

PASTOR CLAY'S

COLUMN

This is the date that Norwegian Evangelical Lutheran Church was founded in Stevens Point. The first pastor was The Rev. N. Berge and all of the services were held in the Norwegian language (which was, as the people of the time noted, the language that God spoke). Eventually, services were offered in English and in 1898, the congregation changed its name to Trinity Lutheran Church.

For those who are quick with arithmetic, you may have already noticed that our congregation will be 150 years old in April of 2023. That time is fast approaching, which means it is time to start planning a Sesquicentennial Anniversary Celebration. I would like to start the effort off by asking if we have any folks in the congregation who would like to be part of planning our anniversary celebrations. This work is not for everyone. Most of us have at least a passing interest in such historical connections. But some have special interests and skills for memorializing these kinds of events. If you are such a person, or know of someone you would like to nominate, I would love to hear from you.

In 1999, there was a 125th year anniversary celebration. We still have the historical book that was published at the time, listing the names of all Trinity pastors, as well as milestones. On its first page, there was a list of celebration events. They were scheduled from early February through the end of May, when the Bishop came to preach. I am sure that many of you will remember those events. I am hoping that we can do as well this time around as we lift up the wonderful history of our congregation and engage the entire city in this historic moment.

I look forward to hearing from all of you who are feeling called to help us all celebrate. Thank you in advance.

Dear friends,

Spare my rights! Love heals, not hurts! No to violence – We want Peace! Enough is enough! Women's lives matter! This must stop – End Gender-based violence!

These were some of the powerful messages of resistance and hope displayed on the posters carried by conference participants as they walked together on International Women's Day (March 8, 2022).



More than 30 Lutheran and Moravian women pastors and church leaders from the Southern Africa region gathered in person for the first time in two years for the LUCSA Gender Justice and Women's Empowerment Consultation Johannesburg, South Africa from March 6-10. The theme of the conference was: "A Gender-just church today, for sustainable Mission tomorrow." [The Lutheran Communion in Southern Africa (LUCSA) is the sub-regional expression of the Lutheran World Federation comprised of 15 member churches in ten countries across Southern Africa www.lucsa.org]

Several of the pastors present were recognized and congratulated for their courage and faith being the very first women to be ordained in their respective churches.

The program included devotions, Bible studies, lively singing, guest speakers, group discussions and the sharing of stories of suffering, faith, hope and resistance in the face of gender-based violence, patriarchy, exploitation and inequality.

The annual consultation is part of LUCSA's strategy to equip member churches with institutional and personal competencies to achieve gender justice, transformation, peace, justice and sustainable development in church and society.

The ELCA is committed to accompanying companion churches as they faithfully engage in proclamation of the Gospel, mission outreach and work to mitigate the impact of poverty, HIV&AIDS, climate change, Gender-based violence, conflict and the COVID-19 pandemic in the communities they serve.

Salvation Army

During the month of April our grocery donations – both actual groceries or cash - will go to the Salvation Army. Now that restrictions at our church have been lifted we will again accept grocery donations in the grocery cart by the elevator.

The grocery items listed below will be used to make bag lunches to be given to local residents who stop by the Hope Center requesting a meal. Requests include: gravy packets, sweet and sour sauce, jello and pudding mixes, jelly, egg noodles, sauerkraut, canned peas and carrots. Non-food items requested include: paper towels, toilet paper, quart and sandwich zip lock plastic bags, dish soap, napkins, window cleaner, bathroom cleaner and floor cleaner.

Presently the Hope Center is about three quarters full. When the warming center closes in April that will increase the population to four people per room.

Now that we are collecting groceries again, volunteers are needed to deliver groceries to the food pantries at the end of each month. If you are interested please contact Janet Swiston.

2022 Synod Assembly Service Project



This year's Synod Assembly service project will be partnering with Sleep in Heavenly Peace, a non-profit committed to making sure no child has to sleep on the floor by building twin-sized bunk beds. East Central Synod of Wisconsin will be partnering with SHP in hosting a build day for twenty beds (or more) to be given to local children in need of a proper place to sleep. Each bed costs approximately \$250 to build, including building materials, tools, storage and delivery, and training volunteers. These are solidly built bunk beds meant to last for years. St. Andrew's in Oshkosh will be hosting the build–date tbd.

How can the congregations in our synod help out?

