famine due to climate-change in parts of Angola and Madagascar as well as heavy rains and floods, in the central parts of Southern Africa, damaging homes and crops. Companion churches are assessing the needs and applying to the ELCA for Lutheran Disaster Response funds to assist affected communities.

We give thanks to God for the life and bold witness of Anglican Archbishop-emeritus Desmond Tutu who passed away on the 26th of December 2021 at the age of 90. His memoir, "No Future Without Forgiveness" (Random House:1999), which focuses on his work as chair of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission and the struggle against apartheid and for human rights everywhere, continues to inspire and challenge me and many others.

I remember many meetings, starting in the early 1980's, when Tutu was serving then as the general secretary of the South African Council of Churches. In July of 2016 Rev. Malpica Padilla (Global Mission Executive Director), Ms. Padilla, Ms. Norman and I visited St. George's Cathedral in Cape Town when the Archbishop was presiding at the Eucharist.





Our cash grocery donations during March will go to Interfaith Food Pantry. Located in Plover, Interfaith Food Pantry (IFP) distributes food on the second and fourth Tuesdays each month.

They tailor the amount of food given out to the size of the family receiving it. On February 8, 161 families received an average of 60 pounds of food. That amount varies depending on the size and average age of the family receiving the food.

Right now they have enough nonperishable food on their shelves. But a high need is for milk. Mel Dow, the coordinator of IFP, spends about \$400 for milk for each distribution day. He also purchases about 200 dozen eggs for each "pantry." Finally, your donations can help pay for utilities for the IFP building. Thank you for your ongoing contributions to help feed our neighbors in Portage County.

She has been able to grow a variety of vegetables on a small plot of land close to Des Moines, Iowa. She sells her produce at a farmers' market and her family has access to fresh, healthy food.

2022 Synod Assembly Service Project



This year's Synod Assembly service project will be partnering with Sleep in Heavenly Peace, a non-profit committed to making sure no child has to sleep on the floor by building twin-sized bunk beds. East Central Synod of Wisconsin will be partnering with SHP in hosting a build day for twenty beds (or more) to be given to local children in need of a proper place to sleep. Each bed costs approximately \$250 to build, including building materials, tools, storage and delivery, and training volunteers. These are solidly built bunk beds meant to last for years. St. Andrew's in Oshkosh will be hosting the build–date tbd.

How can the congregations in our synod help out?

We need help in three different ways:

- Donations to fund a build day. We need \$5,000 (or more) to host a build day for this great cause. (\$250/ bed x 20= \$5,000). If you would like to donate a monetary gift please designate that it is for the Synod Assembly Service Project on your donation to Trinity Lutheran Church. Please get your donation to Trinity by Sunday, May 8th.
- 2. We also need volunteers! It would be great to have volunteers from all over the synod gather for the actual build day (to be scheduled) ahead of this year's Assembly. We're also hoping at least one person from each conference can join our service project planning committee to share information and build excitement in your area.
- 3. A bed isn't really fit for sleep without bedding! We're hoping to collect twin-sized sheets and comforters, as well as pillows, to make these beds comfy and cozy for the children who will receive them. Items will then be gathered for the assembly and given to SHP for the beds.

Interesting Titles


