ELCA 2022 Synod Assembly Report | PART 1

The Greater Milwaukee Synod of the ELCA (of which we are a part) met on May 20 and 21. Thank you to Trinity's delegates: Jim Barker, Patrick Budhoff, Bill Dushek, Susie Pawlowski, Jodi McMahon, and Pastor Dave.

The assembly keynote speaker was Krish O'Mara Vignarajah, the president and CEO of Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Services. She inspired us with the stories of Afghan and Ukrainian refugees they have worked with over the last year. This is a ministry of which we should be proud.

Marilyn Miller was the preacher at the worship service and challenged the assembly with the message of rising over the safe mat we lie on and be healed and walk in ministry to Christ basing her sermon on John 14:23-29.

Bishop Paul Erickson was re-elected as the bishop of the synod. Please offer prayers of gratitude for his work and prayers that he be blessed over the next six years.

The budget for calendar year 2023/2024 was passed. The budget is met by the contributions of congregations of the synod. The budget totaled \$1,905,102.

Two memorials to be sent to the 2022 Churchwide assembly of the ELCA to act on were passed. The first memorial called on the ELCA to act in love for others and the creation by advocating for zero greenhouse gas target by 2050 and the ELCA work toward this goal in their own life as well and encourage members of the church to work toward this goal in their lives and the nation.

The Spirit is as alive and among us today as it was thousands of years ago. It calls each of us to be a living breathing Church made up of many members. Pentecost is a time for each of us to review and consider how we, as individuals, contribute to the work of sharing the love and promise of God in our Church, in our community and beyond. This is a time to invite the Holy Spirit into our midst to move us in new and exciting ways.

To help each of us consider what it means to be a member of the Church—not just as an attendee or consumer, but as a disciple of the body of Christ—take time to answer these questions:

- What are the gifts that God has given you? Don't compare yourself to anyone else. Look within and see the ways that the Holy Spirit has blessed you as a member of the Church. Don't be modest—be honest.
- How can your gifts be used for the sake of our life together as the Church
 —in our community and beyond?

Gifts are not meant to be hidden away but used and shared with others.

- What can you do in the coming year to respond to the call to grow in faith and service? The Spirit of God calls us to grow in faith and life—to be disciples of Christ. This season is an opportunity to seek new ways to respond to that call.
- How can you affirm others in their life in the community? We are individuals
 and each of us needs encouragement and support as we strive to live the life
 and call of the Holy Spirit together.

ELCA 2022 Synod Assembly Report | PART 2

A second memorial is being sent to the ELCA to ask them to review and revise the Human Sexuality statement of the Church to bring it up to date with terminology and social changes that have taken place over the decade since its passing.

A resolution for action by the Greater Milwaukee synod passed calling on the synod to support educators and the teaching of information about the history of racism and its continuing effects, as well as support for the work of schools and educators around educating about the fluidity of gender identity and sexual identity and the work of creating a safe environment for all young people. This includes sending a position statement to many state authorities and calling on our own members to be active in working with school boards and state authorities to create an educational atmosphere where differing approaches and ideas can be shared so that the issues can be shared in age appropriate and sensitive ways with opportunities to allow parents to opt their children out if they are uncomfortable. It also encouraged members of congregations of the synod to discuss these issues together, as well as in their families.

The assembly ended with the instillation of new synod officials and representatives.




SUMMER BOOK STUDIES