We need help in three different ways:

- Donations to fund a build day. We need \$5,000 (or more) to host a build day for this great cause. (\$250/ bed x 20= \$5,000). If you would like to donate a monetary gift please designate that it is for the Synod Assembly Service Project on your donation to Trinity Lutheran Church. Please get your donation to Trinity by Sunday, May 8th.
- 2. We also need volunteers! It would be great to have volunteers from all over the synod gather for the actual build day (to be scheduled) ahead of this year's Assembly. We're also hoping at least one person from each conference can join our service project planning committee to share information and build excitement in your area.
- 3. A bed isn't really fit for sleep without bedding! We're hoping to collect twin-sized sheets and comforters, as well as pillows, to make these beds comfy and cozy for the children who will receive them. Items will then be gathered for the assembly and given to SHP for the beds.

LUTHERAN DISASTER RESPONSE EASTERN EUROPE CRISIS -UKRAINE

On February 24, Russian forces invaded Ukraine, launching attacks across the country, including on the capital of Kyiv and other major cities. Airports are shut, and few railway lines are operational. Millions of civilians fleeing the violence are heading toward Ukraine's western districts and neighboring countries. Over 300 civilians have been killed so far, and damage to civilian infrastructure has left hundreds of thousands of people without water or electricity. Ukrainian men of military age (18-60) are forbidden to leave the country, so most of those fleeing are women and children. According to the United Nations High Commission for Refugees, more than 2 million people are seeking refuge in neighboring countries including Hungry, Poland, Slovakia, Moldova and Romania. There are major humanitarian concerns for both internally displaced people and refugees. Many Ukrainians fleeing their homes need shelter and such basic necessities as food, water and toiletries. Care also includes pastoral and psychological support to address the trauma endured.

Lutheran Disaster Response is accompanying our companions in Ukraine, Hungry, Poland and Slovakia, as well as our ecumenical partners - Lutheran World Federation and Church World Service, in their humanitarian responses to the crisis. Together we are providing refugees with support and supplies such as food, blankets, water and hygiene kits.

Please pray for those in Eastern Europe who have been affected by the crisis in Ukraine. May God's healing presence give them peace and hope in their time of need.



Bringing a baby into the world can be a difficult and scary thing for a mother living in poverty. Keeping a new baby healthy, clean and comfortable can take a lot of resources. The items included in the Baby Care Kit provide the basics a family needs to care for their babies.

We are coming unto the Rummage Sale season and for those who like to check them out here are some things that are needed for these kits: cotton t-shirts; sleepers without feet; baby socks. All items must be in good condition (no stains or tears), sizes 6-24 months.

Last year we made 143 layettes. That requires a lot of items. Some are used (in good condition) and most items are purchased such as flannel for blankets, diapers, towels, soap and diaper pins. Many items are purchased with the Action Team projects from Thrivent. Let me know if you could do one of these projects. It's very easy to do and would be a big contribution to our kits.

Easter falls on April 17 so you still have time to check our library's Easter collection in the Subject Catalog. Here are three I recently enjoyed:

Primary

The Sparrow's Easter Song (Pri Ada) by Michelle Medlock Adams

Adams is a journalist and author of over 90 books, many of which are Christian stories for children. <u>The Sparrow's</u> <u>Easter Song</u> presents the Easter story in a rhyme as told by a small sparrow to his animal friends. Maybe it's a house sparrow since that's the most common breed of sparrow found in Israel. The book is appropriate for children old enough to comprehend a difficult story that is made easier by the use of animal friends and colorful illustrations.

What gift is the sparrow given for his part in spreading the "Good News" of the miracle that came to pass?

Intermediate

Ride On! Ride On! (Int Mar) By Sylvia Parson Martin

Yes, the title is from a familiar hymn and story is told in Mark 11:1-10. This delightful story of the first Palm Sunday is told through the eyes of a young boy, Jairus, who desperately wants to ride his donkey colt, Shimri. But his father insists the time is not yet right. Curl up together on the couch with your son or daughter and listen to the story. It will give you the opportunity to explain some concepts like "breaking" a horse/donkey or the history of the Passover. And, as the editor writes, "Ride On!" will teach children the virtue of patience and joy of being chosen for the Lord's Service. Why was the time not yet right?

Non-fiction

<u>The First Easter</u> (263 Mar) from the Sermons of Peter Marshall edited by Catherine Marshall In 1937 Peter Marshall became pastor of the New York Avenue Presbyterian Church in Washington, DC, and in 1946 was appointed as a US Senate Chaplain, serving from January 4, 1947, until his sudden death of a heart attack two years later, at age 46.

Find a quiet place, a time when you can be alone to absorb the beauty of this small book. Mrs. Marshall has taken excerpts from many of Dr. Marshall's Easter sermons to give us this magnificent dramatic telling of Passion Week, from the Last Supper to the events following Christ's resurrection. A gifted story teller, Marshall weaves together Biblical quotations, past events in Christ's, Roman history, and his own commentary.
