

A Season of Change

At this time of year, we are giving thanks for the change of seasons. Gone (we hope!) are the days of snow, sleet, and dreary weather. The flowers and budding leaves are a sure sign that God is renewing the earth.

There will also be a few changes happening in our ministry this spring, especially as we turn our thoughts to the summer. First, we are undertaking a full search for a permanent Choir and Band Director. Kelly Nielsen has served us faithfully this winter and spring as she assumed the duties of Interim Director. We have established a search committee and will be advertising our position in regional and state-wide publications. For those who have deeply appreciated Kelly's ministry among us, she will continue on into the summer as we conduct the search. Kelly is also eligible to apply for the position, and we hope that she does. We hope to make an announcement of a permanent hire in the summer. If you know of any good candidates, please pass them along to me.

The worship committee has been discussing another change for the summer. In the past, we have always gone from two Sunday services to one service at 9 am. Starting June 12th, we will be returning to that practice. You may be thinking that this is not a change because this has been our usual practice for years. That is correct. So, the change I am talking about here is simply the non-change of changing our summer worship times. Did that make sense? (In case it didn't: summer worship time will be 9 a.m. each Sunday, starting June 12th.)

Perhaps the most welcome change I want to offer is the move from our pandemic protocols to something resembling NORMAL. We have been moving in this direction for a few months now. Praying that we do not get hit with another variant or wave, we anticipate that this fall, we will be holding all of our usual ministries: Sunday School, Adult Education, Fellowship Hour after the first service, Youth Ministry, and the full re-use of our building. Again, this announcement is tentative because we cannot fully predict how things will be over the summer. But we pray that after two and a half years of extreme caution and prudence, all of this will come to an end. Please join me in praying that this plan will hold and that our fall will have us living, worshiping, and serving in all our usual and joyful ways.

With the topic of refugees and immigrants in the forefront of our news, I would like to share a few of these books in our library.

Strength in What Remains (305.89 Kid) by Tracy Kidder is a biography of a young Burundi medical student who in 1994 flees a civil war and the genocide in neighboring Rwanda. He makes his way to Europe and then to New York City. He works part-time jobs and sleeps in the park. With the help of strangers he is able to find a place to live and continue his medical studies. He graduated from Columbia, and enrolled at the Harvard School of Public Health, specializing in infectious diseases. Throughout his narrative he refers back to the conditions in the refugee camps and the life he was forced to live in Africa. He becomes a U. S. citizen in 2007. He is able to return and build clinics in towns where he and family members lived.

<u>Chasing the Moon</u> (F Boe) by Carolyn K. Boehlke is a Young Adult novel about 15-year-old Nadia from southern Mexico. She and her family sneak into the U. S. for a better life. As an illegal immigrant she finds work with a cruel farmer in Arizona. She runs away and makes her way to Minneapolis, working as a hotel maid and facing many hardships. She misses her family who were caught and sent back to Mexico. She wonders whether she has truly found "that better life" they were all seeking.

<u>Americanah</u> (F Adi) by Chimamanda Ngozi Adichie is written by a woman who grew up in Nigeria. The novel begins with a young Nigerian woman getting ready to return to her home country. She has come to the United 3

States to attend a university, becoming acutely aware of being Black. She looks back on her life in both countries, the loves lost and the experiences shared.

For our younger readers and listeners:

<u>The Sky of Afghanistan</u> (Pri deE) by Ana A. deEulate A girl dreams of flying like a kite over her country that she loves, Afghanistan. She dreams that the sounds of war are gone, that doors are opened for her to learn, and for peace to return.

<u>My Name is Sangoel</u> (Pri Wil) by Karen Lynn Williams After his father is killed in the war Sangoel leaves a Sudanese refugee camp with his mother and sister for America. As they settle into their new home he finds everyone he comes in contact with struggles to pronounce his name. In school as he learns English he decides to draw pictures on his t-shirt instead of writing his name. He draws a sun and a soccer goal. The other students think this is a great idea, and they do the same with their names.

<u>I'm New Here</u> (Pri OBr) by Anne Sibley O'Brien We meet Maria from Guatemala, Jin from Korea, and Fatimah from Somalia. They share their feelings as they struggle to fit in to a new community. They all find their place in their new schoolroom.

<u>The Name Jar</u> (Pri Cho) by Yangsook Choi Unhei and her family come to America from Korea. She wants to pick an American name. When asked her name at school she says she doesn't know, because she hasn't chosen one yet. Her classmates put together a glass jar with names in for her to pick from. After several days she decides to stay with her Korean name, which means *grace*.


