PALM/PASSION SUNDAY | Holy Week begins on "Palm/Passion Sunday." This day commemorates two very significant events in the life of Christ—joining Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem, when the crowd had palm branches and the proclamation of the passion. Traditionally, the Passion is read on this Sunday because otherwise wouldn't be read on a Sunday at all, since the next Sunday is about the Resurrection.



Everyone cheered and gladly showed it was Jesus they adored.

Later Jesus' friends gathered in an upper room to eat. Jesus tried to explain that this was the last time they would meet. As the men enjoyed their dinner, Jesus gave thanks for the bread. He gave his friends a cup to drink; "Remember me," he said.

The Angry Crowd put Jesus on trial; they wanted him to die. When Jesus said he was God's son they thought it was a lie! The mob took Jesus to Pilatethe governor of the land. Pilate said, "This man has done no wrong!" But the crowd didn't understand. "Why should we kill this Jesus?" a troubled pilot cried. The Angry Crowd shouted louder and louder, "Let him be crucified!"


ENDOWMENT FUNDS


