- **Sisters of Charity of Nazareth:** time to walk the grounds and then listen to a presentation by Sister Rita Davis on the rich history of their order and campus.

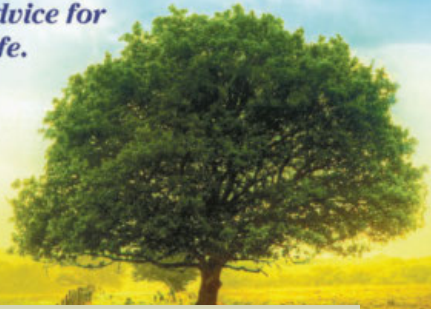

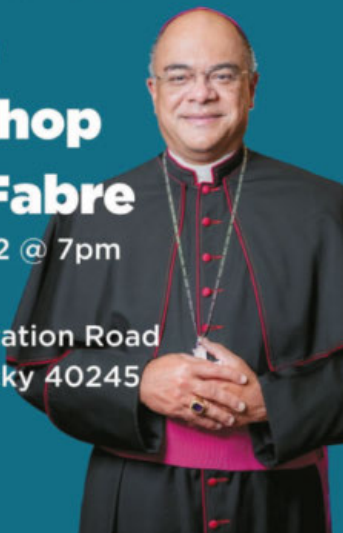
