Dear Brothers and Sisters,

He is risen!

I loved Easter growing up. I loved celebrating the Lord's resurrection, of course... but I also loved Easter candy and Easter egg hunts. I have vivid memories of stomping through my family's garden, still thawing out from winter, looking for those bright pastel eggs. And *everything* inside was a delight. It didn't matter if an egg contained ten jellybeans or two quarters – it was pure joy!

I ended every Easter Sunday of my childhood overwhelmed, exhausted, and content.

My stomach was full of rich food, my room was covered with plastic egg halves and those strands of plastic Easter basket grass that seem to get *everywhere*.

It wasn't until the first years of my priesthood that it hit me like a ton of bricks – that joy I felt as a kid on Easter Sunday was probably the same joy that the disciples felt.

The mystery of Jesus' resurrection is so rich, so vibrant, it overwhelms the spirit. It's an assault on the senses – a miraculous wave of grace that engulfs the heart. As a kid, it was all jellybeans and quarters. But as an adult? I realize now that it's all about resurrection and grace.

Glory to Jesus Christ for the great gift of the Resurrection!

After a long Lent and a solemn Holy Week, I know it can be easy to think, "Phew! It's over!" But the truth is, the good things that God wants to show us are just beginning. So, in these first few days of the Easter season, I want to extend my gratitude to you. Thank you for being such an important part of Saint Bernadette.

You are part of the great story of God's love for his people. On the first Easter Sunday, a handful of people in Jerusalem shared in the joy and awe of Jesus rising from the dead. Today, at Saint Bernadette you are writing the next chapter. *Thank you* for being such an important part of our parish community.

I pray that you have a joyous Easter season. And I pray that you carry your joy forward by participating in our ministries, attending Mass, and sharing your gifts with others.

You and your family are in my prayers, and I hope that I am in yours. Never forget: HE IS RISEN! Alleluia!



WHY IS IT SO IMPORTANT THAT WE REGISTER IN A PARISH? ISN'T IT GOOD ENOUGH THAT WE GO TO MASS?

Registration is the official way we join a parish community. Many people think that because they attend a particular parish they automatically belong. At times, young

adults who have moved away for years think they are still signed up under their parents. But membership requires signing up, formally enrolling yourself in a parish. Registration is a commitment to a community, a way to be included in the

religious, social, and ministerial activities of your parish. Your registration affects the parish in many ways. Census numbers can determine how many priests are assigned to a church, what benefits and obligations the community has to the diocese, and how Masses, Confessions, and devotions are planned and scheduled. Registration shows you belong. It is also necessary for

certain benefits, like scheduling sacraments, obtaining sponsor certificates, and getting donation statements for taxes. Most importantly, it lets the parish count on you, to call on you to assist in its mission. Registering in your parish is a statement of faith and confidence in the life and work of your parish.






