#### A MESSAGE FROM FR. HAMBROUGH

We were in a room at the DeGreeff Hospice House, a splendid facility on the campus of Mercy South, where patients receive compassionate care in their final days on earth. The man was dying too young—not yet fifty years old. But the cancer had run its course, and the call to the Kingdom was sure to come.

We gathered to pray and to celebrate the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. His wife was there, along with his sons and their wives. His daughter was there, too—still a teenager, still too young to have a spouse. His sister was there as well. We prayed to God and offered the Last Rites of the Church. Then, the man looked at me and asked me to leave the room. Surprised by such a request, I consented and began to collect my things.

Then he looked at his sister and asked her to leave.

Next, it was his daughters-in-law, and finally, his wife.

He wanted his next words to be spoken only to his children. As we stepped into the hallway and the door was closing, I looked back and saw them encircled in a four-person huddle, each one leaning in to hear. I don't know what the father said to his children that day, but I'd bet on this: I bet the three of them, to this day, have not forgotten what their dying father told them.

In 1881, the great Russian novelist Fyodor Dostoevsky was in a similar position. He knew he had little time left to live, so he asked his four children to come into his room. He then requested his wife to read aloud the parable of the Prodigal Son. Dostoevsky listened with his eyes closed, absorbed in prayer and thought. After the Gospel had been read, he said in his feeble voice: "My children, never forget what you have just heard. Have absolute faith in God, and never despair of His pardon. I love you dearly, but my love is nothing compared with the love of God for all those He has created. Even if you should be so unhappy as to commit a crime in the course of your life, never despair of God. You are His children, so humble yourselves before Him as before your father. Implore His pardon, and He will rejoice over your repentance as the father rejoiced over that of the Prodigal Son." I'm pretty sure the Dostoevsky children never forgot

what their father told them from his deathbed.

From the Pastor's Desk



It's interesting to consider our own last words.

What would be the final words you would tell your children? What would be my last homily? How deeply into the depths of my heart would I go? How much of it would be about mercy?

There's an old legend about a young boy named Joel who was constantly asking questions—one of which was, "What language does God speak?" No one could answer him—not at home, not at school, not in his village. So he began to travel across his country, asking everyone the same question. Still, he did not receive an answer.

Eventually, he set off in search of the answer beyond his homeland. At last, he arrived in Jerusalem, at the hill outside of town called Calvary. There, he asked no questions, for the scene before him was somber and sorrowful—an innocent man had been put to death. Joel stood off to the side, silent in reverence.

He was about to leave when a woman stopped him. Her name was Mary. "Joel," she said, "we've been expecting you." The boy was astonished that she knew his name. Mary continued, "For a long time, you have searched the world to discover what language God speaks. Well, now your journey is over. Today, you can look at my Son and see the language God speaks. His language is mercy. His desire is mercy. His joy is mercy. His word is mercy."

In this time of Lent, may that be the language we hear—the words spoken to us, the words spoken by a man about to die. Let us pray that we never forget them.



This year you have the opportunity to do so vicariously. Kairos Prison Ministry will be holding a 4-day retreat at the Menard Correctional Center in Chester, IL from April 1-4. During this retreat, through talks, discussions and Chapel meditations, prisoners learn that they are worthy of God's love, light and grace. That no matter who they are or what they have done, God will forgive them.

- 1.) Be a prayer warrior! Knowing that many people are praying for them during this retreat has a profound impact on the participants. It softens hearts hardened by years of incarceration and feelings of abandonment, opening the door for the Holy Spirit to enter. #### CRS Rice Bowl - PROTECTION FROM NATURAL DISASTERS

Located on the Bay of Bengal and crisscrossed by hundreds of rivers, Bangladesh bears the brunt of increasingly severe weather during its rainy season including powerful wind and neck-high surging water. Lives, livelihoods and assets of the people on the island are regularly lost and damaged by these weather phenomena.

Through a local partner, CRS responds to these emergencies with lifesaving aid. They help survivors start over after storms, rebuild homes and replace lost assets. They also provide programs in disaster risk reduction, water sanitation, and adaptive farming techniques.

In this week's Story of Hope, Shahadat and his family joined a Catholic Relief Services' project that helps families reduce their risk from natural disasters like flooding, cyclones and river erosion. They learned how to protect their crops from floodwater by planting on raised garden beds and how to make organic fertilizer to grow healthier crops. With their new skills they boosted their vegetable harvest in just one year. Then they bought cows and chickens and sold the eggs for additional income. 
