

Interestingly, the number of hospital admissions in DuPage County has continued to plummet with a **7-day rolling average of hospital admissions due to Covid of .9. Baptism of the Lord

The last Sunday of Christmas we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord. Traditionally, we hold this as the beginning of Jesus' public ministry, after 30 years "growing up," Jesus begins his ministry of preaching, curing the sick and ultimately giving his life. From the earliest days of Christianity, believers have contemplated the meaning of the paradox, John baptizing Jesus. John himself questions the propriety of this command...and, yet, Jesus indicates that it is exactly to fulfill propriety that he permit this "for now." We can speak a great deal of the symbolism and meaning of the action, but I thought I would concentrate on one point.

The Spirit does not descend on Jesus until after all have been baptized and while He is praying. Two points: First, prayer is always an act of humility. One does not pray to oneself, only to another. Second, the Baptism of John was a baptism of repentance, not remission. Jesus Christ was baptized not to remit His sins, He was submerged under the water so that water would become the means of sanctification. The Baptism of Saint John prepared those present to receive the Savior of the world.

The people baptized stood there united in their docility for Christ. They were not a "club," for they were united not by being in the know, not by being important, and they were not an "exclusive club," because they were all there, standing humbly before the Son of God whose entire being pointed to the Father.

C.S. Lewis gave an address to the students of King's College, London, which was later printed under the title, "The Inner Ring." Lewis cautions these young students against making their life's desire to be in the "in-crowd," "the ones in the know," "the Inner Ring." Indeed, those seated in the room would be leaving King's College with an exemplary education and vim for the future. He said,

Men tell not only their wives but themselves that it is a hardship to stay late at the office or the school on some bit of important extra work which they have been let in for because they and So-and-so and the two others are the only people left in the place who really know how things are run. But it is not quite true. It is a terrible bore, of course, when old Fatty Smithson draws you aside and whispers, "Look here, we've got to get you in on this examination somehow" or "Charles and I saw at once that you've got to be on this committee." A terrible bore... ah, but how much more terrible if you were left out! It is tiring and unhealthy to lose your Saturday afternoons: but to have them free because you don't matter, that is much worse.

Although Lewis acknowledges the inevitability of associations of this sort, his caution arises in the distinction between seeking to be "in" and seeking what is true and right and good. He said,

But if all you want is to be in the know, your pleasure will be short lived. The circle cannot have from within the charm it had from outside. By the very act of admitting you it has lost its magic. Once the first novelty is worn off, the members of this circle will be no more interesting than your old friends. Why should they be? You were not looking for virtue or kindness or loyalty or humour or learning or wit or any of the things that can really be enjoyed. You merely wanted to be "in." And that is a pleasure that cannot last. As soon as your new associates have been staled to you by custom, you will be looking for another Ring.

Finally, Lewis offers them the advice to seek first virtue, excellence in one's profession and, seemingly, excellence in one's personal life. He said,


The quest of the Inner Ring will break your hearts unless you break it. But if you break it, a surprising result will follow. If in your working hours you make the work your end, you will presently find yourself all

unawares inside the only circle in your profession that really matters. You will be one of the sound craftsmen, and other sound craftsmen will know it. This group of craftsmen will by no means coincide with the Inner Ring or the Important People or the People in the Know. It will not shape that professional policy or work up that professional influence which fights for the profession as a whole against the public: nor will it lead to those periodic scandals and crises which the Inner Ring produces. But it will do those things which that profession exists to do and will in the long run be responsible for all the respect which that profession in fact enjoys and which the speeches and advertisements cannot maintain.

How different than the association we see on the shore of the Jordan River. Standing there were pharisees, tax collectors, prostitutes, scribes, lawyers, doctors, the garbage collector and, perhaps, even a priest or two. They were united in complete docility to the coming of Christ, the Lord of life and love. So, perhaps, we take Lewis' advice one step further...not just our professional life, but our eternal life. Let us seek not the "Inner Ring," that must be transitory, but make the center of our life a search for what is true, good and just even if our friends, our ring, think differently. Maybe you are in a ring like this. If so, may God bless you. If not, maybe its time to find one.

Roe v. Wade

In January 1973, the Supreme Court of the United States gave our nation *Roe v. Wade* and its companion decision *Doe v. Bolton*, and in so doing effectively removed every legal protection from human beings prior to birth. The legacy of *Roe* is virtually incalculable. In its wake it has left death and sorrow and turmoil.

Millions of lives have been destroyed before birth and even during the very process of being born. Countless women have been traumatized so deeply by abortion that they spend years struggling to find peace, healing, and reconciliation. Men grieve because they could not "choose" to protect a child they helped bring into existence, and society has increasingly coarsened by toleration and acceptance of acts that purposely destroy human life.

U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops:

- Among important issues involving the dignity of human life with which the Church is concerned, abortion necessarily plays a central role. Abortion, the direct killing of an innocent human being, is always gravely immoral (The Gospel of Life, no. 57); its victims are the most vulnerable and defenseless members of the human family. It is imperative that those who are called to serve the least among us give urgent attention and priority to this issue of justice.7
- While at times human law may not fully articulate the moral imperative full protection for the right to life our legal system can and must be continually reformed so that it will increasingly fulfill its proper task of protecting the weak and preserving the right to life of every human being, born and unborn.8
