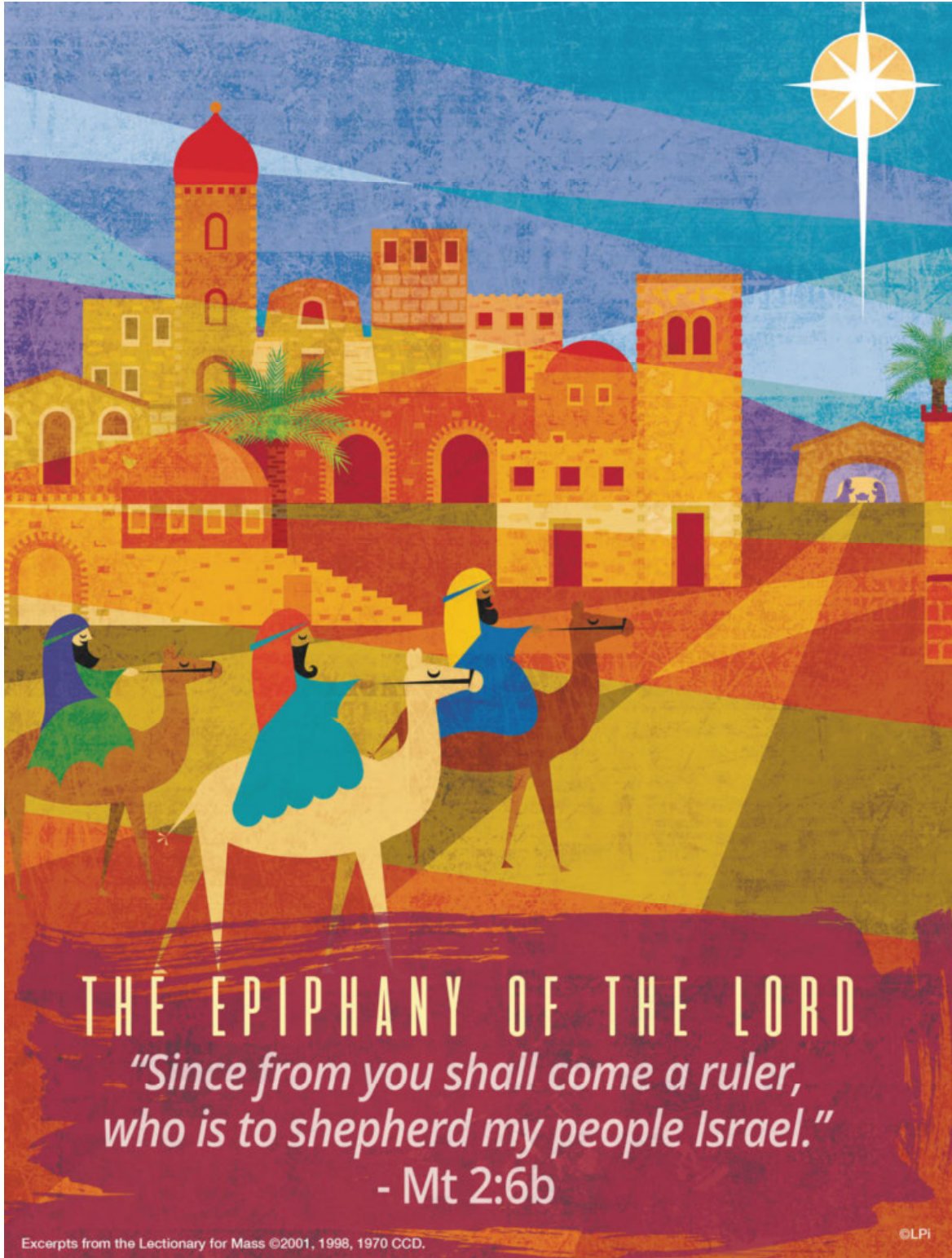

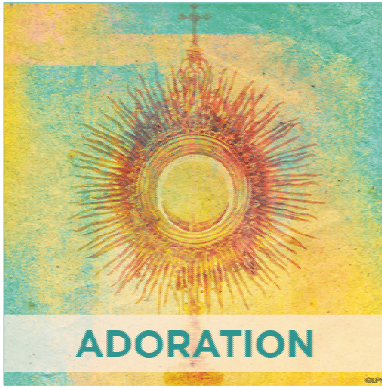

New Year's resolutions are a great way to begin something new, i.e. read more books, exercise, begin a new hobby etc. It is always good to grow and discover new avenues in life to learn and broaden our view in life. Resolutions, if followed, give us a goal to strive for, where we rid ourselves of old tired 'things' in our lives and bring in new, refreshing ideas to encounter.

