





### **BEAUTY IN THE CHRISTMAS SEASON**

### What is the Octave of Christmas?

December 25 - January 1

The Octave of Christmas is the eight days beginning with Christmas Day and ending on January 1. An octave extends the celebration of a feast or solemnity for eight days. During the Octave of Christmas, for example, all the readings and prayers during the celebration of Mass are related to the birth of Christ. Octave celebrations got their start in the Church way back in the fourth century. The "octave day" (eighth day) of Christmas is January 1, the Solemnity of Mary, the Holy Mother of God.

### **The Christmas Season**

The liturgical Season of Christmas begins with the vigil Masses on Christmas Eve and concludes on the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. During this season, we celebrate the birth of Christ into our world and into our hearts and reflect on the gift of salvation that is born with him, including the fact that he was born to die for us. Christmas is one of the most important days of the Church year, second only to Easter itself. It is the feast of the incarnation, the feast of God becoming flesh. It is a uniquely Christian teaching, the Divine choosing to become one of us. Because of this belief, God is not only Transcendent, but also wholly Immanent, Emmanuel (God-with-us). While remaining Transcendent (meaning we must rise above our present condition to reach Him), He is at the same time Immanent (meaning He is with us as we rise toward Him).

### **Every day is Christmas**

For Catholics, every day is, in the most basic sense, Christmas. That's because every day, the Word becomes flesh in the sacraments, particularly the Eucharist; and through the sacraments, the people of God become of the Body of Christ in the world. Every Eucharist is like Christmas where the bread and wine are transformed into His flesh, His Body and Blood, and, in a sense, He is born anew on the altar. Just as Mary's "yes" made her an instrument of God's incarnation in the world, by our "yes," we too birth the Son of God into the world.

### January 1st

In accord with the provisions of the Code of Canon Law, the USCCB has ruled: "Whenever January 1, the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God, falls on a Saturday or on a Monday, the precept to attend Mass is abrogated" which means to repeal or do away with. Because January 1st falls on a Saturday this year, it is not a Holy Day of Obligation. As with all weekend Masses there is an obligation to attend. On Saturday we will have the 4:30 pm Mass along with Sunday's 9 and 11 am Masses.

### 100TH BIRTHDAY BASH AT MONCHES

### **END-OF-THE-YEAR DONATIONS**

St. Teresa of Calcutta Parish owes our success to the generous donations of our parishioners. We truly appreciate your contributions throughout the calendar year. As you consider offering a year-end donation to our parish, keep in mind the tax benefits of supporting our parish. (Of course, there are also spiritual benefits!)

The CARES Act allows taxpayers to deduct donations to charity up to \$300/Individuals, \$600/married filing jointly on their 2021 federal tax return, even though they take the standard deduction. The new law allows all taxpayers to take a charitable deduction even if they do not itemize. Funds from an IRA can be used for charitable donations, if done correctly (ask your tax advisor for help). Using an IRA to make a charitable donation can help lower your tax bill.

There will be someone in the Parish Office on December 30 until noon to accept any last-minute gifts or feel free to register online for an electronic payment. WE Share will match anyone who signs up for recurring giving before year end up to \$50.

REMINDER: Donations for the 2021 tax year must be received or postmarked by December 31, 2021.