As much as having a New Year's resolution is important, may I suggest, a New Year's resolution to grow closer to God. There are many ways this can be achieved - from simple easy methods to something we might do the rest of our lives. We can come to weekly Mass or attend daily Mass in addition to weekend Masses. Increase our prayer life through the use of books, something 'online' or just sitting and listening to God. Reading scripture or find a nice 'Daily Reflection' book to guide us. Bottom line is how we can become closer to God in a way that we can understand AND DO!

If our New Year's resolution is to grow more deeply in love with God, to achieve a new level of spirituality, to listen more closely to the Spirit in our life, then finding something 'doable' is vital. If we are considering deepening our spiritual life during 2022, we start with the wonderful feeling of invitation, not obligation. There will be ups and downs. But God is always inviting us to His Son. He knows us better than we know ourselves, so let Him help us. Let us become closer to Him, let us take that courageous step to throw out the old, the not-so-good part of ourselves and empty ourselves to become filled up with the "good" stuff we discover in Christ Jesus. This "good" stuff does not hurt, or is hard to do, or add weight to our waistline. We just answer His call

to join Him and let Him do His works with us and within us. May God bless all of us with a wonderful, blessed, safe, and healthy 2022.

CATHOLIC CHARITIES NEEDS VOLUNTEERS FOR FT. MCCOY

Catholic Charities agencies are mobilizing personnel, volunteers, and resources to provide refugees at Ft. McCoy with a welcoming atmosphere, a break from the confines of temporary housing, and relief from their difficult journey. Among the services provided are on-base legal assistance, social engagement for women and children, and learning centers. The women's centers provide a quiet and clean place for mothers to bond and play with their children and develop friendships. The children's area is a place for children to gather and create art and craft projects, build puzzles, play games and be sociable. Volunteers are crucial to keep the centers running smoothly and safely.

The USCCB and Catholic Charities are seeking more volunteers to aid in this mission. Volunteers will spend time at one of the three Women and Children Centers, two Sewing Centers or Learning Center. Each of the centers requires between six to ten volunteers to operate. Individuals must be able to commit to a minimum of three days.

*It's Time to Journey
Together*



Pope Francis has invited the Church to "journey together" in a two-year global synod. His idea is to study, discuss, and build upon three basic ways to reach out to the lost and the marginalized in an effort to establish or strengthen their faith.

One of the three ways Pope Francis suggests is that we "Partner with those already present on the margins." He specifically named the Society of St. Vincent de Paul as one of the community organizations that encounter and accompany persons on the margins on a regular basis, and he urges Catholics to join in their outreach efforts. The Synod pointed out that last year, Vincentians gave more than \$1.4 billion in cash, in-kind, and volunteer services, to more than 4.4 million people, helping them find shelter or avoid eviction, find dignified work, feed their families, and thrive. Almost 100,000 Vincentian volunteers in more than 4,400 communities across the country provided emergency assistance to the poor and vulnerable through person-to-person home visits. 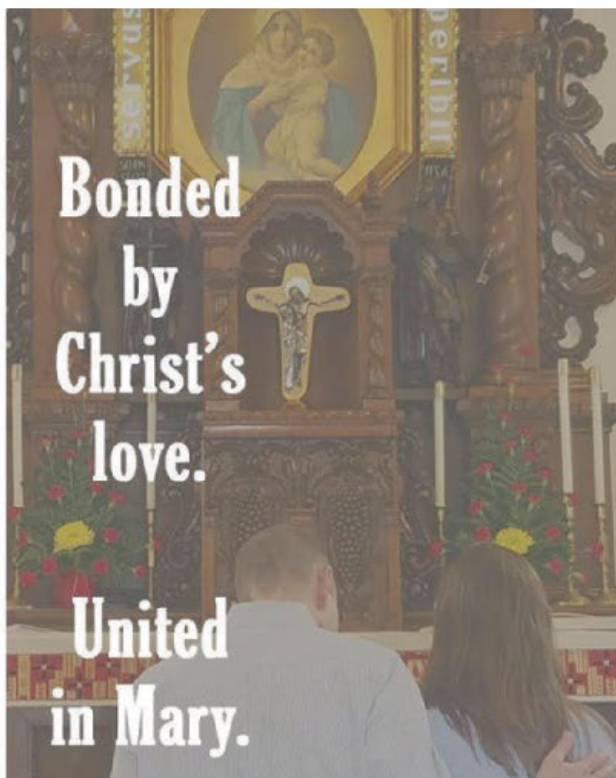
